

Five outstanding farmers and retailers to be selected for 4R Advocate Program

The Fertilizer Institute (TFI) launches the 2014 4R Advocate Awards Program with a call for entries from retailers wishing to highlight the exceptional nutrient stewardship practices of their grower customers. The 4R Advocate Award program, now in its third year, recognizes farmers who are protecting the environment, boosting profitability and benefiting society through nutrient stewardship practices based on the 4R's (use of

the right nutrient source, at the right rate at the right time and in the right place). Under the program rules, farmers are nominated by their retail dealers who are also recognized with 4R awards.

"The farmers honored in the 4R Advocate program know that environmental protection and economic prosperity are not mutually exclusive," said TFI president Chris Jahn. "This award program adds value to the 4R nutrient

stewardship initiative by engaging growers and retailers with peers who can share their fertilizer best management practices success stories."

In 2014, five winning growers, a spouse or companion and their nominating retailers will be awarded an expense-paid trip to the Commodity Classic, scheduled for Feb. 27-March 1 in San Antonio, Texas. The Commodity Classic is the once-a-year, can't-miss event for Ameri-

ca's soybean, corn, wheat and sorghum farmers. At the Classic, 4R Advocate winners will see the latest agricultural innovations first-hand, meet other growers and agricultural leaders from across the nation, and will be honored at an invitation-only banquet.

2013 4R Advocate winners Rick and Jesse Brunner, of Fifth Generation Farms in Almira, Wash., recently spoke about the importance of 4Rs in preserving their land for future

generations. "The 4R program epitomizes our philosophy to farm management. We strive to improve our overall soil health, to limit our environmental impact, and to increase our profits while continuing the farm legacy we received." Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay trade slow. Demand light for dairy and grinding alfalfa, for stock cow hay, grass hay and alfalfa pellets. Snow over a large portion of western Kansas October 18 brought welcome moisture: amounts ranging from a quarter to three quarters of an inch, snow amounts up to five inches. It melted quickly but along with the cold front much of the area had a killing frost. The western half of the state is still in a moderate to severe drought due to the lack of subsoil moisture. Fall grazing of crop residue and wheat pasture should be good. Kansas counties declared eligible to apply for federal disaster assistance

President Barack Obama has granted Gov. Sam Brownback's Sept. 25 request for a federal disaster declaration for a number of Kansas counties affected by severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes and flooding from July 22 to Aug. 16. The federal declaration was issued Oct. 22.

"This federal assistance will help these counties restore roads, bridges and other infrastructure so vital to the day-to-day business of their communities," said Brownback.

Forty-six counties are eligible to apply for Public Assistance funds to help repair infrastructure dam-

aged or destroyed by the storms. These counties are Barber, Barton, Bourbon, Butler, Chase, Cherokee, Clark, Clay, Cloud, Coffey, Comanche, Cowley, Crawford, Dickinson, Edwards, Elk, Ellsworth, Ford, Geary, Greenwood, Hamilton, Harper, Harvey, Hodgeman, Kingman, Kiowa, Lane, Linn, Lyon, Marion, McPherson, Meade, Montgomery, Morris, Ness, Ottawa, Pawnee, Pratt, Reno, Republic, Rice, Saline, Sumner, Washington, Wilson, and Woodson. Additional designations may be made at a later date if requested by the state and warranted by the results of further

damage assessments.

The declaration also authorizes all Kansas counties to apply for

grants to mitigate the effects of future disasters through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program.

Is winter canola a valid cropping option for north central Kansas?

By Kim Larson, Crop Production, River Valley Extension District

Growing winter canola is still rather new to Kansas farmers, but it is catching on and growing in popularity in certain areas of the state. In our area in north central Kansas, winter canola is still rather a rarity. However, canola has become a profitable oil crop that has real possibilities in this part of the state as well. Kansas State University canola breeder, Mike Stamm has had winter canola variety trials at the NCK research field west of Belleville for the past several years with very good success.

Due to this success, Cloud County crop producer Brad Berk has made the decision to grow canola for the first time on his farm this year following wheat. From my recent visit to Brad's field, it appears that

his winter canola crop is well on its way and in good shape as we move towards winter.

Producers in the area have the opportunity to attend a field day at Brad's field on October 31st at 10:00 a.m. to learn firsthand about the crop and its possibilities in this area. Any interested individuals are welcome to attend. River Valley District K-State Research and Extension is hosting the field day and refreshments will be sponsored by Wilbur-Ellis. KSU canola breeder, Mike Stamm, will be the speaker at the field. "This will be a great opportunity for producers, landowners, and those in agribusiness to learn more about good canola production practices for Kansas. Record planted acres this fall suggests interest in winter canola as a rotation crop with wheat continues to grow," Stamm

comments. The field is located 1 1/2 miles east of US-81 on Iron Road, south of Concordia, in Cloud County.

