# Pork's six-year growth is the fastest in foodservice

est-growing protein in foodservice since 2011, according to Technomic, Inc.'s 2017 Volumetric Assessment of Pork in Foodservice. Over the past six years, pork use has grown on a pound basis by more than double chicken, which is the next fastest growing protein. Pork use increased by 1.145 billion pounds, while chicken use grew by 515 million pounds.

On a percentage basis, pork grew three times the rate of turkey, which is the next fastest-growing protein,

Pork has been the fast- at 3.6 percent versus 1.2 percent. During this same time period, pork represents 61 percent of all protein growth in the foodservice industry (1.145 billion pounds of a total growth of 1.867 billion pounds).

The pork category continues to increase in foodservice, with a growth rate of 0.8 percent from 2015 to 2017. Totaling 5.9 billion pounds, the growth reflects a volume increase of 114 million pounds over the 2013 to 2015 period.

Processed pork continues to be a strong performer in foodservice, making up the majority of total volume. The five largest categories driving pork category growth are bacon, processed ham, breakfast sausage, ribs and pepperoni. Collectively, the categories represent 66 percent of the total volume. The love of bacon shows no signs of slowing and represents the largest share of volume, at 20 percent, or 1.2 billion pounds, growing 4 percent since 2015.

"We are pleased to see continued growth of pork use in foodservice," said National Pork Board President Jan Archer, Goldsboro, North Carolina. "The volumetric study shows that pork continues to be a strong performer in the foodservice

ue-added pork products such as ham, bacon and sausage."

As consumers demand more interesting flavor profiles and global cuisine, there has been an increase in authentic fresh pork applications. Since 2015, carnitas showed a compound annual growth rate of 5 percent and porchetta had a 15 percent increase. Notable growth in fresh pork also was seen in belly, chops and ground pork.

"Fresh pork presents a huge opportunity in foodservice by offering a range of cuts and applications to deliver a variety of authentic and innovative dishes. Also, fresh pork's value has never been better," Archer said. "Fresh pork allows the foodservice industry to deliver what consumers want while turning strong profits.

"Over the past two years, limited-service and full-service restaurants represented the largest user groups of pork in foodservice, accounting for 67 percent of all pork volume. The growth in limited-service restaurants has been mainly driven by the all-day breakfast additions by major chains.

In categories where both uncooked and pre-cooked forms exist, pre-cooked pork has grown at a faster rate over the past two years, respectively growing at 4.7 industry, underscoring pork's percent and 0.9 percent. This porkfoodservice.org. popularity specifically in val- growth can be attributed to

packer/processor innovation and an ability to deliver quality pre-cooked products that address the labor challenges many operators face.

On an overall basis, the usage of pork is evenly split among the three main dayparts, with snacking representing a small share of volume, which is consistent with the 2013 and 2015 Volumetric Study findings. However, lunch has taken one share point away from dinner overall since 2015. This can be attributed to the extension of breakfast menu items to other dayparts, with lunch being the key beneficiary of all-day breakfast. In addition, slowing traffic in the dinner daypart, especially among Full Service Restaurants, is

"Pork continues to deliver on key criteria for both foodservice and consumers," Archer said. # Wheat Tour releases assessment of 2017 crop

**Communications** "It's too early to tell," was the theme of day 1 of the 2017 Wheat Quality Council's Hard Winter Wheat Tour across Kansas.

About 70 scouts left Manhattan early Tuesday morning, May 2, and made their way east to west across the state, ending up in Colby by evening. The average yield for the day between 18 cars and 222 stops was 43 bushels per acre. This was down from 47.1 bushels per acre over the same area last year.

Wheat looked good early in the day, with adequate moisture and very little disease pressure or damage.

But as the cars made their way into central Kansas, participants started seeing some of the effects of the April 22-23 and April 27 freezes that affected a big portion of the middle of

These freeze events have been overshadowed in the news by a blizzard that affected the western third of the state over the weekend of April 29 through May 1.

