



Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crofts

The April Supply and Demand Report didn't amount to much, and it wasn't supposed to, so it was quickly ignored. The most notable development in the report was the corn ending stocks figure being bumped up above 2 billion, which is ugly, at least on the surface. It was not a surprise to see the 2 billion figure, but it would be interesting to know how all these animals in the U.S. keep getting by on less and less feed. My guess is that at some point we see the USDA increase the 2017 or 2018 corn production figure to help explain where all this extra corn is coming from.

We have plentiful supplies of grain, more than plentiful really, and we are struggling to get rid of it. Wheat keeps

getting cheaper, but exports aren't improving. There is a good chance that USDA will cut the export estimate again in the May supply and demand report and we will end up having higher ending stocks than a year ago. Corn ending stocks are still below year-ago levels, but the trend has been that USDA cuts demand estimates and increases ending stocks. Soybeans, of course, are struggling with the lack of Chinese demand.

Something will have to change on the demand front, or change significantly on the supply front in order to break these markets out of the doldrums. Wheat demand cannot improve without a major supply issue elsewhere in the world. A disaster here in the

U.S., which is not remotely likely, wouldn't draw stocks down enough to matter. Corn, at least, has a chance of seeing stocks reduced if yield falls much below trend, but the soybeans would have to have a severe yield loss to significantly impact price, especially if things don't get back to normal with China. Basically, any bullish hopes for this summer are going to be tied to U.S. corn production. A sub-trend line yield in the corn would be supportive to the corn, wheat, and soybeans. Drawing down corn stocks would increase wheat feed usage and cut next year's soybean acreage, which is what we are going to need for those markets.

Cattle futures were firm this week despite quite a bit of

cash trade at \$124 again. Feeder futures up front were sideways to lower thanks to the softening index, which is at least somewhat weather-related. The August feeder futures, however, are about to make new contract highs. There is definitely a bit of optimism in the deferred live cattle and feeder cattle contracts.

One very interesting thing that is going on right now is the spread between April live cattle and June. Last year the spread between those contracts reached \$18 and the year before it made it to \$14. Now we are at \$5, which is somewhere we haven't been since 2013. There is still time for bull spreading before expiration, but it isn't going to happen with \$124 cash trade. There isn't a great correlation between what happens with the spread and what happens with the cash market, but we can probably assume that the cash market isn't going to drop as severely as it usually does in the month of May. In 2011, a year with heavy bear spread-

ing between April and June, the cash price actually rose in the late spring, which is definitely an exception.

Pork demand from China is hitting record levels. African Swine Fever is forcing the Chinese to buy U.S. pork, which is great for the U.S. hog market. Unfortunately it means that feed demand is much lower than normal, and will be until the hog herd is rebuilt. The pork demand will likely be supportive to the beef market, primarily to the lower end cuts. At the same time we are due for a slowing of cow slaughter, which will decrease the supply of grinding meat, so we could see a great deal of strength in the lower end of the market.

June live cattle have managed to test, and hold above, the 50-day moving average many times. As long as that support keeps holding there is no reason to panic about selling June live cattle. However, if that support ever fails, you have to get aggressive.

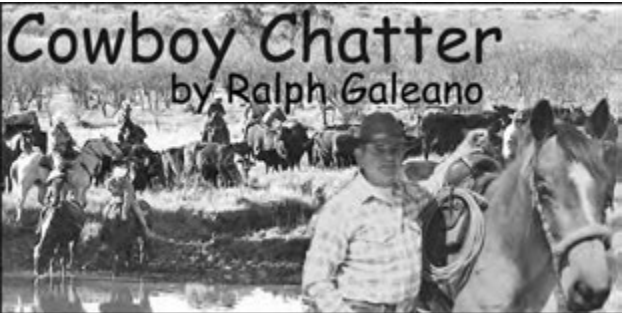

Corps of Discovery Part II – Fort Mandan to Lemhi Pass

The Corps wintered at Fort Mandan in what is near present-day Bismarck, North Dakota. When the ice went out in early April 1805, Lewis and Clark sent the keelboat and a dozen men downriver to St. Louis with maps, reports, Indian artifacts, and boxes of scientific specimens for President Jefferson. That same day, the remaining party heads upriver, traveling in two pirogues and six smaller dugout canoes. The expedition totals 33 now, including Charbonneau, Sacajawea, and her baby boy.

They reach the Great Falls of the Missouri and Lewis states “the grandest site I ever beheld.” Now they are faced with a grueling 18-mile portage around the falls.