As canola is an oilseed, one benefit to adding it to your cropping system is its commodity price is not tied to the price of cereal grains. Producers who diversify their cropping systems by producing both cereal grains and oilseed crops can better withstand the risks associated with fluctuating grain markets. Generally, winter canola is planted six weeks before the first killing frost, or about one month before wheat planting.

An important factor to consider when selecting a winter canola cultivar in this area is winter survival. Successful winter survival depends on the genetics of the cultivar, the environment in which it is grown, and the management of the

producer. There are cultivars developed specifically for the Great Plains that have demonstrated excellent winter survival and performance under stressed environments.

For a detailed description of canola production and management in Kansas, refer to the *Great Plains Canola Production Handbook*, which can be obtained at your local Extension office. I hope to have a great turnout at the canola field day on the 31st. It will be an excellent opportunity to have canola expert Mike Stamm present to answer your questions and explain production practices and rotation benefits canola can provide to the cropping systems in our area. See you then!

Governor issues a call to action for a 50-year vision for Kansas water

Gov. Sam Brownback issued a call to action to address the need for a 50-year vision for Kansas water that meets the state's needs now and in the future. More than 550 attendees representing diverse water interests participated in the Governor's Conference on the Future of Water in Kansas.

"We have been reminded of the importance of water with another year of extreme drought for our state, which is now beginning to ease in eastern Kansas, but continues to persist in the west," said Brownback. "Water and the Kansas economy are directly linked. Water is a finite resource and without further planning and action we will no longer be able to meet our state's current needs, let alone growth."

Brownback articulated the need for a future vision for Kansas water management and issued a call to action for that work to begin immediately. He charged his administration, including the Kansas Water Office, Kansas Department of Agriculture, and Kansas Water Authority, along with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, and Wildlife, Parks and Tourism, to lead the vision and called upon his Council of Economic Advisors to engage in the planning since water and the economy are closely linked.

"We are at a pivotal moment in our state. We can talk these issues to death, but without vision we won't be able to address these priorities," said Brownback. "Ensuring each citizen has a reliable water supply includes addressing both the groundwater decline in the Ogallala Aquifer as well as securing, protecting and restoring our reservoir storage."

The Vision will take the Kansas Water Plan to a new level with more intense work and cooperation with communities, affected industries and citizens throughout the state to develop this vision to ensure a reliable water supply for Kansas citizens. Brownback directed the groups to deliver the 50-Year Vision for the Future of Water in Kansas to the his office for review no later than Nov. 1, 2014.

"As the Governor said today, we have a good set of laws to govern and manage our water resources however we do face a number of significant, but manageable challenges," said Tracy Streeter, Kansas Water Office director. "We have the ability and responsibility to choose our future vision for Kansas water management. We want future generations to benefit from our effort as we appreciate the decisions made by those who came before us."

"We need the help of all those here today, and the help of every Kansan, to place this vital resource as a top priority for our future," said Gary Harshberger, chair of the Kansas Water Authority. "We can see how bleak our future can be if we continue on this same path."

The conference continued with discussion and presentations by Charles Fishman, author of *The Big Thirst* and *The Wal-Mart Effect* and Pat Mulroy, who oversees the Las Vegas Valley Water District and

Southern Nevada Water Authority. A legislative panel with Sen. Carolyn McGinn, Sen. Larry Powell, Representative Kyle Hoffman and Rep. Sharon Schwartz. Sec. Dale Rodman, Kansas Department of Agriculture, discussed water's role in developing the Kansas agriculture economy.

Rodman urged water conference attendees to consider all options in developing the vision, including new technologies, different agricultural practices, policy changes,

local input and cooperation, and more.

"It is time we all figure out where we want to go. We have to develop a plan and take action," said Rodman. "We have to invest in conservation and technology. We all have to cooperate."

The next day's session built on the the water policy discussions with technical presentation posters and talks, involving many researchers, geologists and water planners for the state. Graduate and undergraduate students presented their research and Dr. James Stack, director of the

Great Plains Diagnostic presented Feeding a Growing Population in a Resource Stressed World.

K-State studies show benefits of early calf weaning

It's always been done this way, right? Calves are weaned in the fall. But drought conditions in the Plains states prompted some beef producers to wean calves earlier than usual in recent years, which may have been surprisingly beneficial, according to recent Kansas State University studies.

"The conventional weaning time has always been in the fall, when calves are around 180 to 210 days old, but there was no substantial research to show that that was necessarily the best time," said John Jaeger, beef scientist with K-State Research and Extension, based in Hays. There were probably many factors at play over the years, including bringing cows home from summer pasture, fitting weaning into crop harvest, fall school activities and more.