However, the freezes may cause significant damage in many areas because the crop was in boot and early heading stages at the time. The extent of that damage doesn't fully show until a week to ten days following the event. Scouts reported that more than half of the wheat they saw on day 1 was in the boot stage and 39% was headed. According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service, as of April 30, 44% of the wheat was headed statewide.

Wheat tour scouts also noted some disease pressure in central parts of the state, including stripe rust, which is a devastating fungal disease.

Kansas Wheat CEO Justin Gilpin recommends that farmers invest in fungicides to control the rust issues. "Some wheat across the state, especially later maturity and wheat after soybeans, has good yield potential. I'd encourage farmers to work with their crop consultants and consider applying a fungicide," he said.

Throughout the state, tour participants noted a lot of mud, but as the groups headed farther west, they ran into fields with snow cover, beginning around Norton and Graham counties. They noted additional disease pressure - most significantly Wheat Streak Mosaic Virus, barley yellow dwarf virus, leaf rust and stripe rust - and also noticed some nitrogen deficiency, and some aphids, as evidenced by beneficial

The weight of the weekend's heavy snow laid the wheat over on its side, which is something the wheat can likely recover from - if the stems aren't broken. With snow still covering many of the fields, it's too early to estimate what percentage of the plants have irreparable damage.

This loss of a portion of the crop comes at a tough time for wheat farmers. The ag economy is not faring well, and bushels are a necessity to offset low prices. A weather-related crop disaster forces these Kansas food producers to rely on the strong farm safety net that is provided by crop insurance in the farm bill.

Farmers should note that if their wheat crop was affected by any of the freeze or snow events, it's critical to notify their crop insurance agent as soon as possible, even if you aren't able to fully evaluate its true damage or recovery poten-

#### Day 2: Western Kansas hit with one-two punch, WSMV and snow

"The world has a del-uge of wheat," said Walter VM Filho, of Serra Morena Corretora, an import/export company in São Paulo, Brazil. "Everyone has it, but America has the best baking wheat. That's something that people need to realize.

The wheat tour is not only about evaluating the wheat throughout the state, but also about developing relationships with other participants. Mr. VM Filho has been on the tour many times and continues to come back, not only to learn about the quality of the current crop, but also to strengthen business relationships with friends and colleagues.

Day two of the 2017 Wheat Quality Council's Hard Winter Wheat Tour across Kansas started off slowly, as scouts weren't able to evaluate many of the fields in the western third of the state.

About 70 scouts left Colby early Wednesday morning, May 3, and made their way south and east across the state, ending up in Wichita by evening. The average yield for the day between 18 cars and 205 stops was 46.9 bushels per acre. This was down from 49.3 bushels per acre over the same area last year.

Even before winter storm Ursa crippled the western third of the state over this past weekend, the wheat was struggling. Wheat Streak Mosaic Virus (WSMV) had already moved into the area, spread by the wheat curl mite, which uses volunteer wheat as a green

bridge to move into newly emerging wheat. Because of the economy, there wasn't as much money for controlling volunteer wheat last fall.

According to K-State agronomy specialist Jeanne Falk-Jones, "We had plenty of green bridges, and that's because there wasn't a lot of money in wheat budgets last year, so when it comes to paying to control volunteer wheat, there wasn't as much of that."

Weather conditions started off with adequate moisture in the fall, but went downhill after the beginning of October, so there were poor stands in many fields.

"WSMV was really bad in the western two tiers of counties," said Kansas Wheat's Aaron Harries. VP of Research and Operations. "That's a big problem this year, and it's probably going to have a lot more impact on yield than the snow damage even would, so that's a serious concern there.'

At this point in the year, there's nothing producers

can do for WSMV.
"They're just at the mercy of the disease, and we'll have to wait and see how much it cuts back on yield," said Harries. "In some cases we've heard of some fields being destroyed because the insurance has already zeroed out those

It's about controlling the volunteer wheat in the fall.

