Hay Fever and Cars

I remember a big story when "experts" were proclaiming red meat caused colon cancer. They based their conclusions on this reasoning: Fact: Americans have more colon cancer than Japanese, Americans eat more red meat than Japanese, therefore red meat causes colon cancer.

Mathematicians are able to calculate the statistical significance of a conclusion to an experiment. It is expressed as

the P value. The lower the number, the more likely the conclusion is valid. When claims are made expressing that a product will do what it says on the label, it must be demonstrated in trials or tests that are statistically significant. If the product is a medicine, dewormer or feed additive, for instance, it must satisfy the FDA's stringent requirements through repetition, that the product will do what it claims. Those are the rules true science adheres to.

Well, obviously, broad proclamations by scientists of their time have been made since the beginning of curiosity. The earth, the sky and the universe offer enough puzzles to keep us busy forever. They continue, and the

"hay fever/fossil fuel" speculation is just that, scientists pondering and dreaming. But this is how miraculous discoveries are finally made, studied and eventually one in a million is proven to be true.

Eventually the colon cancer incidence in Americans versus Japanese were not shown to be caused by eating more red meat; there were too many variables. Today many claim that the lower incidence is related to the Japanese fish diet high in cod liver oil...but it still remains conjecture. Fitzsimmons Land & Cattle to host KLA/K-State Ranch Field Day

Challenges facing ranchers and feeders in the nation's capital will be highlighted during the August 21 KLA/Kansas State University Ranch Management Field Day at Fitzsimmons Land & Cattle near Cunningham. The Dean and Jerree Fitzsimmons and Gary and Mary Fitzsimmons families own and operate this diversified beef cattle and crop farm in eastern Pratt County. The Fitzsimmons have a commercial spring-calving cow herd and background their calves prior to selling them in the spring. In addition, they raise wheat, milo, alfalfa and silage to complement the beef cattle enterprise.

National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Executive Director of Legislative Affairs Kristina Butts has battled a long list of animal agriculture issues in Washington, D.C.

She will provide a timely report on how NCBA is addressing a variety of issues on behalf of cattle producers, including food safety, nutrition, a new Farm Bill, animal welfare and animal health.

Dusty Tacha, a range management specialist for the Natural Resources Conservation Service, will talk about the critical grazing and stocking decisions ranchers should consider during extended dry periods. He will address options for grazing land managers and explain why appropriate stocking rates and the length of the grazing season have long-term implications.

Another topic on the agenda will focus on the benefits of weaning calves early during a drought. In recent years, cow herd owners have faced deteriorating grass conditions in the latter part of the grow-

ing season due to drought. One strategy to reduce a beef cow's nutritional needs and forage intake when grazing resources become less available or of poorer quality is to wean calves earlier than the conventional fall time period. K-State Extension beef veterinarian Larry Hollis will summarize research conducted over the past several years on the performance of early-weaned beef calves and how this management practice may fit into many cow-calf operations.

Justin Smith, deputy animal health commissioner for the Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health, will give an overview of the recently proposed trichomoniasis regulation. The regulation would require testing of bulls changing ownership within the borders of Kansas

and new restrictions for importing open cows into the state. He also will update attendees on prevalence of the disease in Kansas.

The Cunningham field day will begin with registration at 3:30 p.m. and conclude with a free beef dinner at 6:30 p.m. All livestock producers and others involved in the business are invited to attend.

Fitzsimmons Land & Cattle is located in eastern Pratt County. From Cairo, a town on the north side of Highway 54-400 between Cunningham and Pratt, go north 4/10 mile on NE 100th Avenue to NE 5th Street (gravel road). Go east on NE 5th Street 2 miles to NE 120th Avenue. Go north 2/10 mile on NE 120th Street. Take the curve east and go 7/10 mile to the Dean and Jerree Fitzsimmons residence.