"We wondered if, rather than putting growth on calves at the expense of cows, it might be better to wean them earlier. If the calves fared well, it might give the cow more time to recover from calving and lactating and improve her own body condition before going into winter," Jaeger said.

This may be an espe-

cially important time to look at such management options, he said, as producers are planning to expand herds after cutting back several years due to drought and the resulting lack of forage.

The cattle industry in Kansas generated \$7.88 billion in cash receipts during 2012, and ranked sixth nationally in the number of beef cows at 1.33 million head as of Jan. 1, 2013, according to Kansas Agricultural Statistics.

Jaeger, along with K-State Research and Extension beef science colleagues K.C. Olson, who is based in Manhattan, and Justin Waggoner, based in Garden City, conducted two studies – one in 2007 and another in 2012, to determine the effect of earlier-than-usual weaning on the calves.

Calves gain, cows benefit

The studies found that calves weaned at 120 to 160 days at an average of 360 pounds gained as much weight and were just as healthy as calves that were weaned later. It also indicated that the health risks and death loss were no different in early-weaned calves than in those weaned at the more

conventional ages of 180 to 210 days.

"Previous studies by other researchers have shown that early weaning reduces grazing pressure," Jaeger said, adding that a calf weighing 450 pounds at 120 days of age eats about 6.8 pounds of forage per day. So, for every 30 days that a calf is weaned early, there should be one week of additional grazing for the cow.

Early weaning also decreases the cow's nutritional requirements. The studies showed that for every 30 days a calf is weaned early, there will be another three additional days of grazing for the cow. Cows enter fall and winter in better body condition, which trims the amount of winter supplementation needed and decreases cow maintenance costs. If the increased body condition is maintained through the winter and calving and to breeding, there is potential for improved conception rates the following summer.

Over the years, there's been a tendency to think that calves were not capa-

ble of using concentrated feed at a younger age, Jaeger said. Coupled with worries about calf stress, health risks, and heat – a complicating problem in July, August and September – has often kept producers from weaning earlier.

Optimum age still undetermined

Through this and other research, however, scientists know that calves can be weaned as early as 90 days, Jaeger said, but added that an optimum age for a beef production system has not been established.

"The optimum age in response to drought conditions is usually dictated by the severity of the drought and forage availability," he said. "I usually advise producers interested in early weaning to wean when calves average 120 days of age. Most progressive producers have a 60-day breeding season, so calves weaned at an average of 120 days of age will range from 90 to 150 days of age."

The studies indicated that the younger calves

need feed that is highly palatable, meaning that it tastes good to them, and relatively high in nutrient density to offset the fact that they don't eat as much as older calves do. They also found that feed moisture content of 20 to 30 percent is optimum.

"Familiar feeds may not have the nutrient density that you'll need if you wean calves early," Olson said. Just like humans sorting their most and least favorite foods on a plate, calves will sort their diet ingredients, so the size of the particles matters.

Management tips

"Newly weaned calves require management, regardless of the age at weaning. Producers should have a management plan and follow it," said Jaeger, who provided tips for producers based on the studies.

- Place an additional water tank and feed bunk in the pen with the calves.
- Remove floating covers from automatic water troughs.
- Pen calves based on their body size. Limit the

weight range within a pen to no more than 50 pounds less or more than the average weight in the pen.

- Make sure each calf has at least 12 inches of linear bunk space.

- Make sure the feed bunk and water supply can be easily accessed by the calves.

- Consider air flow – especially in hot weather. Too little shade promotes crowding.

A follow-up study is currently under way, in which the researchers weaned calves from their mothers at between 120 and 160 days, with an average of 127 days, and split them into two groups. Half of the calves were left to graze on pasture and the other half were placed in a feedlot. At the end of 60 days in the separate environments, the weaned calves will be put back together as a group, fed a common ration up to market weight. In that way, the team will be able to evaluate how grass-fed calves fared in comparison to those fed a high-concentrate diet. That data will be available in 2014.

Fall forage tour: Carry more cattle by acquiring more land or increasing the production of the land you have?

Cattlemen and producers are invited to the Fall Forage Tour, Friday, November 1 and Saturday, November 2. The tour will begin at 1:00 p.m. on both days at the Dale Strickler Farm, one mile south of Courtland on the west side of the highway. Two audiences will benefit from participation in the Fall Forage Tour – cattle producers and those interested in utilizing cover crops to improve soil health.

