



Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

Tuesday was the July supply and demand report, but that definitely took a back seat to the weather. There really wasn't much market-moving information in the supply and demand report and the production figures could still be altered significantly by the weather.

As of Friday afternoon it appears that there will be a long hot, dry stretch in the Corn Belt beginning Wednesday or Thursday. Most forecasts agree on that, but where the disagreement comes in is regarding how high the temperatures get and how long they last. Temperatures in the low 90s won't have much of an impact, even if it is dry, but temperatures in the mid to upper nineties, especially for a prolonged period, can do significant damage to yield potential.

Confusing the potentially threatening weather story is that fact that crop condition ratings improved in the last report, with the corn gaining one point at 76% Good to

Excellent and the soybeans gaining one point coming in at 71% Good to Excellent. Despite many complaints about the lack of moisture in some areas this growing season, and despite a relatively hot June for the United States as a whole, the crop looks great. Mostly likely there won't be a drop in the condition ratings in the July 18th report because the weather has been pretty good, and there might not even be much change on the 25th because the heat isn't supposed to come until late in the week.

Judging by Thursday and Friday's market action, traders aren't too concerned about the impending heat. Most folks probably want to see the Sunday night forecasts before they get too excited about chasing after this market. After all, if we don't have a weather problem to disrupt corn production, then we are sitting on a very large pile of corn and wheat, and those markets are probably overvalued.

The soybean market still has the greatest upside potential. August weather can greatly impact soybean production and USDA is still significantly underestimating demand. We can easily see an ending stocks estimate under 200 million even without a weather problem, but with a yield reduction we can add several dollars to the price of soybeans.

There is still nothing positive to report for the cattle market. We see glimmers of hope from time to time, but that is it. The market is still in a down trend and there is no indication that we are near that changing. Rallies are to be sold for the time being. The next downside objective for the October live cattle is the \$104 area.

House approves Chairman Roberts' Agriculture Biotechnology bill

U.S. Senator Pat Roberts, R-Kan., Chairman of the Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry, announced on Friday his landmark legislation to protect the use of agriculture biotechnology and to ensure consumers have greater access to food information was approved by the U.S. House of Representatives and now heads to the President's desk to be signed into law.

The bipartisan legislation, S.764, crafted by Chairman Roberts and Ranking Member Debbie Stabenow, D-Mich., was approved by the House on a 306-117 vote.

"I'm pleased that Members of the House sided with sound science and the American farmer," said Chairman Roberts. "In the course of negotiating this legislation for nearly a year, I am proud this work brought together the largest coalition of agriculture and food groups ever. Over 1,000 organizations joined me in putting the farmer and rancher first."

"In the past, many of these organizations were at odds when crafting farm bills or other agriculture policy priorities. The strong and unified support for our bill among these agriculture groups proves that we put forward a sound solution to biotech-

nology disclosure, but most important, it shows what can be accomplished for farmers when agriculture speaks with one voice. At a time when agriculture biotechnology is fulfilling an increasingly critical role meeting world demand for food, agriculture must speak with one voice to confront misinformation about its practices and operations.

"I have said this is the most important food and agriculture policy debate of the last 20 years. I am confident we have put forward a comprehensive solution that considers all aspects of our food production and delivery system while keeping the consumer top of mind."

"I am proud of this solution and the bipartisan example we have set for future agriculture policy discussions. I'm grateful for the leadership of fellow Kan-san, Congressman Mike Pompeo, and House Agriculture Committee Chairman Mike Conaway in getting this across the finish line in the House and for the partnership of Senator Debbie Stabenow."

JACK CARTER "Trey" ALLEN III

Jack Carter "Trey" Allen III, 45, of the McDowell Creek Community, Manhattan, Kansas, passed away peacefully with his parents present, July 7, 2016. Trey battled Multiple Myeloma cancer since 2013.

Trey was born January 20, 1971 in Richardson Texas, the son of Jack Carter Allen Jr. and Tana (Davis/Wiggins) Gasperek. He went to grade school in Claude, Texas; attended Cal Farley's Boys Ranch, Amarillo, Texas 1983-1988; and graduated from Claude High School in 1989.

