

USDA reports on farm labor for Northern Plains Region

In the Northern Plains Region (Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota) there were 34,000 workers hired directly by farm operators on farms and ranches during the week of July 10-16, 2016, down 8 percent from the July 2015 reference week, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service.

Worker-numbered 34,000 during the week of October 9-15, 2016, down 15 percent from the October 2015 reference week.

Farm operators in the Northern Plains region paid their hired workers an average wage of \$14.49 per hour during the July 2016 reference week, up 4 percent from the July 2015 reference week. Field workers received an average of \$15.17 per hour, up \$1.51. Livestock workers earned \$12.83 per hour, down 48 cents. The field and livestock worker combined wage rate at \$14.10, was up 60 cents from the 2015 reference week. Hired laborers worked an average of 44.0 hours during the July 2016 reference week, compared with 39.6 hours worked during the July 2015 reference week.

Farm operators paid their hired workers an average wage of \$14.56 per hour during the October 2016 reference week, down 1 percent from the October 2015 reference week. Field workers received an average of \$15.33 per hour, up 74 cents. Livestock workers earned \$12.50 per hour compared with \$13.86 a year earlier. The field and livestock worker combined wage rate, at 14.15, was down 15 cents from the October 2015 reference week. Hired laborers worked an average of 44.8 hours during the October 2016 reference week, compared with 41.0 hours worked during the October 2015 reference week.

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Trump names Pompeo Central Intelligence Agency director

Last week President-elect Donald J. Trump announced Kansas Fourth District Congressman Mike Pompeo as his pick for director of the Central Intelligence Agency.

State party chairman Kelly Arnold, a Wichita native, said, “In choosing Mike Pompeo, President-elect Trump has made a brilliant choice. I have known Mike for years, while he served as Republican National Com-

mitteeman for Kansas, as a Congressman, and working alongside him in his four successful Congressional elections. There are few people with Mike’s background and expertise in intelligence, national defense and foreign policy.”

Mike graduated first in his West Point class of 1986 and served as a cavalry officer. He later graduated from Harvard Law School and was an editor of the Har-

vard Law Review. Before entering politics he was a successful businessman in Wichita. He prevailed in a multi-candidate primary in 2010 and was elected to Congress in 2010, 2012, 2014, and 2016.

National committeeman Mark Kahrs, a Wichita native and long-term supporter, stated “I congratulate Mike Pompeo on his selection as CIA director. Congressman Pompeo’s back-

ground as a top graduate of West Point, service in the United States Army, a Congressional member on the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence and a leading voice in our nation against radical Islam uniquely qualifies him for this important national security post.”

The Republican State Party executive director Clay Barker, a 1984 graduate of West Point, stated “Mike

represents the highest ideals of ‘Duty, Honor, Country’ in his service to the nation.” At this time, Clay claims to have no recollection of ever hazing Mike in the two years they were together at school.

The process for filling the vacancy in the Congressional seat is by special election by all Fourth Congressional District voters. Once there is an official vacancy, the Governor will

announce the date for the special election. There is no primary election; instead each political party picks its candidate by a convention of party members. The Republican Fourth District Convention has 166 members, two from each county in the district, with larger counties, like Sedgwick and Butler, having additional members.

USAID project led by Kansas State University to help develop new sorghum varieties for Haiti

In an effort to address challenges faced by sorghum farmers in Haiti, the U.S. Agency for International Development has awarded Kansas State University \$1.08 million to establish a genomics-assisted sorghum breeding program in the small Caribbean country.

The award, led by the Feed the Future Innovation Lab for Collaborative Research on Sorghum and Millet, will consist of three sub-projects aimed at building the foundation of a breeding program that taps into the latest in technological advances to tackle some of Haiti’s greatest constraints in sorghum production.

“This project is novel and exciting as it begins to assess our abilities to more surgically adapt and develop new sorghum varieties for Haiti,” said lab director Tim Dalton.

