We finished the last full week of October on a soft note, but it looks like the corn, wheat, and soybeans will all finish the month of October higher than where they started. The harvest lows came early for the corn and the soybeans and the strength has continued through the first third of the fall. We have plenty of grain on hand, so supplies are not the least bit of a concern, but we are also contending

with very good demand, which is one of the key elements keeping the markets supported. The other key is that there seems to be money flowing into some commodity markets because they got too cheap. Money flow can only support the market for so long, but for the time being the trends are generally up for the

\$3.67 in the December corn. lot of folks talking about a move up to the \$10.60-\$10.80 in the January contract, since we cleared the \$10.20 resistance for a little bit. As for the wheat, I still don't have much positive to say about the wheat and if we do get some more strength in the corn and beans, I hope the wheat will at least be able to follow along

mind that with such large supplies on hand, if the speculative buying/short covering dries up, there won't be anyone to fill the As the December of 2017 corn nears the \$4.00 level, selling interest will grow and that market will probably have a very hard time clearing that resistance. The same thing applies to the \$10.00 level in the November 2017 soy-beans and the closer the July 2017 KW gets to \$5.00 the more difficult it will be to pass up pricing some

The cattle market had a decent week. The December live cattle contract closed above the 50-day moving average for the first time since mid-August. time since mid-August, which has the chart looking a little better. We still have to see the cash cattle market moving higher every week to

keep the futures moving higher and it remains to be seen if that can happen. The increased volume on the Fed Cattle Exchange is

encouraging. The cattle need less captive supplies and more free markets. The feeder cattle did not

look nearly as good as the live cattle this week and Friday's close was pretty poor. Traders keep looking at the live cattle futures and they aren't seeing much hope, especially when you get past the April contract. Next week will be an important test from a technical stand point. The November feeders need to be able to hold above \$120 for the week and a positive close for the week would be very

encouraging.

Kansas Rural Center Farm & Food Conference to feature NCR-SARE farmer forum

The Kansas Rural Center's 2016 Farm & Food Conference will offer a wealth of information around the theme of transforming our farm and food system to better meet future environmental, economic and social challenges. With three dynamic keynote presentations and over 25 breakout sessions, the conference promises to appeal to a broad spectrum of attendees. The conference will be held at the Four Points Sheraton Hotel in Manhattan on November 18-19, 2016. A complete agenda and registration information can be found at http://kansasruralcenter.org/ conference-2016.

This year's conference includes a track sponsored by North Central Region-Sustainable Agriculture Research & Education (NCR-SARE), titled "The Farmer Forum." This track will SARE-funded highlight farmer research projects. with presentations by eight farmers from across Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska.

The farmers will discuss their research projects, which include creating a depository of local honey bee strains from feral hives; the economics of haying/grazing cover crops; economic analysis of cover crops, soil health and livestock; evaluating the roller crimper for cover crop control; mobile processing units for poultry: growing mushrooms with ag byproducts; and reduced tillage. NCR-SARE staff will also offer a workshop on grant writing for farmers who might be interested in applying for a SARE farmer/rancher grant, or other grant proposal.

Other workshops, presentations, and panel discussions will cover a wide range of topics, offering very practical how-to information for farmers and ranchers, community organizing ideas for civic leaders and engaged citizens, and policy analysis, discussion of issues, and inspiring models of paradigm shift around farming and food systems for all who attend. Plant scientist Ann convenient for farmers, but her vision of agriculture. it can make the plants more vulnerable. For example, if one plant gets a disease, the others are likely to catch it. Weeds are more likely to find a home in spaces that are very similar. As a result, monoculture farming can be dependent on expensive synthetic chemicals to ward off weeds and diseases.

Droughts and other weather events can also damage entire monoculture fields. Bybee-Finley says a bad drought in 2012 shaped

Intercropping gives farmers more options if one of their crops fails. "It's like a diversified stock portfolio," said Bybee-Finley. Plant diversity leads to more diversity below ground too. Plants that add organic matter and nutrients when they decompose replenish the

her experiment, In Bybee-Finley planted four cover crops, which are plants that add fertility to the soil and protect it from

erosion. She planted two grasses, pearl millet and sorghum, and two legumes, cowpea and sunn hemp. The grasses are well known for their ability to add organic matter to tired soils whose nutrients have been depleted by years of farming. Legumes are also good for the soil because their roots release nitrogen when they decompose. These cover crops are also a feed source for cows and other livestock, providing farmers another source of income.

In her experiment, Bybee-Finley found the grasses and legumes that grew at the same pace were more productive because they weren't competing for space and resources as much as plants that grew at different rates. On the other hand, she found that some plant combinations grew more, while others had more nitrogen.

"I'm sure there's a sweet spot," said Bybee-Finley, "There's so many unexplored avenues and questions to ask: Which species should I plant together? And how many of each?

Bybee-Finley said the next step for this experiment is to see which plant combinations were the most nutritious for animals.

For experiments with lots of variables like this one, Bybee-Finley says you end up with a complex set of conclusions. "When you're looking at an entire system it makes it harder to have an immediate take-away," she said. "It takes longer to come up with a definite con-

But Bybee-Finley is com-

fortable with complexity. "Diversity begets diversity," she said. "Agricultural science is beginning to look beyond the simplified strategy of planting only one crop per rotation."

For Bybee-Finley, intercropping is full of tradeoffs, and the life lesson of agriculture is that plants don't always behave the way you expect them to. "The miracle of biology is that plants, no matter what you do, will do exactly what they want to

Your cows may be held in by fences, but there are few limits on where you go or what you can do with the herd. Perceived barriers these days are just untested assumptions where imagination and technology are opening new gates.