For some twenty years and change, Jack "Trey" Allen wrote and recited cowboy poetry. He started out gathering intel early in life as a bullrider/bullfighter and graduated to shoeing horses and starting colts. To those in the know, this should explain a great deal. At the point he began his family, however, the conclusion was reached that three meals a week and Copenhagen made less than desirable home conditions and he settled into a real job near the present-day metropolis of Hooker, Oklahoma. While earning a regular paycheck, he kept his hand turned at colts and shoeing, day working, and so on. It was during this time he became intimate with a little known group called "Corporate America." Thirteen years of that and he packed his family up, headed for the mountains of south central Colorado, near Canon City, and became a full-time cowboy for the rest of his life. In 2006, he moved to Kansas and for 10 years he managed the Moyer Ranch in the northern Flint Hills of Kansas, south of Manhattan, Kansas.

Trey performed cowboy poetry from the Gulf Coast of Alabama to North Dakota and from Missouri to Utah. He was one of four event winners at the first Cowboy Poetry Rodeo and was purty fortunate in subsequent National Cowboy Poetry Rodeo events. In 2011, Kansas hosted its first annual State Cowboy Poetry competition, and a win there offered Trey the opportunity to perform for the "Gubernatorial Entourage" at the Symphony of the Flint Hills, Alma Kansas, in front of Governor Sam Brownback; he considered that a career highlight. The Durango Cowboy Poetry Gathering in Colorado and the Cochise Cowboy Poetry & Music Gathering in Sierra Vista, Colorado, were among his favorite gatherings to perform, along with local Kansas Livestock Association meetings.

Trey could always be seen wearing his trademark pink tall tops, colorful shirt and just as colorful wild rag on stage. His girls would call him "The Skittles cowboy." Trey titled himself as "Cowboy Poet, Humorist, Surveyor of Kingdoms, and Practitioner of Quality, Truth and Improvement."

Trey was past president of the Kansas Livestock Association, local chapter in Junction City, Kansas.

Trey is survived by his wife, Janice (Hannagan) Allen, Manhattan, Kansas; three daughters, Shandee, Edmond, Oklahoma, and Lara and Tera M., Cushing, Oklahoma; two step children, Jenna and Colton, Manhattan, Kansas; mother, Tana (Davis/Wiggins) Gasperek, Tres Piedras, New Mexico; step father (the man Trey called dad) Dee Aduddell and his wife Ronda, Claude, Texas; sisters Tera J. Ingram, Emporia, Kansas and Shana Aduddell, Amarillo, Texas; two brothers, Cody Aduddell, Claude, Texas and Seth Aduddell, Amarillo, Texas; two nephews, Tough Medina, Emporia, Kansas and Trenton Richey, Pampa, Texas; a favorite niece, Evelyn Aduddell, Claude, Texas; along with all his brothers from Cal Farley's Boys Ranch in Amarillo, Texas and all his numerous cowboy poet friends.

Trey was preceded in death by his father Jack Carter Allen Jr., December 29, 1972.

Trey's wish was to have his three girls take a road trip to scatter his ashes at all the ranches where he was employed and where he day-worked.

There will be a celebration of life, or as Trey would call, it a "shindig," later this fall at the McDowell Creek Community Center, Manhattan, Kansas. Kansas Hay Market Report

Hay trade activity slow. Demand light to moderate for grinding alfalfa and light for all other classes of hay. Prices generally steady. Kansas continues to see rain, thunderstorms and even a tornado across the state, making it difficult to get the hay and wheat crops out of the fields. The quality of alfalfa has been reduced due to the abundant precipitation, heat and humidity. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, the 1.5-2.5 inches of rain that fell in northern Kansas was enough to erase the D0 conditions in Smith and Jewell County. However, western Kansas missed some of the rain, causing D0 conditions to be added to Graham and Rooks County. Surplus rains eliminated much of the D0 in eastern Kansas. The NASS Kansas Crop Progress and Condition report for the week ending July 10, 2016 has alfalfa hay conditions at 1 pct Very Poor, 5 pct Poor, 32 pct Fair, 57 pct Good, and 5 pct Excellent. Alfalfa hay second cutting is 69 pct complete, near 73 pct last year, and behind 76 pct average. Hell's Canyon

Looking at the mountains from a distance, you can see a nasty scar that begins in the lower foothills and twists and turns as it carves its way toward the high peaks of Montana's Highland Mountains. That distant scar is Hell's Canyon. The mountains are majestic. The canyon is a nightmare.