Directional field day signs will be posted. Oak Springs Ranch at Onaga will serve as the host operation for the final 2013 field day, August 22. Bayer Animal Health and the

Farm Credit Associations of Kansas are sponsoring all three field days. For more information, go to www.kla.org or call the KLA office at (785) 273-5115.

Demand light to moderate for dairy and grinding alfalfa, for stock cow hay, grass hay and alfalfa pellets. Rain fell over nearly all of Kansas, some areas received very little and other areas are flooding. The alfalfa, row crops and pastures are looking much better after the rain and with the cooler temperatures. The challenge continues to get the alfalfa and Bluestem crops baled dry somehow between rains. More low quality alfalfa is showing up, some rain damaged, some with weeds and some mature hay, which is putting pressure on the market. 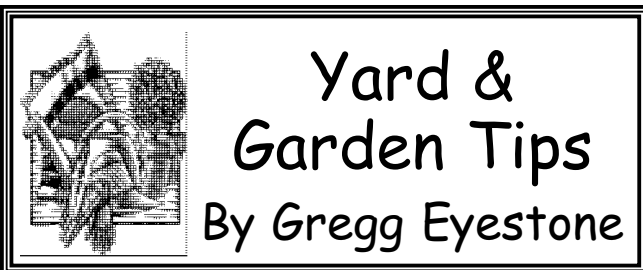

Deadline approaching for FSA Emergency Disaster loan applications in four counties

The expiration date for filing applications for Emergency Disaster (EM) loans by farmers and ranchers in Pottawatomie, Riley, Marshall and Nemaha counties is September 9, 2013 and September 16, 2013, according to Kay A. McCoy, Farm Loan Manager, for the Farm Service Agency (FSA).

Those needing farm credit as a result of drought from November 15, 2012 and continuing and who think they are eligible for FSA assistance should make their applications at the FSA County Office, 409 North Street, Seneca, KS 66538, before the expiration date.

Loans covering physical and/or production losses are scheduled for repayment as rapidly as feasible, consistent with the applicant's reasonable ability to pay. The current interest rate is 2.50 percent but is subject to monthly changes until the loan is approved.

FSA's Farm Loan Pro-

grams staff is committed to new and existing customers, FSA customer goals and our rural communities. FSA's service extends beyond the typical loan, offering FSA customers ongoing consultation, advice and creative ways to make your farm business thrive. At the Farm Service Agency, we want to be your lender of first opportunity to overcome these adverse weather conditions and rebuild your operation to get back on track. FSA's loan staff can refer customers to other public and commercial financing sources that can serve as a blend with FSA's farm loan programs.

FSA loans covering physical losses may be used to replace installations, equipment, livestock, or buildings (including homes), lost through this disaster.

FSA loans covering production losses may be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer,

livestock, or to make payments on real estate and chattel debts. Funds can also be used for other essential operating and living expenses.

To be eligible for an emergency disaster loan, an applicant must be operating a family size farm or ranch, must be unable to get credit elsewhere, and must have suffered a qualifying physical and/or production loss from the disaster.

Farmers who suffered at least a 30 percent reduction to at least one cropping enterprise may have a qualifying production loss. Emergency disaster production loss loans cover 100 percent

of qualifying losses.

Fairleigh Ranch to host KLA/K-State Ranch Field Day

Grazing land management in drought conditions will be one of the featured topics at the August 15 KLA/Kansas State University Ranch Management Field Day near Scott City. The host operation is owned by the Fairleigh Ranch Corporation and includes a commercial cow-calf herd, yearling feeder grazing enterprise and is used to start calves in the fall.

Robert Gillen, a range management specialist, will talk about the critical grazing and stocking decisions ranchers should consider during extended dry periods. He will address options for grazing land managers and explain why appropriate stocking rates and the length of the grazing season have long-term implications. Gillen is the director of K-State's Western Kansas Agricultural Research Centers and previously served as a range scientist with the USDA Agricultural Research Service.