"From a research stand-point, the Kansas Wheat Commission is putting some big funding into projects with Kansas State University to develop genetic resistance, and there is some good new genetic resistance out there. It's just going to take a couple more years to get that crossed into the varieties that exist in the marketplace. But there is some help coming from the genetic standpoint," said Harries.

But that isn't completely accounted for in the day two's yield estimates.

Harries said, "Wheat in south central Kansas really looks good. There's obviously plenty of moisture. Most the fields we stopped in today were pretty clean. Yields might not be quite as high just because some of the stands are a little thinner. We did stop at some fields that are projected to be above 70 bushels an acre, so there's pretty good potential here. The one thing we're having trouble determining is freeze damage. It seems that we're still a little bit early to see the impact of that freeze about a week

He says the biggest disease issue in south central Kansas was barley yellow dwarf and some reports of rust.

"I've heard some reports of some rust, but it looks like folks have been pretty

think you might have any damage in your fields. "You certainly need to get on the book with your insurance agent. Get on the phone and put them on alert. Schedule a time for them to come out and look and assess things. Don't wait for two weeks to see what happens. The insurance agent may take some time to get out there, but give them a call and at least get on their calendars, so you don't get moved to the back of the line. Because there's going

releases final projection The 2017 Wheat Quality Council's Hard Winter Wheat Tour across Kansas wrapped up on May 4, as scouts traveled from Wichita to Manhattan.

The three-day average over the fields that were calculated was 46.1 bushels an acre. While an estimated 7.4 million acres of wheat were planted in the fall, tour participants saw many areas where disease, damage from snow and freeze damage may eliminate those fields. This was accounted for in the final estimates.

The official tour projection for total production numbers of hard red winter wheat to be harvested in Kansas is 281,707,913 bushels. If realized, this would be 185 million bushels less than last year's crop. This number is calculated based on the average of estimated predictions from tour participants who gathered information from 469 fields across the state. The number of stops was down significantly from 655 fields during the 2016 tour. This was due primarily to snow cover in the western third of the state, where tour scouts weren't able to take calculations.

"The tour provides a formula for us to use and a component of that formula is row space and height of wheat plant and being able to count the number of stalks or heads in one foot," said Kansas Wheat's Aaron Harries, VP of Research and Operations. "In the area where snow had flattened the wheat, we're just not able to do that. So, it was our decision not to try to estimate yields on those fields. Rather, we would just look at them and take notes. There's no way we can possibly accurately determine a yield. We'd only be guessing, so we just aren't including those fields in the average we're doing for western Kansas. We're able to find some fields where we can determine those things, and we're using those fields as part of our average.

The Hard Winter Wheat tour is sponsored by the Wheat Quality Council. This year's tour hosted 70 participants from five countries and 24 states in 18 vehicles while traveling across the state on six routes. While winter storm Ursa crippled the western third of the state over this past weekend, there was no way to delay the tour. Instead, tour participants made any possible observations as a snapshot in time, but the industry will continue to watch what happens in central parts of the state with potential freeze damage and how the wheat responds once the snow in western Kansas melts.

Once they get their belly full, a new problem arises. How do they get back down on the ground to take a snooze? They try lots of different ways to make their legs bend but nothing seems to work except simply flopping over and making a hard landing. But that's good enough to get down and sleep. That's okay for now but they'll soon master bending their front legs and lowering themselves gracefully to the ground.

It is generally accepted that a newborn foal can absorb more information shortly after birth than at any other time of its life. So right after birth is the ideal time to get started imprinting the foal. Imprinting is most effective if started within 24 hours of birth but start the process as soon as you are able. If a foal is born in a pasture or on the range,

you may not be able to start within 24 hours so begin when you first find the foal. Later is better than never.

Imprinting is considered the most common method of de-sensitizing a foal to the various stimuli it will encounter as a result of the training imposed upon it by its human handlers.