Thirty-five miles south-east of Butte, Montana, Hell's Canyon snakes its way from the Jefferson River gouging a deep, tangled furrow littered with boulders and impenetrable timber upward toward the Continental Divide. It's federal land and part of BLM's land management program. It is also one of the most breathtaking areas of the Northern Rockies.

Breathtaking—if you ride into the canyon horseback and find yourself trapped by sheer walls or a myriad of other obstacles created when the canyon was formed by the cataclysm of some violent force of nature eons ago, it will take your breath away when you realize you've got yourself in a mess.

Take a few deep breaths and look behind you. You'll wonder if you can find your way back to where you entered the canyon on that steep game trail that looked so inviting when you decided to do a little exploring. Here's where a good horse pays off. Trust him. He probably remembers every twist and turn he made riding into this treacherous terrain. Turn around and loosen the reins. He'll probably take you right back to the top of the canyon where you sat and looked down at the rugged beauty of Hell's Canyon and Hell's Canyon Creek rushing along the bottom of the gorge. Good horses always seem to remember where they've been even if years have passed since they traveled a certain trail.

The mountains have been logged, mined and ranched since the first settlers arrived centuries ago. The Forest Service maintains a few roads that climb the mountain and lead to a Forest Service cabin at the head of Hell's Canyon Creek. Beaver dams create ponds that hold trout and are a delight to fly fishermen. Hunters and fishermen can rent the cabin for a low fee and are treated to the splendor of an unspoiled wilderness alive with deer, elk and other game animals.

The cabin sits beside the creek and backs up to a steep ridge near the upper reaches of the canyon. I came on the cabin one fall day to find hunters who were staying in the cabin butchering two bull elk only yards from the front porch. Tracks in the snow told the story. The elk came down the ridge and passed near the cabin. The hunters merely had to step out of the warm cabin and take aim. It

doesn't happen that way very often but in Hell's Canyon surprises are no surprise.

From the cabin, the creek begins its long descent toward the Jefferson River. The pleasant meandering creek near the beaver ponds and cabin picks up speed and rushes down the mountain. The gorge deepens and becomes a tangle of intersecting draws and ravines that add their water to the creek. All along the route, trout of several species hide in pools and back water recesses where the creek jogs relentlessly down the canyon.

Hiking from the higher elevations is the best way to travel. You can work your way through the rough ground easier on foot and not have to worry about deadfall timber. You can more easily scale boulder slides and white knuckle cliffs. If you have the stamina and courage to enter Hell's Canyon on foot, you will be treated to the best of nature's wonders and can stumble upon a bit of history left by the early miners and ranchers.

Elk hunting one year on a ranch in the mountains near the canyon, we watched a bull leave the ranch and head for Hell's Canyon. He disappeared down a steep ravine into the snarl of timber and boulders leading into Hell's Canyon.

We stopped on top of the ravine and looked into its depths. Above the ravine, we saw no sign of the bull.

"If you're willing to go down there after him, you might have a slim chance of getting a shot, he's headed for the horse trap."

The speaker was the ranch owner. His family had been in these mountains since 1860. He knew every rock and bush in the country.

"My dad and granddad built the trap early in the last century. They used it to catch wild horses."

I was anxious to see the wild horse trap in the ravine. If I was lucky enough to get a shot at the bull, it would be a double bonus. I started down the steep trail and entered the bottom of the draw leading into the canyon. It was no picnic. The going was tough but I made my way slowly into a narrow myriad of huge granite boulders and towering Douglas Firs. Downhill all the way, I kept my eyes peeled for the elk and the horse trap.

I saw elk tracks in the fresh snow and the anticipation of the hunt kept me moving down the ravine farther than I should have gone. When the defile became extremely narrow, I paused for a rest and wondered how the bull elk with his huge rack could navigate through the dense trees, brush and boulders.

It was then that I saw ahead timbers crossing the defile in a jumbled pattern.

The horse trap!

I eased past the first set of timbers almost reverently lest I disturb this piece of western history. I saw more timbers farther on crossing the narrow corridor. I examined the logs and saw how they had been arranged to prevent horses from pass-

ing. Part of the trap had collapsed with age and elk tracks passed through the gap. More interested in the trap and knowing my shot at the elk was fast disappearing, I took a few moments to study the wild horse trap.