The USAID grant, awarded through its Feed the Future initiative, will support the existing program at the CHIBAS Foundation, a bio-energy and sustainable agriculture research center in Haiti. Complementary research also will be conducted at Kansas State University

and Cornell University.

Sorghum is grown widely in Haiti — most commonly as a subsistence crop — with an estimated 200,000 farmers dependent on it as a food and income source.

But as one of the poorest countries in the Western Hemisphere, Haiti faces numerous constraints in establishing a strong breeding program, including a lack of resources, stressful growing environments and limited ability to improve crops in the field or lab.

Dalton said those challenges underscore the importance of genomics-assisted breeding, a process by which scientists choose which plants to crossbreed based on their DNA sequence. Once established, the process can save significant time and resources in developing new varieties that are better adapted to the local stresses and preferences.

“Today, plant breeders are taking existing genetic differences that might have arisen in a farmer’s field in Africa or Asia or in Kansas hundreds or thousands of years ago, identifying which ones might be useful for

breeders in the future, and using standard breeding methods of crossing varieties to each other,” said Geoffrey Morris, Kansas State University assistant professor of agronomy, who was awarded \$201,600 to lead one of the three projects.

Morris said genomics-assisted breeding links a plant’s genes to its desired traits so that breeders can select for those genes from the beginning and develop a superior variety in much less time.

“We’re using the genetics to follow the favorable genes during the breeding process,” he said.

While the award is specific to developing a program in Haiti, the work is part of a broader effort to improve sorghum production in numerous countries around the world through the Feed the Future program. Dalton said those efforts are likely to produce benefits for U.S. agriculture.

“Working in Haiti will provide opportunities to work year-round on important pests like the sugarcane aphid or in droughty and hot climates,” he said. “While the goals focus on strengthening Haiti’s breeding system, the experience and insight will spill over into the U.S. for the benefit of local producers. The tools developed for this project will be useful as we tailor sorghum varieties for our own micro-ecologies ranging from the Carolinas to the Great Plains.”

Feed the Future is the U.S. government’s global hunger and food security initiative. With a focus on smallholder farmers, particularly women, Feed the Future supports partner countries in developing their agriculture sectors to spur economic growth and trade that increase incomes and reduce hunger, poverty and undernutrition.

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Water Vision implementation featured at Governor's Water Conference

Approximately 600 attendees with diverse water interests were encouraged at the Governor's Conference on the Future of Water in Kansas to keep pushing forward with implementation efforts for accomplishing regional priorities within the Long Term Vision for the Future of Water Supply in Kansas to ensure our state's water future.

"On this stage three years ago Governor Brownback issued a call to develop a 50 year vision for the future of water management in Kansas. This call has resulted in more effort the past three years than would seem possible by local, state and federal government, stakeholders and the private sector," said Director of the Kansas Water Office Tracy Streeter.

"Our team was able to share with attendees that 100 percent of the Phase I Actions Items identified in the Vision have been initiated, a great accomplishment no doubt but we must continue to push forward as this Vision is integrated into our existing Water Plan."

The morning featured the "Water Legacy Award" which was presented to Joe

Harkins, former Kansas Water Office director who served in several leadership roles for agencies, including the Kansas Water Office. Among many honorable accomplishments, he was recognized for establishing the original Kansas Water Plan and securing the reservoir water supplies that set the stage for Kansas' efforts contained in the Wa-

ter Vision of protecting and sustaining our reservoirs.

The morning also showed the work of 14 regional advisory committees, comprised of 160 volunteers who created action plans for their region's priority goals, resulting in 64 action plans in total to address critical water issues across the state. Attendees heard from the Blue Ribbon Task Force on Water Management Funding and Education and Community Outreach Working Group for better ways to connect all Kansans to their water and our state's water issues.

"Engagement at the local level is essential for the success of the Vision and the statewide commitment to address our water issues," said Secretary of Agriculture Jackie McClaskey. "It is critical that all Kansans understand the water challenges facing our state and that they feel a connection to the role they play in the future of water in Kansas."