K-State Beef Specialist Justin Waggoner will discuss the benefits of early weaning during drought conditions. In recent years, cowherd owners have faced deteriorating grass in the latter part of the growing season due to drought. One strategy to reduce a beef cow's nutritional needs and forage intake when grazing resources become less available or poorer quality is to wean calves earlier than the conventional fall time period. Waggoner specifically will summarize K-State research conducted over the past several years on the performance of early-weaned beef calves and how this management practice may fit into many

cow-calf operations.

Another topic on the agenda will focus on the future of the lesser prairie chicken. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) currently is determining if the lesser prairie chicken should be added to the federal list of endangered and threatened wildlife. USFWS field supervisor Heather Whitlaw will discuss this consideration, as well as explain voluntary efforts taking place to prevent the need for a federal listing and financial incentives that may be available for owners of grasslands where the species may be found.

Justin Smith, deputy animal health commissioner for the Kansas Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health, will give an overview of the recently proposed trichomoniasis regulation that would require testing of bulls changing ownership within the borders of Kansas and new restrictions for importing

open cows into the state. He also will update attendees on prevalence of the disease in Kansas.

The Scott City field day will begin with registration at 3:30 p.m. and conclude with a free beef dinner at 6:30 p.m. All livestock producers and others involved in the business are invited to attend.

Fairleigh Ranch is located northwest of Scott City. From Scott City, go north on U.S. 83 ten miles to the U.S. 83/KS 95 junction, then go west on KS 95 four miles. Turn west on East Scott Lake Drive, following the east side of Lake Scott 1.5 miles around the north end of the dam. Go north on Kansas Road 1.3 miles to the Fairleigh Ranch headquarters sign. From the sign, follow the road east two miles to the ranch headquarters. From Oakley, go 23 miles south on US 83. At the Fairleigh Ranch sign go west 4.5 miles, then south 5.8 miles to the Fairleigh Ranch headquarters sign.

From the sign, follow the road east two miles to the ranch headquarters. Directional field day signs will be posted. Fitzsimmons Land & Cattle near Cunningham is the site of the August 21 field day and Oak Springs Ranch at Onaga will serve as the host operation for the

August 22 event. Bayer Animal Health and the Farm Credit Associations of Kansas are sponsoring all three field days. For more information, go to www.kla.org or call the KLA office at (785) 273-5115. KLA is a trade organization representing the business


interests of independent beef producers at the state and national levels. Members of the association are involved in all segments of the livestock industry, including cow-calf production, backgrounding, cattle feeding, swine, dairy and sheep.

New app helps keep cattle cool

A new product that can help cattlemen reduce heat-related losses was recently released by the University of Missouri.

ThermalAid is a smart phone app that monitors heat-related stresses on cattle and alerts producers when there is a health problem. The app also recommends which intervention strategy will be most effective.

The 99-cent app receives temperature and humidity data from the weather service according to the GPS location of the user. The farmer tells the app if it is beef or dairy, if it is in the barn or outside, if it is on the pasture or feedlot, its health status and other information.

With that, the app calculates the animal's Temperature Humidity Index, or the THI. If the THI is not stressful, the app shows green for that cow. If heat stress is an issue, the color goes to yellow and then orange. Red indicates a life-threatening condition.

Lamb market app now available

Lamb markets—is there an app for that? Well, yes, as a matter of fact there is. Producers can tap into auctions and prices at any time - while checking on the sheep, between meetings or during lunch.

The American Sheep Industry Association (ASI) has launched its first mobile application providing lamb and wool market information to anyone with a smartphone or tablet. The free market app is available for both Apple and Android operating systems.

“ASI is pleased to offer market information to anyone in the industry with a smartphone,” remarks Peter Orwick, ASI executive director.

ASI worked closely with Randy Hammerstrom, officer in charge at the Greeley U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service's (AMS) Livestock, Poultry and Grain Market News division, to hand-select the portions of the USDA reports to offer in this first version of the industry market app.

“The app offers a good

variety of national reports as well as market results from seven auction barns from around the country,” emphasizes Hammerstrom. “Producers can access price data as the information is made available by USDA.”