It had been built almost a hundred years ago but the semi-arid climate had preserved the collection of lodge pole and other conifers used to confine the horses. I imagined the scene when the horses were run into the trap. I could picture the panic they must have felt when they realized there was no escape. The silence in the canyon was eerie as I stood there and tried to visualize the horses milling and screaming in terror.

When I satisfied my curiosity and thoughts of the trophy elk had slipped away with the discovery of the horse trap, I reminded myself that I still had to climb out of Hell's Canyon and hike back to the rim.

Reluctantly, I turned and began the long uphill climb.

Thoughts of early ranchers and wild horses kept me occupied as I worked my way out of the ravine, leaving behind another breathtaking Hell's Canyon experience.

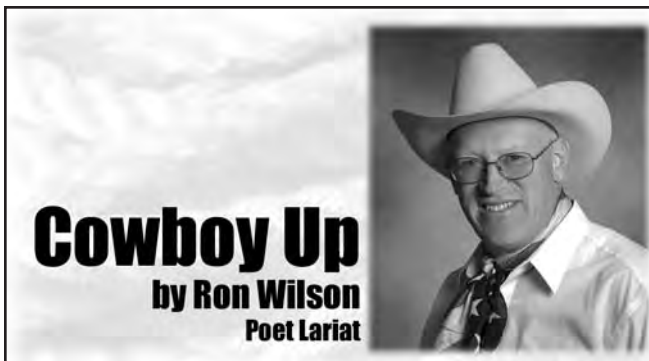

cumbed to multiple myeloma on July 7.

Trey was a true cowboy in the best sense. He was a working cowboy, ranch manager and past president of the Geary County Livestock Association.

He was also a true character. A person couldn't miss his characteristic bowler hat, hot pink cowboy boots, and fun personality.

Trey was born in Texas. He began as a rodeo bullrider and bullfighter and went on to start colts and shoe horses. He cowboied in Oklahoma and Colorado before coming to Kansas. In 2006, he became manager of the Moyer Ranch south of Manhattan.

I met Trey when he competed in the first Kansas Cowboy Poetry Contest which was held at the Wabaunsee County Fairgrounds in 2011. Trey won hands down. He was the clear winner in both categories, humorous and serious. His serious poem included him responding to the question, what is cowboy poetry? This poem was a beautiful, lyrical description of cowboy life and what makes it so special.

His humorous poem was a winner, too. It described a time when he and a buddy took a break from riding and started eating cherries and sharing drinks. As you might guess, the situation got out of hand. This poem had us rolling in the aisles by the time he was done. He definitely earned the Governor's trophy buckle with his performance.

Trey would go on to serve as emcee of the state contest, and he was the best emcee we ever had. More importantly, his life stood as an example of the best values of the cowboy: Love of the land, ranching skills, working hard, playing hard, honesty, loyalty, and riding for the brand.

Even after his diagnosis and multiple treatments, he remained the same Trey, funny and down-to-earth. The Center for Western and Cowboy Poetry said it this way (the following used with permission):

"His many, many friends and loving family know that Trey, in the words of his wife, Janice Hannagan-Allen, was 'a true cowboy, thru and true all the way.' Janice commented that Trey was, 'A man that has

touched a million lives, not just as a poet but as a friend to all of us... He loved you all as much as you loved him... Your love and prayers for our family are much appreciated..."

In a recent article in *Western Horseman* by Senior Editor Jennifer Denison, his friend, poet Jay Snider, is quoted, "Trey is one of those guys that lives every day by the same code of ethics as the old-timers. It means something to him that your word is your bond and that you do what you say you're going to do."

His fight with cancer was a long struggle, but he persevered mightily. He was able to serve as a judge at the National Cowboy Poetry Rodeo in 2015. He far exceeded the doctor's predictions and even managed to

attend a family reunion in Texas in summer 2016.

Don Dane, a famed western artist, used photos of Trey on horseback for some of his nicest works of art. Don's painting of Trey called "Cowboy True, Thru and Thru" was selected for the 2015 poster of National Cowboy Poetry Week.

Trey's obituary states the following: "There will be a celebration of life, or as Trey would call it, a 'shindig,' later this fall at the McDowell Creek Community Center, Manhattan, Kansas. In lieu of flowers, please make donations to 'Allen Girls' College Fund,' 15601 Hannagan Road, Manhattan KS 66502. Their education was very important to him."

