versity Crops Team recently captured the title of national champions by winning both the Kansas City American Royal Collegiate Crops Contest on Nov. 13 and the Chicago Collegiate Crops Contest on Nov. 17. K-State teams have now won the collegiate crops contest championship in 16 of the past 20 years. Iowa State University was in second place at both events, and the University of Minnesota-Crookston took third. Official members of the

K-State team were Wes Jennings, Abilene, junior in agronomy; Luke Ryan, Solomon, sophomore in agronomy; and Jayden Meyer, Smith Center, sophomore in agricultural economics. Alternate contestants were agronomy majors Nate Dick, junior, Inman; Noah Winans, junior, Tekonsha, Michigan; Madison Tunnell, sophomore, Olathe; and Blake Kirchhoff, sophomore, Hardy, Nebraska.

In both contests, the K-State team took first place in all three phases of the contest: plant and seed identification, seed analysis and grain grading. In addition, team members swept the 1-2-3 individual overall placings at both events. Such a sweep of all three contest components and the top three individual placings at both contests is very rare and has only been accomplished twice before in the 85-year history of the events, both times by K-State.

At Chicago, Wes Jennings won first place individual overall. He won both the plant and seed identification and seed and eighth in seed analysis. Alternate Blake Kirchhoff scored a perfect in grain grading also. The team was coached by Kevin Donnelly, K-State

pants are required to identify 200 plant or seed samples of crops and weeds; grade eight different samples of grain according to Federal Grain Inspection Service standards: and analyze ten seed samples to determine what contaminants they contain.

The American Royal coordinated the Kansas City contest, with Corteva Agriscience as the primary awards sponsor. Additional sponsors were GFG Ag Services, CHS Foundation, American Society of Agronomy, Association of Official Seed Analysts. and South Dakota Crop Improvement Association.

The primary sponsor of the Chicago contest was the CME Group. Additional donors in Chicago included the Crop Science Society of America, Growmark Cooperative, and the Society of Commercial Seed Technologists.

For its performance

K-State received a team scholarship award from contest sponsors at Kansas City, and CME Group provided individual scholarships to the top five students at Chicago. They will also receive a stipend from the American Society of Agronomy Reinvest Program to attend the Australia Universities Crops Competition in the fall of

Buyers show strong enthusiasm for U.S. lamb's return to Japan volume and genuineness regular customers, so that

On Nov. 28, the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF) launched U.S. lamb's return to the Japanese market with an educational seminar and tasting event that drew more than 200 chefs, importers, purveyors, trade media and other key food industry professionals to The Strings hotel in Tokyo.

Following the detection of bovine spongiform encephalopathy (BSE) in the United States in December 2003, Japan was closed to U.S. lamb for nearly 15 years before reopening in July of this year. The USMEF event was designed to showcase the unique flavor profile and other positive attributes of U.S. lamb, introduce menu concepts featuring a variety of lamb cuts and connect suppliers with prospective cus-

tomers. "The turnout at the seminar was extremely impressive, and the enthusiasm was even more so," said Greg Ahart, vice president of sales for Superior Farms. Ahart also serves on the American Lamb Board and the USMEF Executive Committee. "After a 15-vear absence from the marketplace, seeing the amount of excitement and interest that was present in the room - both from the educational side, as well as when we proceeded to the presentation of products and the tasting – this event was truly something to be part of. I was completely blown away by the

of the interest expressed." USMEF president

and CEO Dan Halstrom said U.S. lamb now has a long-awaited opportunity to capitalize on Japan's strong demand for high-quality red meat products.

"The seminar and tasting confirmed that there is a lot of enthusiasm for the reentry of U.S. lamb into Japan," Halstrom said. "We are in the midst of a 'niku boom' (meat boom) in Japan and there are many developing and emerging concepts, especially in the foodservice sector, for which high-quality U.S. lamb is a natural option."

Ahart noted that the strong reputation and following U.S. pork and beef have established in Japan will provide positive momentum for U.S. lamb.

"The credibility that

U.S. pork and beef have in this marketplace is very beneficial as we look at reintroducing lamb," he explained. "Some of the more senior buyers in Japan have experience with U.S. lamb from before the market closure. But for the younger crowd at this event, which doesn't have that historical knowledge, the reputation of the other two high-quality proteins really helps generate interest in American lamb."