This year's 'Be the Vision' award recipients were also honored for taking extraordinary measures to conserve, reuse or adopt better practices to help ensure the future of our state's water resources. This year's recipients were David Royer with Delaware WRAPS Streambank Stabilization, city of Garden City represented by Fred Jones, Tom Willis, T&O Farms and Spirit AeroSystems.

The rest of the day continued with Tyler Powell, Oklahoma Energy & Environment; David B. La-

France, American Water Works Association, CEO; Denise Hickey, North Texas Municipal Water District, Water Resource Program & Public Education Manager; and an Ogallala Economic Panel, Eli Fenichel, Assistant Professor, Yale School of Forestry & Environmental Studies; Bill Golden Research Assistant Professor, K-State University, Department of Agricultural Economics; Tim James Senior Sustainability Scientist, Arizona State University, Julie Ann Wrigley Global Institute of Sustainability.

Today will build on the Vision implementation and water policy discussions from the previous day with technical presentation posters and talks. Graduate and undergraduate students will present their research. Rob Manes, The Nature Conservancy-Kansas Director will wrap up the conference.

A fun addition to the conference this year was the Water Photo Contest. More than 150 photos were submitted to be voted on as the 'people's choice' at the conference. The winner will be featured on the 2017 brochure, website and other locations throughout the coming year.

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Wheat emerging as fall harvest winds down

For the week ending November 13, 2016, above normal temperatures and mostly dry conditions were experienced statewide, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. There were 6.3 days suitable for fieldwork. Topsoil moisture rated 11 percent very short, 26 short, 60 adequate, and 3 surplus. Subsoil moisture rated 6 percent very short, 23 short, 68 adequate, and 3 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 2 percent very poor, 8 poor,

34 fair, 49 good, and 7 excellent. Winter wheat emerged was 91 percent, near 92 last year and the five-year average of 93.

Soybeans harvested was 94 percent, near 95 last year and 92 average.

Sorghum harvested was 91 percent, near 90 last year, and ahead of 85 average.

Cotton condition rated 1 percent very poor, 2 poor, 28 fair, 64 good, and 5 excellent. Cotton harvested was 35 percent, behind 46 last year and 47 average.

Sunflower harvested was

79 percent, near 81 last year and 80 average.

Livestock, Pasture, and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 1 percent very poor, 5 poor, 28 fair, 56 good, and 10 excellent.

Stock water supplies were 2 percent very short, 10 short, 84 adequate, and 4 surplus.

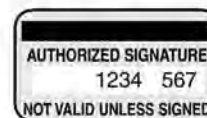

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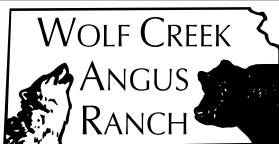

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Crop Pest Management School to be held December 8 in Smith Center

Disease and insect management always seems to be a challenge for producers in their cropping enterprises. The management of these concerns are critical for the producer to be able to produce a profitable and productive crop.

Post Rock Extension District is sponsoring a regional Crop Pest Management School at the St Mary's Catholic Parish Hall in Smith Center on Thursday, December 8 to aid producers in identifying and managing these disease and insect problems. We will be offering CEU's with seven hours for the 1A certification along with the one core hour needed for renewal. CCA credits will also be available for

National Institute of Food and Agriculture grant provides training, networking opportunities for rural veterinarians in Kansas, region

Researchers from the Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine have received a nearly quarter-million dollar federal grant to improve rural veterinarians' awareness of endemic, transboundary, and emerging diseases of production animals.