You should first reassure the mother that you mean no harm. Do this by approaching slowly and talking in a soft voice. Rub the mare a few times before lowering yourself to the foal. Do not let the foal scramble away. It's important to not allow the foal to leave. Restrain it if you have to. You don't want it to learn it can escape. Be gentle but hold it in place to show that you are the boss and that you will not harm it. Gentle rubs will assure the foal and, hopefullv. it will relax.

Desensitize means just that. Get it used to your presence by starting to slow-

Remember, a new foal has a short attention span and lessons should be kept brief and non-stressful. Make the entire process pleasant for you and the foal. Keep it soft and easy and be sure before you end the session that the foal is relaxed and has no fear of your presence. When you leave the foal it must be as friends so it will not fear you during the next session.


Dr. Robert Miller, DVM has a reputation for proper imprinting and has over 40 years experience imprinting foals. Miller emphasizes that what a foal learns during the imprinting period will stay with it for life. This means if a strongwilled flighty horse is taught to react negatively rather than positively during imprinting, it often will react that way for the rest of its

An example is if you are working on a foal's ear to desensitize it and the process is stopped when the animal ierks its head away, the foal will learn to jerk its head away whenever that ear is handled.

So it is imperative that while desensitizing you maintain positive control in order to not cause negative reactions. Should a negative reaction occur vou must resolve it the way you would like the foal to react in order to not cause any negative lifelong reactions.

Remember to make imprint sessions short and positive and always leave the baby as friends.

# Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

We had an exceptionally wild week in the agricultural markets last week. The most amazing of the markets was the cattle, and particularly the live cattle. We saw many limit moves in the futures, both up and down, but most impressive was the jump in the cash cattle market to as high as \$147. The weekly average from USDA will most likely be in the vicinity of \$145, which is about \$10 above the weekly high in the June live cattle and about \$17 above where the June live cattle finished the week. So, for a moment on Thursday morning we made some progress on converging the cash cattle market and the June futures, but by Friday afternoon we are right back to needing either the cash market to drop, the futures to rise, or some of

prised to see some corrective activity in the cash cattle market since we have seen such a huge jump in a short period of time. However. I don't see any concrete evidence that the bull market has run its course. The live cattle futures are behaving much differently than "normal" and we are setting records for bull spreading on a regular basis. Even in bullish years we don't see bull spreading like this. USDA has been telling us how big the 3rd and 4th quarter beef production is going to be for a very long time, which set a very, very bearish tone to the market. However, the speed at which packers are pulling cattle forward and the speed at which carcass weights have dropped tells us that demand for beef right now is tremendous and the actual beef production for later in the year will not be nearly as high as expected. What this tells us is that the deferred live cattle futures are tremendously undervalued. We are either going to see a huge swing back down in the spread trade, or we are going see big gains in the

move through the year. My bet right now is that we will see the big gains in the deferred futures and that we will not see cash cattle trade below \$100 in the fall as the

futures once suggested. In the short run I would look for the June live cattle to pull back to the \$122 -\$124.50 area and then proceed to make new highs. As for the August feeders, that market will find support between \$150 and \$152.50, and that market will also move to new highs eventually.

The grain markets were

not short of volatility thanks to inclement weather from eastern Colorado to the eastern Corn Belt. The July KW nearly reached limit higher last Monday due to freeze and snow damage. but as is often the case with freeze rallies, it was short lived. The market did find support at the upper end of the chart gap we left last Sunday night, so perhaps we have seen enough pressure for the time being, but the better support in the market lies between \$4.35 and \$4.39 ½. We will not know the extent of the damage in western Kansas for quite a while, but most likely the damage was worse than the Wheat Quality Council's tour suggested.