They make crude carts from cottonwoods and bury some of their cargo. They haul the canoes and remaining supplies over the broken terrain. Broiling heat, hailstorms, prickly pear cactus, and other obstacles mark the difficult portage. Instead of the half day the captains had planned the previous winter, the portage takes nearly a month.

Once the portage is complete, the party moves up the river toward the three forks Sacajawea has told them about.

The Missouri River splits into three separate forks in south central Montana. When the Corps of Discovery led by Meriwether Lewis and Captain William Clark reached this point in 1805 during their quest to find an overland route to the Pacific Ocean, they made camp and endeavored

to determine which of the forks would be the most likely route to lead them closest to mountain passes that crossed the Rocky Mountains and the Continental Divide.

The Continental Divide is the spine of the Rocky Mountains that runs north and south traversing the continent and dividing the watersheds of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. All waters east of the divide drain to the Atlantic Ocean while all waters west of the divide drain to the Pacific. The party had to cross the divide to reach Pacific waters.

Imposing mountains meant the end of their river travel on the east side of the divide and the beginning of hundreds of miles of mountain ranges that would have to be crossed. A daunting overland passage lay ahead of them.

It was imperative they find the people of the Shoshone or Snake Indians who they were told inhabited this area of the Rocky Mountains in order to trade for horses to pack their stores, provisions and trade goods over the mountains. Their expedition would surely fail if they did not acquire horses.

Lewis and Clark had been

commissioned by the U.S. Government under the authority of President Thomas Jefferson to explore the area known as Louisiana which the United States had purchased from France. The President knew that the future of the young nation lay in the land to the west of the Mississippi River for expansion, trade and other commercial interests vital to the nation.

While wintering in the Mandan villages in 1804, the party hired Touissant Charbonneau, a frontiersman, as an interpreter in order to communicate with the Indians. Charbonneau was to become one of the most famous members of the expedition because of his Indian wife, Sacajawea.

Sacajawea was a Shoshone Indian who had been captured by the Hidatsa a few miles from where the expedition was camped on the three forks. She was taken back to the Mandan villages where Charbonneau married her. She would prove to be a great asset to the party as they prepared to ascend one of the forks leading to the mountain passes.

While at the three forks, Lewis and Clark named each fork for high-ranking members of the government. The southeast fork was named the Gallatin River; the middle fork was named the Madison River and the southwest fork was named the Jefferson River for the President. They intended to ascend the Jefferson as it seemed the most logical route over the mountains.

Sacajawea had informed Lewis and Clark that before she was captured, she had traveled with her tribe, the

Shoshone, over the mountains from the west through passes and came down onto the plains in search of buffalo and other game every year after the winter snows had left the high mountains. She indicated that her people had many horses and used them to hunt and pack meat back to their camps.

Lewis knew that for their expedition to be successful, they must meet the Snake Indians and attempt to trade the goods they brought on their journey for horses to cross the mountains. They had many blankets, trinkets, knives and other items brought along for the express purpose of trading with Indians for supplies to help them across the continent. Horses would determine if they succeeded in reaching the waters that flowed into the Pacific.

As they ascended the Jefferson, Sacajawea showed them the spot on the river she was captured five years before. She began picking out landmarks she recognized.

The party came to the place where two smaller streams entered the Jefferson and Lewis sent out parties to scout both forks. These forks are today called the Big Hole and Ruby

Rivers. It is here the Jefferson ends and the main channel becomes the Beaverhead River.

They ascended the Beaverhead and Sacajawea soon saw a well-known landmark that she recognized as a place her people passed many times when traveling in this area. It was a high promontory that rose above the river and was called by her people Beaverhead Rock, for its resemblance to the head of a beaver. She informed Lewis that her people would be somewhere in this area.

Lewis knew that as they neared the high mountains of the Rockies, the waterways leading west would end and travel by boat and canoe would be impossible. With their food and provisions running low, it became urgent for him to find Sacajawea's people and barter for horses and even food to continue their journey by land.

Captain Meriwether Lewis decided to take two men and continue past Beaverhead Rock overland in search of the Shoshone and their horses. Lewis traveled by land some fourteen miles up the river. He found a well-marked Indian trail that followed the river as it enters the mountains. When the small river forked,

he named the place The Forks of the Jefferson.

Traveling on the trail he soon found that further river travel by boat would be impossible as the streams became too shallow and small for even canoes. He proceeded along the small stream toward what appeared to be a pass through the mountains in the distance.