The \$239,656 grant from the National Institute of Food and Agriculture is going to a Kansas State University-based team headed by Brad White, professor of production medicine and interim director of the Beef Cattle Institute. Co-project directors are Juergen Richt, regents distinguished professor and director of the Center of Excellence for Emerging and Zoonotic Animal Diseases, and Derek Mosier, profes-

sor of veterinary pathology. The team will use the grant to conduct organized workshops and create on-line modules that enhance education and career development for rural veterinarians who work with production animals — livestock raised for food. Another goal of the grant is to enhance career opportunities for rural production animal veterinarians. According to the research team, production animal medicine plays a crucial role in rural communities, yet many areas may be underserved because they lack access to local veterinary services. Rural veterinarians can be the first line of defense against high-consequence emerging, zoonotic and trans-

boundary animal diseases — such as foot-and-mouth disease, classical swine fever, African swine fever and avian flu — that could cripple the production animal economy. The workshops will be in Manhattan and the online modules will be accessible to rural production animal veterinarians and to anyone who has an interest in the topics. By providing resources and information to rural production animal veterinarians, the Kansas State University team also hopes to draw attention to the vital role production animal veterinarians play in the assurance of food safety and food security, the protection of animal and environmental resources, and the economic viability

of production animal agriculture. "The collaborative grant will allow us to work closely with veterinarians to utilize decision tools and new information to decrease the potential impacts of cattle diseases," White said. "This program will enable researchers to fill a gap in the ability of rural veterinarians to recognize and respond to emerging zoonotic and transboundary animal diseases, which are a constant threat to U.S. agricultural systems," Richt said. The economic consequences of an outbreak of a high-impact disease would be devastating, according to the researchers. Various models have been created to estimate the impact of

an outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the U.S. Estimates for economic loss vary from \$2.7 billion to \$4 billion per year depending on intensity, severity and duration of the outbreak, with lesser estimates for regional outbreaks. A recent example is the 2015 outbreak of avian flu in the Midwestern states. The control and eradication of the highly virulent avian influenza virus — HTN2 and HTN8 — for domestic poultry and turkey populations was estimated to have cost \$4 billion. The Kansas State University project will integrate training opportunities for

production animal veterinarians, teaching them how to efficiently provide additional services to food animal clients and to expand their role as first responders while receiving financial compensation for the time involved. The workshops and training modules also teach management of low-incidence, but high-consequence diseases of production animals, and also high-incidence but low-consequence diseases. Both high- and low-incidence diseases are of critical importance for the long-term success of rural veterinary practices, according to the researchers.

Pilgrims and soil: what's the connection? Harvest truly cause for celebration

Imagine arriving in a new land only to discover your food supply plans have fallen through. Our modern Thanksgiving celebration, often sourced from grocers and accessorized with store-bought decor, is missing these "dirty" details. The Soil Science Society of America (SSSA) November 15 Soils Matter blog post explains farming challenges the Pilgrims faced, and their survival thanks to help from the Wampanoag Native Americans.

The early immigrants found unfamiliar conditions in their new setting:

They had few farming skills;

The soil was shallow, sandy, and stony;

They did not have draft animals to help cultivate the soil;

The soils were quick to

dry out, had few nutrients, and little organic matter.

"For those first Pilgrims, getting to that bountiful harvest was a huge feat," says blog author Tom Sauer, USDA-ARS. "They wisely accepted the guidance of the Wampanoag...to supplement their lack of knowledge and skills in vegetable and crop production."

USDA resumes incentives to grow the bioeconomy and improve forest health

USDA announced that \$1.5 million will be available in fiscal year 2017 for farmers and foresters who harvest and deliver biomass for renewable energy. The funds are from the Biomass Crop Assistance Program (BCAP), which was reauthorized by the 2014 Farm Bill.

In fiscal year 2017, there is \$3 million total available for BCAP, half of which is for harvesting and delivering forest or agricultural residues to a USDA-approved energy facility. BCAP also provides financial assistance to farmers and ranchers who establish and maintain new crops of biomass for energy or biobased products; additional information on the resumption of those funds will be announced at a later date.