The corn got support from the wheat and from potential planting delays and the need for replanting. However, the July corn still can't make it through \$3.80 and the December contract still can't clear \$3.96. Until that happens, we won't see much more short covering. It will take a long time to assess what problems the

heavy rains and flooding did, but it probably won't help the corn reach a trend line yield.

yields, Wednesday we will find out what USDA is using for a trend line yield. Most likely it will be about 170 bu/ ac. We will see all of the new crop supply and demand estimates, so the report will most likely have a lot of market moving information. Plan on very bearish numbers for the soybeans and less bearish, but not quite bullish numbers for the



# Being a vegetarian won't make you live longer

A new study in New South Wales, Australia, suggests vegetarian diets won't prolong life. According to the study. researchers who tracked nearly a quarter-million adults aged 45 and older found no significant differences in the likelihood of dying between those who followed a complete, semi or pesco vegetarian diet.

University of Alberta's Timothy Caulfield, a Canadian research chair in health law and policy, told the National Post that the study fits with an emerging body of evidence that vegetarian diets don't reduce the risk of premature death.

When you are tired or hungry, you're not as productive. You may need to rest or eat. If you push your-

self too far, you may get ill. Soil gets tired and hungry, too. How do growers know that? When the fields are not as productive. Maybe yields are down, or diseases infect the plants. The soil can become too compact. It can lack nutrients needed to grow good crops. It may be more prone to erosion or have other physical prob-

Leaving a field fallow, or resting it, means the field is empty for a season or more. The field does not provide income for the grower but the continued fertilization, or feeding, is expensive. A bare field also runs the risk of erosion.

Conservation agriculture uses alternative methods to fallow and fertilization to revive soil while still nurturing the overall environment. Just like a doctor prescribes different treatments for different patients, scientists often recommend different methods for returning soil to health, depending on the soil's characteristics.

Lars Munkholm and research teammates at Aarhus University studied the impact of conservation agriculture techniques over a span of 11 years on two different

farms. They combined the use of these techniques: creating very little soil disturbance (no-till or re-

duced tillage), ensuring permanent or-ganic soil cover (residues

and cover crops), and diversifying the crops grown on the farmland (crop

The fields they studied are in Denmark, and have sandy loam soils. An ideal soil for farming is usually a type of loam, with a good mixture of sand, silt, and clay particles. But sandy loam soils have less clay to hold the soil together. "Very few Danish soils

have greater than 15% clay in the topsoil," Munkholm observes. "The clay content varied a bit at both farm sites, which significantly af-

fected a range of soil properties. The studied soils were probably too sandy as compared to the 'ideal' situation even though they are

very productive."
The typical Danish farmer needs to successfully grow food and feed on these soils, making this study important for the nation's agribusiness industry

A further challenge for Danish farmers with regard to no-till or reduced till is the humid environment. "Denmark is located in a cool and humid climate where soil compaction is a major problem," says Munk-holm. "Intensive soil loosening is typically needed to aerate the soil and stimulate drying of the surface soil. However, there is a steadily increasing interest

in reduced tillage and no

tillage in Denmark."

Typical small grain cereals such as wheat, barley, and oats were the dominant crops in the study. The team rotated these crops with rapeseed and peas. Rapeseed is an oil crop, providing income for the growers. Peas, as part of the legume family, can use nitrogen in the air as "food" and in-crease the amount of nitro-gen available in the soil. This often reduces the need for chemical fertilizers. Researchers also used fodder radish as a winter cover crop. Their large, deep tap-roots help break up com-pacted soil.

This study found that in fields with less tillage, leaving crop residue on the soil was a good solution. In addition, growing permanent cover crops kept roots growing in the soil. This broke up soil clumps and made room for air and water. It also created a beneficial environment for soil microbes, fungi, and other organisms such as earthworms and ants.

Munkholm's team looks forward to studying the effects of conservation agriculture techniques for a longer period. "It takes time before changes in crop rotation, residue management, and cover cropping are fully developed in the soil," says Munkholm.





Genetics providers contribute 25% of prize value in credit if their nominee wins Grand or Reserve Champion pen, and CAB pays the rest.

Qualifying groups of 30 or more must be at least 75%sired by registered Angus bulls, harvested by July 31st at a CAB-licensed packer and close-outs submitted by August 15th, or they fit into the next year's contest. Scoring is based on a combination of carcass merit and feedyard performance. Nominators of at least five entries can form a division with winnings noted, and of course those nominators can add their own incentives.