“This app will provide the industry with the convenience of valuable market data anywhere, any-

time,” says AMS administrator Anne Alonzo. “Partnerships between USDA and the sheep industry are a critical component to supporting American producers.”

The app is titled ASI Market News which can be downloaded from Apple's App Store or the Android Store. From the front page, users can select to

search national reports or action reports.

“Producers’ thoughts on the usefulness of this tool as well as any ideas on additional information that would be valuable to access from the app is appreciated,” says Orwick. “This is a work in progress and we want to provide you with the best possible product.”

EKAE plant to restart operations in September with new CEO on board

The Board of Directors at East Kansas Agri-Energy, LLC has announced that the ethanol plant will reopen in September. The Board has also announced the appointment of a new CEO for the company.

The EKAE plant will begin receiving corn on Tuesday, September 3, 2013, and will begin plant operations on September 16. Some two dozen employees are expected to return to work as a result.

The EKAE plant was temporarily shut down in 2012 in response to the effect of the drought on corn price and availability. The shutdown was hailed by others in the ethanol industry as a prudent and courageous move—a decision that enabled EKAE to preserve capital and unit value.

The board also announced that Jeff Oestmann will join East Kansas Agri-Energy as Chief Executive Officer after a nearly 20-year career in the bioenergy and grain processing industries. Most recently, he served as president & CEO of Soy Energy, LLC, a biodiesel refinery based in Mason City, Iowa. He led the company through difficult financial circumstances and guided its successful sale to Renewable Energy Group.

Oestmann's professional background includes risk management, trading, marketing, and operations roles in Cargill's grain and energy businesses at locations in the U.S. and Europe. He has served on the Renewable Fuels Association's Market Development Committee and on the Iowa Biodiesel Board.

A native of Shenandoah, Iowa, Oestmann has a B.A. in International Business and Management from the University of Nebraska, Omaha. He was a non-commissioned officer in the U.S. Marine Corps for 11 years, including service in the USMC's elite Embassy Guard. Oestmann will soon relocate with his spouse, Christina, and two young children to the Garnett area.

"We are very excited to be re-opening the plant and having Jeff on board to guide EKAE as we prepare for future growth," said Bill Pracht, EKAE board chairman. "EKAE has a strong balance sheet and is not encumbered by a huge debt load, which puts us in a great position to ramp up quickly and get back to doing what this plant is built to do—producing ethanol, distillers grains and economic vitality for rural Kansas."

New course specializes in handling, storage and flow of bulk solids

Individuals responsible for handling and processing bulk solids in the grain, feed, biofuels, food, pharmaceutical and chemical industries may want to attend Kansas State University's Bulk Solids Handling, Storage and Flow course.

The training will be Nov. 11-14, 2013 at the International Grains Program Conference Center in Manhattan in partnership with the bulk solid equipment industry, Kice Industries, Vortex and Fike Corporation.

"Currently, the grain and powder industry from flour milling to biofuels, to pharmaceutical companies, lack an opportunity for continuing education in the technical areas that involve handling and processing bulk solids. This course will benefit the industry by allowing participants to fortify their skills and also understand the latest technology from the equipment industry," says Carlos Campabadal, K-State program specialist in grain storage and feed.

The course focuses on handling, transportation and storage technologies and methods, and common bulk solids flow problems. Participants will learn about the science and engineering of bulk solids from K-State faculty, other university instructors and industry experts in practical classroom and hands-on sessions. Bulk solids handling and flow equipment are located in the state-of-the-art Hal Ross Flour Mill and O.H. Kruse Feed Technology Innovation Center. Additionally, the newest powder characterization technologies, available in the Bulk Solids and Particle Technology Research Labo-

ratory, will be used for instruction. The course also will include an onsite visit to a bulk solids handling equipment manufacturer.

"This initiative, started in collaboration with industry and academic experts, will focus on understanding the bulk and particle characteristics of granular materials and will help in delivering a uniform granular product to the consumer," said Kingsly Ambrose, course instructor and K-State assistant professor in milling and grain processing.