USMEF-Japan director Takemichi Yamashoji also emphasized the need to attract younger customers, who will be a major focus of future USMEF tastings and promotions. "There is an entire

generation of Japanese consumers who have not tasted U.S. lamb," he said. "USMEF wants to reach younger Japanese consumers and make them UCTION

U.S. lamb will be top-ofmind when they go out for fine dining." In addition to dish-

es that will be featured at high-end hotels and restaurants. Ahart added that the seminar was also an excellent venue for showcasing other lamb cuts that could gain traction in Japan.

"Lamb shanks and Denver ribs, which are comparable to short ribs, are examples of items that will have some applicability and interest in Japan as we build on the enthusiasm from the seminar," Ahart said.

Japan's imports of lamb and sheep meat are trending higher. Through October, imports in 2018 totaled 21,151 metric tons (up 11 percent from a year ago) valued at \$171.2 million (up 20 percent and already a full-year record). Australian lamb currently holds about 60 percent market share, with New Zealand lamb capturing nearly 40 percent. Lamb and sheep meat enter Japan at zero duty.







Outlook for grain elevators reliant on trade, logistics, competitor production

Average grain elevator margins are expected to be relatively normal this year for most of the Midwest. However, according to a new report from CoBank's Knowledge Exchange Division, elevators should be cautious about the outlook, as several variables are currently in play that could affect elevator margins.

Corn and wheat mar-

gins look solid on good carry and expected basis improvement, although corn ownership may be difficult for some elevators to obtain. Soybean margins for the year ahead face some uncertainties. Elevators are confident they will make a margin, but the question is when. Trade, logistics, and export competitor production will be major factors impacting margins going forward.

appreciation will face resistance over the next year," said Will Secor, grain and farm supply economist with CoBank. "Ample supplies and weak demand will continue to hobble the market. With farmers looking to store soybeans and elevators wanting to own bushels at harvest, there is a risk that elevators will narrow the harvest basis to gain ownership on the farmers' remaining unsold bushels" Secor said this ba-

Set the Stage As the U.S.-China trade

dispute moves into highgear, the record supply of soybeans matched with weak demand will hinder market pricing. Drought conditions in the EU, Russia, Ukraine and Argentina give the U.S. wheat markets promise amid this year's large yields.

Current U.S. steel and aluminum tariffs have raised the cost of steel for grain bin construction by 25 to 33 percent. The tariffs have discouraged elevators from constructing new storage facilities until the tariff issues are

This is the fifth consecutive year of above trend U.S. corn and soybean yields. Slow soybean exports will force many elevators to store more sovbeans longer. Carrying more soybeans will increase storage costs for many elevators this year. "Storing soybeans is

slightly riskier because high oil content increases the spoilage potential,' said Secor. "Well-managed sovbeans stored in bins with adequate aeration can be stored longer." However, soybeans in piles or ag bags stored for any significant length of time after winter face significant spoilage risks.

livestock producers and landowners. Members approved a new resolution urging local and state law enforcement officials to actively enforce state trespassing laws along navigable streams in Kansas. KLA members amended a resolution to support

continued state and federal funding for the Cattle-Trace disease traceability pilot project. CattleTrace, which started in the fall of 2018, meets member policy criteria that any disease traceability program minimizes the costs to producers, optimizes the role of the private sector in administration and protects the confidentiality of individual animal owner Another amended resolution opposes the intro-

duction of a federal regulation similar to the 2010 Grain Inspection, Packers and Stockyards Administration provision restrict-Marysville Livestock Sales

stock marketing.

Amended KLA policy strongly supports ratification of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Trade Agreement. Congressional approval of the agreement is important because U.S. beef exports to Canada and Mexico combined are nearly \$2 billion per year.

The membership chose to retain a resolution supporting an exemption for livestock haulers from electronic logging device requirements while modifications to hours-ofservice regulations are under consideration. KLA supports hours-of-service changes that would protect animal welfare and prevent excessive freight cost increases.