The tour will focus on improving soil productivity through the use of cover crops, forages, and perennial grasses. According to Strickler, ranchers have two options to increase cattle carrying capacity. They can choose “horizontal expansion” by acquiring more

land – and more debt – or they can improve existing pastures through “vertical expansion.” Vertical expansion increases the cattle carrying capacity by both expanding the root zone and increasing plant biomass. Strickler advocates expansion of the root zone through the use of selected cover crops and enhanced soil biology.

Soil and plant roots tell the story of how managed grazing, re-growth, and rest affect not only the top growth of grasses but also their roots. To illustrate this, Strickler will dig a soil pit at his farm's Eastern Gamagrass site permitting attendees to walk down into it and closely examine the roots and the soil beneath the grass. He will explain

what is happening at the site so that ranchers can see for themselves that increased root depth results in elevated organic matter levels and improved biological activity in the soil. Expanding the root zone by managing the grazing has the potential to increase the land's carrying capacity.

At the cabin site, ranchers will have the opportunity to view 27 varieties of cool season cover crops. Most varieties are solo-seeded to see the effects of soil tolerances. Five different soil types exist at this location: Calcareous, eroded, poorly drained bottom ground, well-drained bottom ground and saline

sodic. Participants will see Eastern Gamagrass, Grazing Alfalfa, Low Alkaloid Reed Canary Grass, Dale's Cover Crop Test Plot, Brown Midrib Forage Sorghum Sudan, Tropic Sun Non-Toxic Sun Hemp, Bird's Foot Trefoil, and frosted warm season residue as well as many other legume, forage and grass varieties.

Dale Strickler, a former agronomy instructor at Concordia's Cloud County

Community College, is a cover crop and forage specialist for Star Seed and is passionate about soil health.

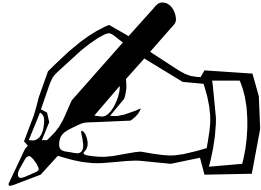

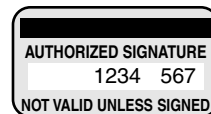

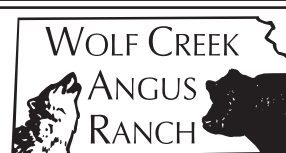

Commissioner elections approaching

Central Kansas wheat farmers have a unique opportunity to provide direction for one of Kansas' most important industries, through the 2014 Kansas commodity commission elections.

This winter, Kansas farmers will elect commissioners for each of the five state commodity commissions: wheat, grain sorghum, corn, soybeans and sunflowers. Growers interested in running for office must be active in producing the crop for which they wish to represent and must submit a petition for election to the Kansas Department of Agriculture. The petition must contain at least 20 signatures of eligible voters with not more than five signatures from any one county. The petition must be postmarked by Nov. 30 in order to be eligible for the 2014 election. Newly elected commissioners will take office April 1, 2014 and serve a three-year term.

Justin Gilpin, chief executive officer of the Kansas Wheat Commission, says the state commodity commission election process is an excellent way for farmers to become actively involved in their industry. "Commodity commissioners manage research, promotion and education programs funded by the checkoff for each commodity," Gilpin said. "The wheat industry is at an exciting point. We have seen increased interest in wheat, from both research and marketing perspectives. Participating in commission elections as a prospective commissioner or voter is an essential way to give input into Kansas agriculture, and the future direction of the wheat industry."

The Kansas Wheat Commission funds approximately \$1 million in research projects at K-State each year, and recently completed construction of a state-of-the-art research facility

no, Sedgwick, Stafford and Sumner counties.

If elected to the Kansas Wheat Commission, farmers will shape the future of the wheat industry in Kansas by setting the annual budget, policies and procedures that determine research, education and nutrition priorities. In addition, producers learn leadership skills and gain valuable insight into the entire wheat industry.

Farmers can register to vote by Dec. 31, by filling out the Commodity Voter Registration form, available at the Kansas Department of Agriculture or the Kansas Wheat Commission. A registered voter must be a Kansas resident, be at least 18 years old before the election and be actively engaged in growing wheat, corn, grain sorghum, soybeans or sunflowers within the preceding three years. Voters will receive a ballot by mail by Jan. 15 and have until March 1 to submit the ballot.

NASS announces changes to November crop production report

USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will publish information in the November 8th Crop Production report that was originally scheduled for release in the October report. This includes:

Potential updated planted and harvested acreage for dry edible beans, canola, corn, sorghum, soybeans, and sunflower;

Revised peanut and sunflower acreage, yield and production for 2012; and

Indicated 2013/2014 production forecasts for citrus fruits as of November 1.