Granted, the beef community is not flush with cash as it was a couple of years ago, but markets will emerge from these dark days, still rewarding premium quality, efficiently produced beef.

Your limit could be "knowing" what is not so. Folks in harsh environments often resort to operating herds of "tough" cattle that can take whatever nature dishes out - but also maintain a tough profile when chefs try to create a beef dish for consumers.

Arizona rancher Chuck Backus recently won a national award for challenging conventional wisdom and developing a herd in the high desert that can produce mostly Prime grade beef. Heat synchronization, artificial insemination (AI), genomic testing and good records were his main tools. Feed efficiency is the next target to acquire without backing away from quality. Solely solar powered since the 1970s, the ranch is always weighing new technol-

Genetics have become increasingly predictable, especially within breeds that access millions of data points, bolstered by individual genomic tests. The rest of cattle ranching is about to catch up, starting with high-

tech breeding systems. This year Japan-based Fujitsu unveiled its "Connected Cow" system that uses pedometers and transmitters to determine peak heat and project ideal AI time. Success for one-time breeding has increased from 44% to now 90%, the

"In 2012, we started the planning process to conduct this large-scale dredging project to restore water supply storage at John Redmond," said Director of KWO Tracy Streeter. "This project was vital for the area. The reservoir is a supply source to 19 communities and six industrial users. including Wolf Creek Nuclear Operating Station."

The removal of sediment has helped to ensure an adequate water supply to meet our citizens' demand in the Unfortunately past future. drought has shown the removal of three million vards will not solve all of the problems with the aging reservoir to help restore water

supply storage lost to sedimentation.

'Completion of Phase I dredging operations at John Redmond does not signify 'mission accomplished' in efforts to restore lost water supply storage to satisfy projected demand into the future," Streeter said. "Additional work in the watershed above John Redmond to reduce the sedimentation rate, evaluation of other waters supplies as well as future restoration work to remove sediment within the reservoir is still necessary to ensure future water supply demand is met through the year 2045 in the Neosho River basin.'

More information and details about the project will be shared at the upcoming Governor's Water Conference on November 14-15 in Manhattan, including a panel discussion involving Bryan Taylor, USACE -Tulsa District, Stan Ekren -GLDD and Matt Unruh -KWO Dredging Project manager.

Kansas cattle on feed up 10 percent

Kansas feedlots, with capacities of 1,000 or more head, contained 2.22 million cattle on feed on October 1, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This inventory was up 10 percent from last vear.

Placements during September totaled 420,000 head, up 5 percent from 2015. Fed cattle marketings for the month of September totaled 360,000 head, up 13 percent from last year. Other disappearance during September totaled 10,000 head, unchanged from last year.

USDA issues safety-net payments to Kansas farmers in response to 2015 market downturn

USDA Kansas Farm Service Agency (FSA) executive director, Adrian Polansky announced that many Kansas farms that enrolled in safety-net programs established by the 2014 Farm Bill will receive financial assistance for the 2015 crop year. The programs, known as Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC), are designed to protect against unexpected drops in crop prices or revenues due to market downturns.

"These safety-net programs provide help when price and revenues fall below normal, unlike the previous direct payments program that provided funds even in good years," said Polansky. "These payments will help provide reassurance to Kansas farm

families, who are standing strong against low commodity prices compounded by unfavorable growing condi-

Statewide, about 101,000 farms enrolled in the 2015 ARC-County and PLC programs. Total dollars issued so far to Kansas producers through these contracts is more than \$341 million.

"ARC-County payments can vary county to county because average county yields will differ," said Polansky. "PLC payments are determined nationwide based on the difference between a commodity's market year average price and the USDA-established reference price. This resulted in PLC payment rates per bushel of .09 for corn and .64 for grain sorghum."



There were also sessions on cotton, poultry, specialty crops, specialty livestock, equipment and technology, food processing, pet food, and Unmanned Aerial Systems (That speaker did not drone on...).

In the afternoon were what they called crossover topics. I liked this too, because so many modern issues don't fit in a little box. They transcend commodities and locations. These over-arching sessions included minor little issues (!) like water, consumer awareness and acceptance, workforce, transportation and logistics, barriers to entry, and global opportunities.

The breakout discussions were facilitated by the excellent staff of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, but the best thing is that they were just that: Discussions. They were not boring lectures. Each session had some informative documents for background, but most of the time was spent discussing the issues among ourselves. The department was really looking for ideas. input, dialogue, and prioritization from the Kansas citizens who participated. Ultimately, we suggested action steps in each area. I thought it was extremely well done.

The other summit I attended was a first for K-State: its first-ever ranching

summit. K-State has offered other events such as Cattleman's Day and Beef Stocker Field Day for decades, but this was a first-time event to focus specifically on ranching. It too was quite well done. The purpose of this summit was somewhat different than the ag growth one, beyond the obvious difference that this one was about ranching specifically. This summit was not about gathering public input, it was more about profit for the individual producer.

Speakers included K-State ag economists as well as ranchers and other experts. One thought-provoking comment was about considering profit per acre, not production per cow. Essentially, this speaker's point was that smaller-framed, easier-carrying cows might generate less pounds per animal but net out at more profit per acre.

At the Ag Growth summit, the best comments I heard came from rancher Matt Perrier of Eureka. In the beef breakout session, he noted that Kansas has every segment of the beef industry, from purebred seedstock to cow-calf production to backgrounders to feedyards. He also made a comment that was a fitting and well-deserved compliment to farm and ranch families. It has to do with the skills, work ethic, and independent problem-solving which farm kids have to learn, growing up on a farm or ranch. Matt said, "Besides protein, we raise something else that the world needs: Kids who can think critically."

That was a mountaintop experience for me.