With his current experimental research and modeling approaches, Ambrose is

focused on developing practical solutions to bulk solids handling issues faced by the industry. His current research areas include milling technologies, process simulation, handling techniques for solids with caking potential, grain dust explosions, and characterization of powders for their particle and flow characteristics.

Beef industry showcases its sustainability

The beef industry has improved its sustainability by 5 percent in just six years according to the results of the checkoff-funded Beef Industry Sustainability Assessment, released during the 2013 Cattle Industry Summer Conference.

Richard Gebhart, cow-calf producer from Claremore, Okla., also served on the sustainability advisory panel. He explains that the beef sustainability assessment is the most detailed examination of a commodity value chain ever completed, taking into account every aspect of beef production from the growth of feed to the disposal of packaging by the final consumer.

“We examined all the inputs and outputs required to produce a pound of boneless, edible beef and we did that for the 1970s, 2005 and 2011,” says Gebhart, explaining that the 1970s and 2005 each represents major shifts in beef production practices, while 2011 represents present-day.

Improvements in crop yields, better irrigation, innovations in the packing sector, improvements in technology and better animal performance are examples of innovations that have all played a role in advancing industry sustainability, according to Kim Stackhouse-Lawson, Ph.D., director of sustainability for the Na-

tional Cattlemen's Beef Association, a contractor to the Beef Checkoff Program.

“The completion of the life cycle assessment (LCA) project provides the industry, for the first time, the science-based evidence necessary to lead conversations about the sustainability of beef,” says Stackhouse-Lawson. “The Beef Checkoff and the Beef Promotion Operating Committee had the foresight three years ago to see the importance of this work and make it a priority for the industry. By completing the LCA, the checkoff positioned beef as a leader on the topic of sustainability.”

Stackhouse-Lawson says the project was extensive. “We examined millions of individual data points and then created models to simulate specific aspects of beef production practices so that this data and these results are truly representative of beef production in the United States.”

Gebhart and Stackhouse-Lawson agree that the completion of the project represents an outstanding opportunity for cattlemen and cattlemen to tell their own stories of sustainable beef production, rather than letting those outside the industry do it.

“The results of this work show the beef indus-

try is becoming more innovative and efficient, while also doing an excellent job protecting the resources with which they have been entrusted,” says Gebhart.

Stackhouse-Lawson explains that during the six years between 2005 and 2011, the beef industry has:

- Reduced environmental impacts by 7 percent
- Improved its overall sustainability by 5 percent
- Reduced emissions to soil by 7 percent
- Reduced greenhouse gas emissions by 2 percent
- Lowered acidification potential emissions by 3 percent
- Reduced emissions to water by 10 percent
- Lessened occupational accidents and illnesses by 32 percent
- Reduced resource consumption by 2 percent
- Decreased water use by 3 percent
- Decreased land use by 4 percent

Lowered energy use by 2 percent

“The results of the Beef Industry Sustainability Assessment, which was just certified by the National Standards Foundation (NSF), show the industry is on a path of continuous improvement,” says Stackhouse-Lawson, who explains that the certification by NSF lends third-party credibility to the work, making it more acceptable to non-governmental organizations and other potential partners in the sustainability arena.

“When we talk about the sustainability of an industry, that's what it's all about, getting better over time. As an industry, beef is doing a good job at making progress on the path toward a more sustainable future. The certification of these results confirms that,” she says.

Soybeans see increase as other crop prices fall in July

Preliminary price received by farmers for winter wheat for July 2013 averaged \$6.92 per bushel, a decrease of 21 cents from the June price according to the USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service.

The preliminary July corn price, at \$6.78 per bushel, was down 34 cents from last month.

The preliminary July sorghum price, averaged \$11.30 per cwt, a decrease of 60 cents from June.

The preliminary July soybean price, at \$15.10 per bushel, increased 20 cents from last month.