As in past years, the November Crop Production report will include: indicated area harvested, yield and production forecasts as of November 1 for corn for grain, cotton, rice,

sorghum for grain, soybeans for beans, peanuts for nuts, sugarbeets and sugarcane for sugar and seed; indicated cottonseed production; planted acres, indicated area harvested, yield and production forecasts of fall potatoes; indicated area planted, harvested, yield and production forecasts for dry edible peas, Austrian winter peas, and lentils; percent of 2013 fall potatoes planted by variety; and indicated U.S. production of rice by class.

Also included in the report is objective survey data for selected states which include, corn plant population, number of ears, row width distribution and percent of samples processed in the lab; soybean row width distribution, number of pods with beans per 18 square feet and percent of

samples processed in the lab; cotton cumulative large boll counts; and number of samples and average number of hills per acre for fall potatoes.

Forecasts for several crops originally scheduled for release in October will not be included in the November report. These include harvested area, yield and production forecasts for hay and tobacco, as well as yield and production forecasts for canola, dry edible beans, and sunflowers. Estimates for these crops will be included in the 2013 Annual Crop Production report scheduled for release in January 2014.

NASS cancelled the October Crop Production report due to the lapse in federal funding and resulting federal government shutdown.

K-State plans three winter canola field tours

Producers and agribusiness professionals can get the latest research information on winter canola production from K-State Research and Extension at one of three winter canola field tours this fall, said Mike Stamm, Kansas State University canola breeder.

The first tour will be Oct. 31 in Cloud County; followed by two tours on Nov. 5 in Kingman and Sumner counties.

"This will be a great opportunity for producers, landowners, and those in agribusiness to learn more about good canola produc-

tion practices for Kansas. Record planted acres this fall suggests interest in winter canola as a rotation crop with wheat continues to grow," Stamm said.

The tour on Thursday, Oct. 31 will begin at 10 a.m. The field is located 1-1/2 miles east of U.S. Hwy. 81 on Iron Rd. south of Concordia in Cloud County. Light refreshments will be provided by Wilbur-Ellis.

The tours on Tuesday, Nov. 5, will begin at 10:30 a.m. The first tour stop is located eight miles west of KS Highway 14 on Cleveland Rd. (SE 70th St.) south of Kingman in Kingman

County. American Ag Credit of Kingman will provide refreshments.

The second tour on Nov. 5 begins at 1:30 p.m. It is located two miles north of Conway Springs on KS Highway 49 and 1/8 mile west on 110th Ave. North. Refreshments will be sponsored by Triple Threat.

The field tours fulfill the requirements of a USDA-Risk Management Agency-sponsored grant titled "Helping Kansas Producers and Ranchers Understand and Use Good Farming Practices for Winter Canola."

Angus bred heifer sale uses tech to find best

There is a lot to be said for a good-looking heifer. There is a lot more to be done, and profit to be made, when you know what's under the hide.

The cattle business has become a high-stakes case with \$1,200 calves and cows often bringing twice that, while feed and other costs hold back expansion. At the other end, beef consumers want to buy beef from the meat case, but cost is a worry. In both cases, they need more information.

Two northern Missouri Angus breeders and their bull customers decided this fall to do something about it. On Dec. 7, a Green City (Mo.) Livestock Auction sale will feature 300 to 350 high-percentage Angus bred heifers that have been screened to reduce risk.

The GeneMax™ (GMX) Elite Bred Heifer Sale is named after the genomic DNA test from Certified Angus Beef LLC (CAB) that sorts genetic potential for gain and grade, ranking cattle from 99 down to 1 at the bottom. These heifers will be artificially inseminated (AI) and fetal sexed, then sorted for presentation to bidders.

Jim Brinkley, Milan, Mo., and Mark Womack, Elmer, Mo., have been AI-breeding nearly 3,000 head per year, including Womack's custom business as a representative for Genex/CRI, a co-sponsor of the sale. Drawing on a pool of candidates from those associates, the two worked with Wes Tiemann, regional manager for the American Angus Association, and Kara Lee, CAB supply programs manager, to sort out the best.

"We selected them on visual characteristics," Brinkley said. "Then it was time to go in and pull out the cream of the crop with GeneMax."

Womack said \$17 per head is well worth the cost, considering what the knowledge is worth on the farm as well as what one more bid is worth at the sale. "You could spend more on three buckets of feed."

Before that test, all heifers were entered in AI programs because they met producer standards for maternal, weaning weight and carcass prospects. Then they settled, safe in calf to high-accuracy and balanced-EPD Angus sires for a conveniently limited calving period. GMX Scores further cull out the lower third, which will not be offered in the appropriately named Elite Bred Heifer Sale.

The technology, first offered in spring 2012, has already helped the local beef industry, Tiemann said. "Whether it is for keep-or-cull decisions in their own herds or marketing decisions for the sale, GMX has in just a short period of time characterized a large portion of cattle in Missouri."