# New NAHMS survey to measure antibiotic use, stewardship

Starting in May, the USDA's National Animal Health Monitoring System (NAHMS) began asking pig farmers who have at least 1,000 pigs and farm in any of the top 13 pork-producing states about their on-farm antimicrobial use and their related stewardship practices. Those states include Colorado, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania and South Dakota.

Specifically, the NAHMS Antimicrobial Use on U.S. Swine Operations 2017 study

Describe antimicrobial-use practices in feed and water on production sites.

bial-use practices in place before implementation of FDA policy changes (prior to 2017), which can be used for evaluating trends over time.

Describe antimicrobial stewardship practices on production sites with weaned market pigs or swine nursery and grower-finisher facilities.

"As an industry, we welcome this latest effort by USDA to get accurate information to the public about how America's pig farmers actually use antibiotics," said Jan Archer, National Pork Board president and a pig farmer in Goldsboro, North Carolina. "We've been good stewards of antibiotics over the years by working with our veterinarian partners and by following guidelines, such as those in the Pork Quality Assurance® Plus certification program. Also, this survey will provide benchmark data that can help our industry as we

continuous improvement."

The National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will contact producers in the 13 states who have at least 1,000 pigs to ask for their participation in the study. Later this summer, those who agree to participate will meet with a veterinarian from the USDA Animal Plant Health Inspection Service, who will conduct the survey. Importantly, the NAHMS study will protect participants' privacy by not revealing names or contact information associated with individual data.

"The industry stands to gain with reliable information and improved transparency to consumers and others about how we use antibiotics on our farms," Archer said. "There's too much misinformation out there today, and we see this as a way to provide a more accurate picture of how we are doing the right thing on our farms every day.'

# April rains affect May forages; alfalfa turns yellow in wet fields

green to yellow may mean too much water. Farmers see the change after record-setting rains.

Waterlogged soil kills nitrogen-fixing bacteria on roots, says Craig Roberts. The University of Missouri Extension specialist alerted area specialists of the problems. There are fixes.

We learned about waterlogged forages in the Great Flood of 1993," Roberts said in a teleconference.

Flooded crops in river and creek bottoms aren't the only problem, Roberts said. Hilltop soils become water-logged also.

Excess water cuts oxygen in the soil. It also kills soil microbes, hurting plant

An early unexpected sign may be alfalfa turning yellow. That's a sign of nitrogen

alfalfa makes its own nitrogen. Why does the legume need nitrogen?

Too much water drowns the rhizobium microbes on alfalfa roots. They are the bacteria taking oxygen from the air to feed the plant.

In the previous big flood, Roberts came up with a way to re-inoculate the fields.

Before planting legumes, farmers coat seeds with fresh inoculum. That carries the microbes into the soil.

Roberts' cure is to treat orchardgrass seed with the inoculum. Then drill grass into the thinning stand of alfalfa. A normal practice is to drill grass seed into the thinning alfalfa stands. This boosts hay yields.

By treating the grass seed, inoculum re-enters the soil. Bacteria broadcast on top of the soil won't survive, Roberts warns.

root nodules regrow. The alfalfa will flourish.

Fresh alfalfa seed cannot be seeded into an old stand. As a defense, existing alfalfa kills the new seedlings.

As a first step, Roberts says, "Check the roots on yellowing alfalfa." Likely there will be a lack of robust nodules.

The inoculation of orchardgrass seed does two things, he said. It adds grass to the hay crop. But the inoculum preserves the alfalfa.

It's a wild idea, but it should work, Roberts said.

State specialists warned against working wet fields before they dry. Wet tracks add soil compaction. That also limits oxygen in the

Farmers with flooding problems can seek help from regional specialists through their county agent.