Facilities seeking to be qualified by USDA to accept BCAP-funded biomass can begin enrollment Nov. 14 through Dec. 5, 2016. Also, between Jan. 9, 2017, through March 15, 2017, USDA will accept applications from foresters and farmers seeking incentives to remove biomass residues from fields or national forests for delivery to energy generation facilities. The retrieval payments are provided at match of \$1 for \$1, up to \$20 per dry ton. Eligible crops include corn residue, orchard waste or diseased or insect-infested wood materials.

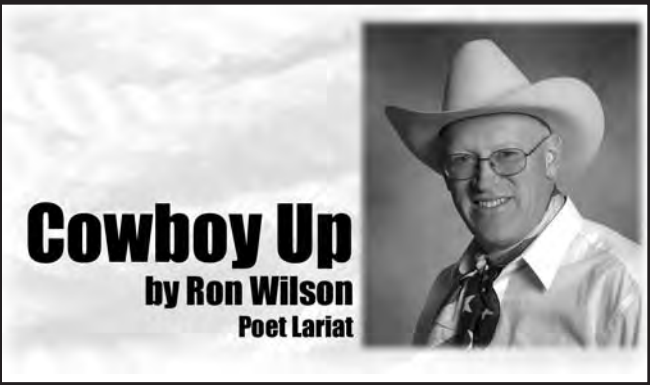

Flashbacks

Flashbacks: City streets flooded with kids in blue and gold jackets. Proud parents. Awestruck green-hands (trying to act cool). Nervous contestants. Wise ag teachers. These are memories I have of going to the National FFA Convention in Kan-

sas City. Those elements have been part of the National FFA Convention for decades. It began in Kansas City when a group of agriculture teachers and their students came together during the American Royal Livestock and Horse Show for a National Congress of Vocational Agriculture Students. In the fall of 1928, thirty-three of those students from 18 states met at the Baltimore Hotel in downtown Kansas City to form the Future Farmers of America. The fledgling organization spread throughout the nation. My dad was a charter member of FFA. He went

on to be a vo-ag teacher and FFA adviser before working for USDA and then becoming a full-time farmer. When I got to high school, I enrolled in ag class and joined FFA as had my brothers before me. How exciting when I got my first blue corduroy FFA jacket with the gold lettering! As first-year students, we were taken by our adviser on a trip to Kansas City for National FFA Convention. The convention sessions took place in big old Municipal Auditorium downtown. Surely more than one farmboy (besides me) marveled at the cavernous old building and said to himself, "You could stack a lot of hay in this place." But then the sessions began. We enjoyed the national FFA officers and the excitement

of the convention. The speakers were amazing and inspiring. A few years later, I myself would be blessed to come through the ranks and serve as a state and national officer. It was the experience of a lifetime. Our national officer team included guys from Wyoming, Alabama, Kansas, Ohio, Indiana and Texas. In seeking to represent the FFA organization as well as we could, we learned and grew in the process. FFA grew and diversified through the years. Agricultural education expanded to include studies in agribusiness, agriscience, and related industries beyond farming itself. In 1988, Future Farmers of America was renamed the National FFA Organization to reflect

the broad agricultural careers which it supported. The convention itself outgrew the facilities in Kansas City and in 1999, the convention moved to Louisville, Kentucky. A few years ago, the organization used "Blue Jackets, Gold Standards" as a convention theme. That inspired the following poem. Fast-forward to 2016. An email reminded me that it had been 40 years (unbelievable!) since we served as national officers. We decided to get together for a reunion. Somewhat to my surprise, all six of us officers were able to make it back for the convention, now held in Indianapolis. It was great to see the guys again. I'm sure the stories we told and retold only got better with time. In recent years, the convention has alternated between Louisville and Indianapolis. 2016 marked the 89th national convention. This leads to a question: What if the National FFA Convention was brought back to Kansas City for the 100th year? Wouldn't it be great to have FFA back in its birthplace for the centennial celebration? What transport, lodging and meeting facilities would be needed for Kansas City to host the convention again? Maybe these flashbacks could come full circle.