Anything that adds knowledge reduces risk, the Angus regional manager said.

"The amount of unknown in the heifers we typically keep back in our herd each year is almost scary to think about," Tiemann said. "Even with a closed herd and good records, we still have no clue about how the genes are at work."

"The producers involved with this sale understand the cost of making a replacement and the impact a young animal can make on an operation," he added. "That's why without hesitation they got on board with GMX to put to rest some of the unknowns. They're ahead of the curve financially by eliminating the low-score heifers." Womack spent a few days over the fall gathering video clips of heifers in the sale, available soon with more information at www.greencitylivestock.com. He, Brinkley and Tiemann are noted as contacts there, and will be at the sale to further explain the value based on qualifications, so bidders can make informed decisions.

As more elite heifers, capable of producing for the CAB brand join the commercial cow herd, consumers will have an easier choice at the meat case as well, Womack said. The sale is planned as a "first annual," the men said.

Research confirms penicillin withdrawal time critical in sows

There's a new number to become familiar with if you have a sow farm today: 51. Checkoff-funded research found that a 51-day withdrawal is recommended for extra-label penicillin use before send-

ing sows to market.

According to Dr. Steve Larsen, Pork Checkoff pork safety director, the new recommendation is part of a strategy to ensure U.S. pork maintains its reputation as the safest in the world. As

part of this, the U.S. Food and Safety Inspection Service (FSIS) has changed how it conducts residue testing in slaughter hogs and sows.

"The new FSIS testing procedure for sampling and identification of volatile residues uses a new, more accurate multi-residue method," Larsen said. "Soon after its debut in 2011, the agency found increased volatile rates of Penicillin G in sows."

"This led to a research project to study the effect different injection sites and techniques might have on residue depletion in sows and to the new recommended pre-slaughter withdrawal of 51 days for extra-label use," he said.

While adhering to recommended withdrawals is very important, it's equally critical for producers to always work under the guidance of their herd veterinarian on any extra-label product use. The FDA has established a zero tolerance for penicillin in edible pork tissues. Therefore, any

detectable level will result in a volatile level, which the agency will then investigate.

"Producers should keep good medication records for their herd as part of Pork Quality Assurance® Plus," Larsen said. "The new emphasis on penicillin withdrawal just makes that task all the more important."

To address the increase of penicillin violative residues in sows, the Pork Checkoff-funded research to determine the appropriate pre-slaughter withdrawal period for penicillin G procaine in sows under extra-label usage.

Key research findings:

• Follow a recommended 51-day pre-slaughter withdrawal with extra-label use to prevent violative residues.

• If using a product, even an over-the-counter one such as penicillin, it must be done under the guidance of a veterinarian.

• Follow your veterinarian's instruction when administering extra-label ani-

mal health products, including penicillin.

USDA issues CRP and ACRE payments

Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack has announced that USDA has begun distributing Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) annual rental payments to participants across the country. USDA also will distribute 2013 direct payments and 2012 Average Crop Revenue Election (ACRE) program payments beginning Oct. 24. Payments originally were scheduled to be issued earlier in the month, but were delayed by several weeks due to the lapse in Federal funding.

“Farmers, ranchers and rural landowners across the country count on USDA programs and the payment delays due to the shutdown were an unnecessary burden,” Vilsack said. “USDA has prioritized making these scheduled payments without any further delay and Farm Service Agency staff have worked hard to get this assistance out the door as quickly as possible.” Producers will receive payments on almost 700,000 CRP contracts on 390,000 farms covering 26.8 million acres. In exchange for a yearly rental payment provided by USDA on contracts ranging from 10 to 15 years, farmers and ranchers enrolled in CRP agree to remove environmentally sensitive land from agricultural production and plant grasses or trees that will improve water quality and

improve waterfowl and wildlife habitat. CRP reduced runoff and leaching of nitrogen and phosphorus into waterways by an estimated 605 million pounds and 121 million pounds, respectively, in 2012, and soil erosion reductions totaling 308 million tons in 2012.

Direct payments for 2013 for the DCP and ACRE programs are being made to the more than 1.7 million farms enrolled in the Farm Service Agency’s programs. Producers with base acres of certain commodities are eligible for DCP payments. ACRE payments for 2012-crop barley, corn, grain sorghum, lentils, oats, peanuts, dry peas, soybeans, and wheat are scheduled to be released beginning Oct. 24 and contingent upon national average market prices and yields in each state. ACRE payments for large chickpeas, small chickpeas, canola, crambe, flaxseed, mustard seed, rapeseed, safflower, sesame, and sunflowers are scheduled to be made in early December and for long grain rice and medium and short grain rice in early February 2014 when the final 2012/13 market year average price data becomes available.