Rest in peace, cowboy.

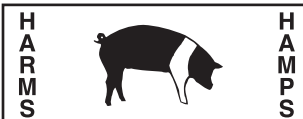

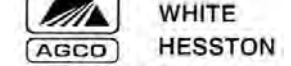

High tech fits marketing, too

Recently my family bought a camper. I was on the phone describing it to my mom, as she asked, "You mean, there's a wall right there? The bed folds down - how?" So I said, "Hold on and I'll FaceTime you." In less than ten seconds, I was giving her a tour via my iPhone. We were separated

by 450 miles, but she could easily see every detail for herself. In high school my friends and I used Instant Messenger like it was going out of style (and I guess it was!). I bought my first cell phone when I went to college, but didn't text because it cost 25 cents every time I did. I couldn't imagine the ease with which we'd use

Skype and FaceTime or texting for both business and personal connections just a few years later.

Global positioning systems (GPS) now guide us down the highways and autosteer farm tractors in fields patrolled by drones. In our homes, robots now clean the floors while we sleep.

It all makes me wonder: In a decade or two, will kids live-stream a video of *The Jetsons* cartoon and think it looks more like the Flintstones did to me?

In the cattle business, these changes are all about us.

When I started my professional career a decade ago, I listened to talks that questioned whether cattle DNA genomics could be an applicable technology in the field. It would need higher accuracy, lower price points and an easy way to interpret and incorporate the data. I listened to experts in academia and industry, and even producers who were very

early adopters, with wonder and amazement. It all sounded a bit George Jetson-esque.

But now? All of those things have happened and exponentially more producers are improving their herds with simple blood tests or tissue samples.

Depending on the breed, today's genomically-enhanced expected progeny differences (EPDs) are updated as often as weekly. Think about that. First there was phenotype, or selecting animals based on looks alone. Along came estimated breeding values (EBVs, still used on individual animals across the world), and then EPDs grew in popularity as cattlemen could see directional change in calves.

And now, you don't even have to wait for a spring or fall sire summary to know

how animals rank. It's available nearly in real time. On top of that, a commercial cowman can take an ear notch at tagging and within a few weeks have an estimate of that calf's ability to gain and grade or carry maternal characteristics into the herd.

Now direct your attention to the changes in marketing. Previous generations took cattle to the auction market, where they were identified by weight, sex and color. How do you sell calf crop? Perhaps by taking them to the auction and providing no more clues than weight, sex and color. Don't ignore technology in marketing - talk to your auction manager about how to earn premiums with documented health and genetics.

Look into variations such as video and online auc-

tions. Source and age verification. Natural affidavits. A few recent programs aim to do more to help sellers communicate genetics and capture more value, no matter how they sell.

All lead to more information flow. But, if we're honest, can we say our ability to market animals has kept up with all the technological and data changes in genetic selection?

Imagine going to buy a bull and knowing only this: where it came from, what it looked like and its advertised breed makeup.

Might seem a bit antiquated.

Feeder cattle markets: crossroads of the cattle industry

The job of markets – any market – is to determine what will be produced; how much will be produced; and what resources will be used to produce; all relative to

the demand for the product. The cattle industry produces fed cattle ready for slaughter. However, this production mostly occurs across separate and widely dispersed sectors of cow-calf, stocker and feedlot production by producers who only interact through

market transactions.

Feeder cattle markets are the one and only place in the cattle industry where cow-calf, stocker and feedlot producers all communicate, albeit indirectly through feeder cattle prices, as cow-calf producers sell calves, stocker producers buy stockers and sell feeders and feedlots buy feeder cattle. In order to coordinate cattle markets, feeder cattle prices must simultaneously encourage cow-calf production to ensure avail-

able cattle supplies for the industry while reflecting beef demand back from consumers through fed and feeder cattle prices.

In between, feeder cattle prices determine whether cattle will be produced using relatively more or less forage versus grain in the stocker and feedlot sectors. Feeder markets must reflect production conditions at the cow-calf level which, along with stocker production, depend heavily on forage conditions; and at the same time capture feed market conditions that affect feedlot production; all the while transmitting consumer demand from retail and wholesale beef markets all the way back down to the cow-calf sector.