# Workshop discusses national bio-surveillance system for U.S. swine industry

In April the Institute for Animal and Plant Health In-Infectious Animal Diseases, a Department of Homeland Security Center of Excellence, along with the National Pork Board (NPB) and the Swine Health Information Center (SHIC), hosted a workshop to discuss the development of a national bio-surveillance system for the U.S. swine industry. The meeting, which also received sponsorship from the DHS Science and Technology Directorate, aimed to foster a focused, interactive discussion between the industry representatives and state and federal animal health officials in attendance. Through interactive discussions, participants were asked to build upon previous and current industry and government efforts in identifying and developing a road map to address gaps for a workable, credible, affordable and robust nationally coordinated bio-surveillance system to meet commerce and trade needs for the U.S. swine in-

The meeting was designed as a way to look forward to what the industry needs. The United States Department of Agriculture,

dustry.

spection Service currently has regulatory surveillance programs (pseudorabies, brucellosis and classical swine fever), monitors for influenza and vesicular diseases and is in the process of evaluating the parameters to develop a comprehensive U.S. swine surveillance program. Additionally, the U.S. pork industry daily actively monitors for swine diseases in a continual effort to protect the health and welfare of the country's swine herd.

There was a significant consensus among the industry stakeholders participating in the workshop regarding the attributes of an optimal risk-based comprehensive disease preparedness system and that a modern robust national bio-surveillance system is a vital component. Those preparedness attributes include: allowing granular, access-controlled information sharing to protect data; leveraging easy-tocollect, aggregate samples (i.e. oral fluids) collected by trained production personnel on farm for testing; using triggers to automatically identify anomalies for further investigation; and utilizing standardized, elec-

tronic, real-time data capture for movements, premises production, slaughter, and veterinary diagnostic laboratory information. Priority actions to develop the identified needed surveillance system were also articulated and included, among others, validation of an oral-fluids-based diagnostic assay for priority FADs and establishing a network of producers, state animal health officials and National Animal Health Laboratory Network laboratories in core pork producing states to work together on key gaps and opportunities.

Steve Brier, a member of the NPB Swine Health Committee, presented industry views at the workshop and said that a "nationally coordinated bio-surveillance system is an industry-identified priority to improve capacity to prepare, detect and rapidly respond to regulatory FADs, emerging and re-emerging diseases, as well as contribute to successful implementation of the Secure Pork Supply Plan to facilitate business continuity in the face of high consequence disease outbreaks."

Among all participants

there was a commitment to timely forward progress. "Though we have a good consensus among our stakeholders, we have to work on these action items with a sense of urgency - including developing a timeline for completion of activities," said Paul Sundberg, DVM, Ph.D., DACVPM, SHIC executive director.

Swine health and food safety is of paramount importance - the industry has more than 60,000 pork producers who annually market more than 110 million hogs, equals total gross receipts of \$23.4 billion, supports 550,000 jobs and contributes \$39 billion to the U.S. Gross Domestic Product. With record industry expansion in recent years, pork production exports have risen to more than 26% of U.S. production - a number that is expected to continue to increase. With an ever-expanding industry, diseases that can disrupt trade and commerce are of increasing concern, making adapting the nation's current surveillance system to keep up with the industry's needs and speed of commerce of utmost importance.

Secretary Sonny Perdue announced recently that the first shipment of fresh U.S. beef has arrived in Brazil following a 13-year hiatus. The entrance of American beef into the Brazilian market ushers in promising longterm economic opportunity for U.S. beef producers.

"With Brazil's large market reopened to the United States, U.S. beef exports are poised for new growth. I look forward to Brazilians getting the opportunity to eat delicious American beef, because once they taste it, they'll want more of it." said Perdue.

Brazil closed its market to imports of U.S. fresh beef in 2003 over concerns about bovine spongiform enceph-

alopathy (BSE). Since then, the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) and Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) have worked continuously with Brazilian officials to regain market access.

Additionally, USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) has provided documentation and information on the U.S. food safety requirements and standards for beef. Following numerous technical discussions and meetings, Brazil officially reopened the market on August 1, 2016 based on the United States' classification by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) as a negligible risk country for BSE.