Kansas youth compete in All American Quarter Horse Congress

On October 16th, three Jackson County and one Jefferson County youth represented the Kansas Quarter Horse Association at the 47th All American Quarter Horse Congress horse judging contest in Columbus, Ohio. Team members included Payke Brown, from Topeka, Dean Klahr, Holton; Joel Nelson, Soldier; and Tristan Parks, Holton.

The day’s contest consisted of evaluating and ranking 11 classes. Eight of those classes were performance classes, and included Trail, Western Horsemanship, Reining, Western Pleasure, Western Riding, Hunt Seat Equitation, Hunter Hack, and Hunter Under Saddle. Three classes consisted of halter horses, and included Yearling Stallions, two-year-old mares, and performance geldings. In addition to judging the classes, each individual had to give two sets of halter and two sets of performance reasons to defend their placings. Performance reasons sets were over Equitation and Trail, and halter sets included the performance geldings, and the two-year-old mares.

As individuals, Payke Brown ranked 83rd in Halter, 19th in Performance, 59th in reasons, and 60th overall. Dean Klahr was 36th in Halter, 15th in Performance, 37th in Reasons,

and 24th overall individually. Joel Nelson placed 23rd in Halter, 3rd in Performance, 20th in Reasons, and ranked 8th overall. Tristan Parks ranked 9th in Halter, 14th in Performance, 23rd in Reasons, and placed 5th overall as an individual.

The Kansas Team ranked 7th in Halter, 2nd in Performance, 7th in Reasons, and 3rd overall, out of 26 other teams from across the United States.

In addition, the October 16, 2013 Continuing Resolution provides funding for several Farm Bill conservation programs, including the Environmental Quality Incentives Program.

Beef checkoff changes marketing direction for 2014

Millennials and other beef consumers can now see and hear the tantalizing sights and sounds of “Beef. It’s What’s for Dinner” messages without putting down their mobile devices or leaving the comfort of their keyboards and social-media circles.

That’s thanks to a Sept. 25 decision by the 20-member Beef Promotion Operating Committee to make a major shift in strategic direction for the checkoff’s promotion and marketing efforts. Beginning this month, digital marketing will lead the way in sharing beef’s message about nutrition, health and research and creating a forum for consumers to publically share and celebrate their love for beef.

In recognition of the importance of marketing via electronic devices — such as smartphones, tablets, cell phones, computers and

consoles – the committee approved the shift from an print and radio campaign to digital marketing via multi-media beef messages on email, blogs and social networks.

Research indicates that there are two types of consumers: those who are actively seeking out information, often via Web searches or by opening an email, text message or Web feed and those who prefer to get their messages passively, by using, for example, targeted display advertising on web-sites and news blogs.

“Digital marketing allows us to be extremely selective about who receives our messaging, using technology called ‘geo-targeting,’” says Polly Ruhland, Beef Board CEO. “Because your every online twitch can be tracked, digital marketing experts (like check-off contractor staff and the checkoff’s new digital mar-

keting agency) know a great deal about you: your favorite food, clothing and widgets, your hobbies, your hometown, your family, your friends.”

Using geo-tracking, the checkoff can send marketing messages to a very tight target audience whose preferences, food likes and lifestyles fit the checkoff’s target audience. In other words, the checkoff can pinpoint exactly who it wants to reach with beef messages.

For instance, real-time slow cooker beef recipes can be delivered to Millennial moms, in a particular geographic region, who have purchased a crock-pot online, who are actively searching for simple week-night meals at that very moment.

Or, when a food blogger

writes a positive piece about beef, the checkoff can increase the visibility of the story to reach a targeted older Millennial consumer within the online spaces they visit every day. “Beef. It’s What’s for Dinner,” the iconic tagline of more than 20 years, will be re-energized through a new audience and new strategy – the growing and important Millennial, through comprehensive digital engagement.

“It’s a brave, new world and we are now an integral part of it,” says Ruhland. “I’ve been asked this: ‘Why Millennials, and why not Baby Boomers, a similarly sized audience?’ Several good reasons exist for focusing checkoff investments this way.”

At the core of this plan is the new consumer target:

older millennial parents. They are part of the largest and most connected generation ever. By 2020, their spending will hit \$1.4 trillion dollars a year.

Millennials will make beef-buying decisions for the next 40-plus years.

As much as it stings to think about it, the much-loved, much catered-to (by consumer products) Baby Boomers soon will be a shrinking generation with decreasing influence over others.

Boomers don’t shout each day’s activities from the rooftops. Millennials do: They are more likely to share their experiences widely, especially through social networks. We have to put our money where the consumers and influencers are.