It is an enormous challenge to coordinate such a complex industry. This coordination uses not one but a constellation of feeder cattle prices across weights ranging from lightweight calves to heavy feeder cattle. The coordination is not only the result of price levels but the relationship between feeder prices across the weight range.

In general, cow-calf producers, with a high proportion of costs that are fixed at least in the short run, respond to calf price level. Calf prices are either high enough or not to encourage more or less calf production. However since cow-calf producers use a relatively fixed forage base that often has no other use than for cattle production, changes in cow-calf production simultaneously imply retained ownership decisions as cow-calf producers consider the best way to market the forage they produce: through more weaned calves or fewer heavier, retained calves.

At the other end of cattle production, feedlots are trying to assess the margins for finishing cattle – driven by heavyweight feeder prices relative to fed cattle prices – along with feed costs to determine whether they

should be adding more or less weight to cattle using grain, in other words, do they want to buy more or less initial pounds of cattle to place and run fewer animals through the feedlot over more days or move heavier animals through the feedlot more quickly.

In the short run, feedlot cost of gain is a major driver of feedlot decisions about what size and how many feeder animals to buy. These feedlot decisions simultaneously provide market signals for stocker producers to assess the potential for adding additional weight to feeder animals prior to entering the feedlot. This potential is reflected in the relationship between prices of lightweight and heavyweight feeder cattle. This relationship, often referred as the “rollback” or price slide across weights, determines the value of gain for stocker production.

Feeder prices simultaneously impact cow-calf, stocker and feedlot production and price adjustments usually reflect impacts and market balance across all sectors. However, occasionally unusual circumstances result in market signals for one sector dominating the others. This helps to understand feeder cattle markets since 2013. The sharp post-drought decrease in beef production in 2014 and 2015 prompted dramatic calf price signals to jump-start cow herd expansion. Hence the unprecedented increase in feeder cattle prices from mid-2013 into 2015. However, this occurred at the expense of feedlots where

high feeder prices resulted in the worst feedlot losses ever in 2015. With herd expansion under way, the dramatic drop in feeder prices in late 2015 realigned feeder to fed prices and a return to more typical margins for feedlots. The result was an increase in feeder prices faster and higher than anyone anticipated in 2013 and 2014 followed by a sharper and quicker drop in prices in 2015 than anyone expected. Nothing this extreme has ever been seen in the cattle industry so no one really understood what was happening except with the benefit of hindsight.

Cattle production is ultimately one production process that is completed in different sectors with different producers in many different places and using different resources. Anything that impacts any of the sectors must ultimately be transmitted and coordinated across all sectors. It is basic supply and demand but so much more complicated than just a question of how much should be produced. Because cattle, as ruminants, are so flexible in production, the question of how to produce cattle, i.e. what resources to use for production is very complex and dynamic as feed markets change. Much of the challenge of coordinating this complex set of production decisions occurs in the set of feeder cattle markets through changing price levels and rather subtle changes in price relationships across weights of feeder cattle.

Feeding Quality Forums set for August in Nebraska and Texas

Ag economy barometer moves higher in June

The Purdue University/CME Group Ag Economy Barometer is a nationwide measure of the health of the U.S. agricultural economy. On the first Tuesday of each month, the Ag Economy Barometer provides a sense of the agricultural economy's health with an index value. The index is based on a survey of 400 agricultural producers on economic sentiment each month. Quarterly, the index will be accompanied by an in-depth survey of 100 agriculture and agribusiness thought leaders.

In June, the Barometer turned higher with an index of 104, which was higher than the six-month base period, which averaged 100 between October 2015 and March 2016. June was also stronger than May's reading of 97. According to the report, June marked the third month in a row that the Ag Economy Barometer was markedly stronger than the nine-month low of 85 set in March 2016. However, the sentiment index during June was still lower than the post-harvest high of 116 set in October 2015.

Huelskamp votes to put the brakes on Obama's EPA by cutting funding

Congressman Tim Huelskamp (KS-01) supported the FY2017 appropriations for the Department of the Interior, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA),

and related agencies. It passed the House 231-196 last Thursday afternoon.

This legislation cuts EPA funding by \$164 million and removes over \$43 million

from the EPA's efforts to enforce burdensome regulations. Most important, this bill includes language requested by Congressman Huelskamp to prohibit the Obama Administration from enforcing the EPA's Waters of the United States (WOTUS) rule and puts a stop to any further efforts on Lesser Prairie Chicken regulation.