Members chose to reaffirm a resolution supporting the Beef Industry Long Range Plan. The vision of the plan is "to responsibly produce the most trusted and preferred protein in the world.' A resolution on the

beef checkoff was updated to show continued support for the industry's self-help program, which was supported by 74% of producers on the most recent survey. KLA supports an increase in the beef checkoff assessment rate to adequately fund beef demand programs partially due to a Cornell University study showing between 2006 and 2013, every \$1 invested in the checkoff returned \$11.20 to the industry. The KLA resolution on immigration was reaf-

U.S. pork losses from trade dispute with Mexico: \$1.5 billion

The National Pork Producers Council (NPPC) have called for an end to a trade dispute that has cost U.S. pork producers an estimated \$1.5 billion this year, according to Iowa State University Economist Dermot

"We are very pleased with the new trade agreement with Mexico and Canada, one that preserves zero-tariff pork trade in North America for the long term," said NPPC President Jim Heimerl, a pork producer from Johnstown, Ohio. "But, it's imperative that we remove U.S. tariffs on Mexican metal imports so that retaliatory tariffs of 20 percent against U.S. pork

Dr. Hayes estimates that live hog values this year have been reduced by \$12 per animal due to retaliatory tariffs imposed by Mexico against U.S. pork in June. The loss estimate of \$1.5 billion is based on an expected total harvest of 125 million hogs in 2018. These tariffs, along with China's retaliatory tariffs, have turned what promised to be a profitable year into a year of losses for export-dependent U.S. pork producers. Dr. Hayes estimates U.S. pork producer losses of \$1 billion, or \$8 per animal, from the ongoing trade dispute with China.

Mexico and China represent approximately 40 percent of total U.S. pork export

out his career," said Andy Klein, water quality forester with the Kansas Forest Service. He nominated Reitz for the award.

The award recognizes individual private landowners and families that have done an exceptional job of managing and implementing agroforestry practices on their property. Agroforestry is the integration of trees and shrubs into farming and ranching operations to maximize productivity and conservation benefits.

Reitz was responsible for property management to promote the safety, health, and welfare of the Kickapoo tribe in Kansas and improving the quality of life on the Kickapoo Nation by safeguarding the environment and natural resources. The land has significant cultural, health, economic, and recreational importance to the Kickapoo tribe in Kansas.

"Jim's natural resource career and use of agroforestry practices has been and will continue to be a great benefit to the Kansas landscape and the people inhabiting it," Klein said.

Test forage before feeding or selling

Hay bales can be an effective and reliable feed source for livestock as the weather turns cold and dreary. When it comes to feeding or selling hay through the winter, one thing that should never be neglected is to get the hay properly tested. The information gained from forage sampling will help to better determine the hay's market value and ration formulation for livestock.

Agricultural Experiment Station and Cooperative Extension Service recommends the following forage sampling procedures:

Sample by forage lot. A forage lot is hay or silage taken from the same location, field, or farm, the same cutting (within a 48-hour period) at the same plant maturity, with similar amounts of grass, weeds, rain damage, or preservative treatment. Every field and cutting is different, so do not combine hays of different qualities or cuttings into one composite sample.

Sample at the optimum time. Collect hay or silage samples as close to the time of feeding or sale as possible. Sampling immediately before feeding accounts for any heating or weathering losses that may have occurred during storage.

Select a sharp, well-designed coring device. It is important to get a representative sample of forages to be tested. This is most effectively achieved by using a probe that is 12 to 24 inches in length and has an inside diameter of 3/8 to 1 inch. A greater number of small samples are more representative than fewer large samples. To sample bales and stacks of hay, take at least 20 cores that are 12 to 15 inches deep.

Keep good records. Record name, date the crop was harvested, date sampled, and an identifier code or number for the lot on the bag with a permanent marker. The information will be useful when test results are received to help identify lots for correct feeding or marketing.

Ship samples immediately. Ship or deliver samples to the laboratory as soon as possible to prevent moisture loss and microbial deterioration of the sample. It is best to deliver samples early in the week to be sure the samples don't sit in the lab over the weekend or

through holidays. Sampling hay and forages can be very beneficial for both feeding the correct nutrient values and optimizing marketing strategies, but it is important to remember, forage analysis results are only as good as the sample pro-