The ability to geo-target

means that producer and importer investments in the checkoff will be focused tightly on consumers who are most likely to move the needle on beef demand. Social and digital media provide the beef checkoff a clear and focused way to deliver beef-centric information, enabling consumers to select and prepare beef enthusiastically.

“Change is always a little intimidating, but I am inspired by the opportunities for beef in the new plan,” says Ruhland. “The explosion of social and digital media presents great opportunities for us with our powerful target market and our relatively small marketing budget.”

KDA works to expand beef cattle export opportunities in Russia

Promoting modern beef cattle production practices utilized by Kansas farmers and ranchers and high quality Kansas beef products will be priorities for the Kansas Department of Agriculture (KDA) during a trade mission to Russia October 23-November 2.

KDA agribusiness coordinator Thad Geiger will join a delegation of officials from the South Dakota Department of Agriculture and Montana Department of Agriculture on the mission to Russia sponsored by the U.S. Livestock Genetics Export, Inc. The delegation will meet with government officials, including government leaders in Novosibirsk, attend the Agro Expo Siberia and visit cattle ranches in the Novosibirsk region.

As Russia and other Eastern European countries work to rebuild domestic cattle herds, Geiger said Kansas has tremendous potential to benefit. Noting U.S. exports of more than 54,000 breeding cows from the United States to Russia in 2012, Geiger said this mission will help further solidify Kansas’ role as an international leader in the beef

cattle industry.

“Kansas is a leader in the beef cattle industry, and many of our state’s seed-stock producers are benefiting from increased cattle exports to Russia already,” Geiger said. “As we continue to expand exports to Russia, however, we also have an opportunity to help train and educate Russian cattlemen and women. Not only are good genetics and high quality cattle important, but so too are good herd management, record keeping, animal health and nutrition programs, employee training and risk management tools.”

The Russian federal government has provided support programs aimed at rebuilding the domestic beef and dairy cattle herds. Funds have been allocated specifically for construction and modernization of livestock farms, and the purchase of high quality dairy and beef breeding cattle, semen and embryos.

The KDA Agricultural Advocacy, Marketing and Outreach Team has worked with Kansas farmers, ranchers and agribusinesses to expand export opportunities in Russia since 2010.

Rain and snow slows harvest

For the week ending October 20, 2013, temperatures were cooler than normal, with precipitation hindering harvest progress across most of the state, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Reports of rain early in the week in eastern half of the state slowed harvest, while several inches of snow in northwest Kansas late in the week affected some unharvested milo and prevented farmers from harvesting their crops. There were 4.8 days suitable for fieldwork. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 9 percent very short, 29 short, 59 adequate, and 3 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 18 percent very short, 33 short, 49 adequate, and 0 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat planted was 87 percent, near 90 last year and 85 average. Emerged was 61 percent, near 59 last year and 60 average. Wheat condition rated 0 percent very poor, 2 poor, 35 fair, 60 good, and 3 excellent.

Ninety-eight percent of the corn crop was mature,

near 100 last year and 99 average. Corn harvest was 68 percent complete, behind 93 last year, and 73 average. Corn condition rated 12 percent very poor, 15 poor, 30 fair, 33 good, and 10 excellent.

Sorghum coloring was 99 percent, equal to 99 last year and 99 average. Sorghum mature was 83 percent, near 81 last year and 80 average. Sorghum harvested was 36 percent, near 35 last year and 32 average. Condition rated 6 percent very poor, 14 poor, 31 fair, 40 good, and 9 excellent.

Soybeans dropping leaves were 95 percent, equal to last year and near 94 average. Soybeans harvested was 60 percent, ahead of 56 last year and 58 average. Condition rated 3 percent very poor, 11 poor, 36 fair, 42 good, and 8 excellent.

Cotton with open bolls was 81 percent, behind 95 last year and 85 average. Three percent of the crop was harvested, behind 8 last year and 5 average. Condition rated 1 percent very poor, 10 poor, 46 fair, 36

good, and 7 excellent.

Ninety-nine percent of the sunflower acreage was in the ray flower dried stage, near 100 last year, 98 average. The portion of crop that had turned yellow was 98 percent, near 96 percent last year and 94 average. Sunflowers that turned brown were 86 percent, equal to last year but ahead of 78 average. Sunflowers harvested was 34 percent, behind 38 last year but ahead of 26 average. Condition rated 6 percent very poor, 16 poor, 44 fair, 31 good, and 3 excellent.

The fourth cutting of alfalfa was 86 percent complete, ahead of 81 last year but equal to 86 average.

Livestock, Pasture and Range Report: The condition of range and pasture rated 18 percent very poor, 18 poor, 31 fair, 30 good, and 3 excellent. Stock water supplies rated 11 percent very short, 16 short, 71 adequate, and 2 surplus.