Huelskamp issued the following statement:

"The Clean Water Act was never intended to allow Washington to regulate every road ditch, farm pond, prairie pothole, swimming pool, water tank, and rain puddle. And concern over a bird should not be used to suppress our economy. We must rein in the power that is being usurped by the Obama Administration. This follows our legislation the House passed this week to restore the separation of powers that our Founders

prescribed in the Constitution."

The bill also prohibited the EPA from implementing new, expansive, scientifically-questionable greenhouse gas regulations for new and existing power plants.

Congressman Huelskamp rebuked the EPA for their mistreatment of those in rural America: "The EPA has done so much damage to our rural way of life, by attacking my fellow farmers, ranchers, and those in our oil and gas industries that fuel our economy. I am proud to support this legislation to curtail Obama's abuse of executive power."

House sets Feed the Future into statute

On Wednesday, July 6, the House of Representatives set Feed the Future into statute by passing the Global Food Security Act. Feed the Future, designed to reduce global hunger and increase food security, includes partnerships with university researchers, including the Feed the Future Innovation Lab for Collaborative Research on Sorghum and Millet at Kansas State University. While the program is designed to help reduce global hunger and increase food security, the research involved on challenges like drought hardiness and disease resistance may also benefit sorghum farmers in the United States.

The bill also authorized the Emergency Food Security Program, which allows for cash vouchers and regional procurement of international food aid. Legislators assured the legislation will not extend these rules to the Food for Peace program, through which U.S. commodities are sent as food aid to countries in need.

Valley Heights FFA member wins Kansas FFA Job Interview Event

Taylor Doner of the Valley Heights FFA chapter earned first place in the Job Interview Career Development Event (CDE) during the opening ceremony of the 88th annual Kansas FFA State Convention, June 1, 2016, on the Kansas State University campus.

Doner took home the top honor in the CDE, which challenges members to prepare a detailed resume and professional application and to participate in mock interviews. With the win, Doner is eligible to compete in the National Job Interview CDE at the National FFA Convention in fall 2016.

Second place in the job interview CDE went to Allison Dix from the Stockton FFA chapter. John Garrett, Washburn Rural FFA, received third place; Natalie Harris, Chapman FFA, placed fourth; SaRae Roberts, Hillsboro FFA, placed fifth and Anna Anderson-Johnson, Royal Valley FFA, placed sixth.

Leaf Feeding Caterpillars

Several caterpillars have been out feeding on our local plants. They have been found on vegetables as well as our ornamental plants. Caterpillars feeding on vegetables will reduce production and likely will need stopped. Feeding on ornamentals is less damaging but may warrant some reduction.

Numerous tobacco hornworms were feeding on my tomato plants. Missing leaves and their waste product where the first indicators. Looking closer, the tomato stem-colored caterpillars are noticed. Hand removal is easy and immediate. Several insecticides that contain either Bt, spinosad or cyfluthrin or other insecticides may also be used to control most caterpillars.

My four-year-old Quaking Aspen has been a food source for the larvae of the Popular Leafroller Moth.

The larvae feed on the leaves of poplar, birch and willow. Leaves are tied together and eaten. My tree is now defoliated. Deciduous trees can send out new leaves. Recurring defoliation will sap out all of the energy from the tree.

Insects that protect themselves by rolling plant tissue over themselves make treatment more difficult. The first few leaves I saw, I tore open and removed the larvae. I apparently missed some.

If you notice leaves disappearing from walnut trees, it may be walnut caterpillars. Walnut caterpillars attack primarily black walnut, pecan, and several species of hickory trees, but may also attack birch, oak, willow, honey locust, and apple trees. Walnut caterpillars overwinter as pupae underground beneath host trees. In late spring, moths emerge and

deposit egg clusters on lower leaves. By the end of June, newly emerged and gregarious larvae skeletonize leaves. Larger hairy, brick-red larvae consume greater amounts of leaf tissue, and nearly matured gray larvae devour entire leaves, including petioles.

Catalpa sphinx has been found defoliating isolated Catalpa trees. The "catawba worms" are highly prized as fish bait. Established trees should be fine.

Monitor your plants. If you have a concern, give me a call.