The July alfalfa hay price, at \$205.00 per ton, was down from \$230.00 last month. The other hay price, at \$110.00 per ton, was also down from \$130.00 last month.

The preliminary July sunflower price averaged \$21.90 per cwt. The previous month was withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.

Kansas NFO supports combining farm bill and food stamps

The Kansas National Farmers Organization met last Thursday in Mayetta, north of Topeka, and voted to support keeping the SNAP food stamp program as part of permanent farm bill law.

"Kansas NFO is concerned that separating the SNAP food stamp program from the farm bill may open the door to possible cuts in risk management and crop insurance market based programs which have worked well," said NFO grain marketing specialist Pete Lorenz. "Farmers are a minority in numbers, so partnering on urban programs to keep Food Stamps in the farm bill still makes common sense like it did when Sen. Bob Dole created it," said Lorenz.

Kansas NFO President Ray Kohman said "Kansas NFO's mission is primarily focused on group marketing and negotiation of commodities for farmers, however there are some current rural policy issues of importance that need to be addressed."

Another issue the statewide farm group voted on was to ask the USDA to withhold the publication of crop reports until the accuracy of said reports can be verified. Pete Lorenz, NFO grain marketer said "USDA reports have, at times, been publicized despite USDA's own reservation regarding

the accuracy of the reports. It is not fair, nor good policy to publish statistically inaccurate reports which can significantly impact market prices and lead to losses for American farmers," said Lorenz.

The Kansas NFO also proposed the maintenance of renewable fuel standards for ethanol, keeping rural post offices open, supporting the inclusion of agriculture and agricultural careers as part of curricula developed for the Kansas Career and Technical Education programs, and opposition to foreign ownership of food production and processing.

Delegates also heard crop condition reports from other parts of the country through teleconferencing. Gilbert Kleaving, Indiana, and Pete Lorenz, marketing specialist gave a crop price outlook for the coming years and discussed price marketing strategies using crop insurance as a risk management tool.

Kansas NFO is a group marketing commodity organization which negotiates volume transportation and prices by combining farm sales for members who belong to local marketing units in multiple geographical regions, or combining sales of the local marketing units together. About 65 farm delegates were present.

Devastating swine disease affecting bacon prices nationwide

A devastating swine disease new to the United States is forcing bacon prices nationwide to new highs.

The University of Nebraska-Lincoln's Veterinary Diagnostic Center stands ready to test piglets for the Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea virus, said Dr. Bruce Brodersen, assistant professor in the center and the School of Veterinary Medicine and Biological Sciences.

Porcine Epidemic Diarrhea – PED for short – has been around since at least the 1970s but first showed up in the U.S. this summer.

“Since the swine population has never been exposed before to this virus, they're very susceptible,” Brodersen said. “The disease outbreaks are very severe because there's no immunity to it at all. So, it's been devastating as far as pig mortality is concerned.”

Brodersen said he expects PED to turn up in Nebraska eventually, but swine producers can take steps to avoid it coming to their facilities.

Surveys show PED may be spread when trucks gather anywhere there are common loading and unloading chutes such as buying stations. From those common areas, the virus can be tracked back to individual operations. Brodersen urged producers to be very careful to clean their trailer or truck before they go home.

“You should always follow very strict biosecurity steps,” he said. No vaccine is available in the U.S. yet.

Piglets infected with PED experience diarrhea and vomiting violent enough to kill them. The

U.S. Department of Agriculture has confirmed only about 400 cases of the disease in the lab, but its toll has already been estimated in the hundreds of thousands.

As a result, pork price futures have risen to historic levels, with hundred-weights of pork going for about \$105 in recent trading at the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. The USDA reports that the same amount of pork went for \$78 in March.

Fox Business News reported that the prices for pork bellies, which are cured into bacon, have risen particularly fast. On Tuesday, the wholesale price of a hundred pounds of fresh pork belly topped \$189, 5 percent more than it was five days earlier and apparently at or near all-time highs.