Lewis sees an Indian on horseback riding toward him some two miles distant and is overjoyed with the anticipation of finally meeting the Indians he has been seeking. At one mile distant the Indian halts and Lewis makes signs of friendship. Lewis moves towards him but when he is 10 paces from him, the Indian turns his horse and whips him into a run away from himand disappears into the willow brush. As the Indian flees the strange white men, all hopes of obtaining horses for the Corps of Discovery vanishes and their overland journey to the westward flowing Columbia River is now in jeopardy.

NPPC cancels 2019 World Pork Expo as precaution

The National Pork Producers Council's board of directors have announced its decision to cancel World Pork Expo 2019 out of an abundance of caution as African swine fever (ASF) continues to spread in China and other parts of Asia. World Pork Expo, held each June at the Iowa State Fairgrounds in Des Moines, hosts approximately 20,000 visitors over three days, including individuals and exhibitors from ASF-positive regions. African swine fever affects only pigs and presents no human health or food safety risks. There is currently no vaccine to treat the swine disease.

"While an evaluation by veterinarians and other

third-party experts concluded negligible risk associated with holding the event, we have decided to exercise extreme caution," said David Herring, NPPC president and a producer from Lillington, North Carolina. "The health of the U.S. swine herd is paramount; the livelihoods of our producers depend on it. Prevention is our only defense against ASF and NPPC will continue to do all it can to prevent its spread to the United States."

The decision to cancel this year's World Pork Expo comes as more than 100 U.S. pork producers gather in Washington this week to meet with their members of Congress during NPPC's Legislative Action Conference. To augment the USDA's efforts to protect the United States from ASF and other animal diseases, U.S. pork producers are asking Congress to appropriate funding for 600 new U.S. Customs and Border Protection agriculture inspectors to further strengthen our defenses

against African swine fever.

"Our farmers are highly export-dependent," Herring said. "An ASF outbreak would immediately close our export markets at a time when we are already facing serious trade headwinds. The retaliatory tariffs we currently face in some of our largest export markets due to trade disputes are among the factors that prompted a conservative decision regarding World Pork Expo. U.S. pork producers are already operating in very challenging financial conditions."

Herring added, "The widespread presence of African swine fever in China's swine herd, the world's largest by far, takes the threat of this swine disease to an entirely new level. We ask all producers, travelers and the general public to recognize the heightened risk since the first outbreak was reported in China last year and to heed biosecurity protocols in support of U.S. agriculture.

Don't skip the weight on silage covers

Recent regulations may change how some U.S. producers weigh down their silage covers. Yet, the benefits to properly covering silage bunkers or piles continue to provide returns.

"The additional time and expense to comply with new waste tire regulations may cause producers to question the need for covering piles at all," notes Renato Schmidt, Ph.D., Technical Services - Silage, Lallemand Animal Nutrition. "There is absolutely no question that effectively covering piles saves money by preserving important nutrients in the silage, reducing dry matter (DM) losses and maintaining the hygienic quality of the feed. The effort to cover and seal silage piles is a vital part of the silage management program."

Covering piles helps create the anaerobic environment required for the ensiling fermentation on the most critical portion in terms of porosity — the surface. As a result, the quality of the fermentation process is improved compared to uncovered piles. During storage, well-maintained plastic covers help prevent oxygen ingress, which can cause spoilage.

For example, sealing and covering a 40-foot by 100-foot bunker returns approximately

\$2,000 in improved silage DM recovery when filled with corn silage. Plus, feeding spoiled silage from an uncovered silo can reduce feed intake and digestibility and potentially lead to metabolic and reproductive issues in the herd.

A combination of high-quality plastic and adequate weighting helps prevent losses. Use plastic that is at least five millimeters thick and dual layer — black inner and white outer — to resist deterioration. Also consider using plastic film with an increased oxygen barrier, Dr. Schmidt advises.

Weighting the plastic down prevents air from seeping underneath the covering. Full-casing waste tires have been the standard for anchoring bunk silo covers for years, but they are heavy to move and bulky to store. Standing water in a full-casing tire can be a breeding ground for mosquitoes. With the increasing concern around West Nile virus (WNV) — and the new state regulations prohibiting full tires — producers may be searching for new options, such as:

- Modifying tires by leaving tires on the rims, removing tire sidewalls, drilling holes in the tire sidewalls or cutting tires in half
- Covering tires with plastic to reduce standing water
- Treating tires with a mosquito larvicide, which requires a certified pesticide applicator
- Replacing tires with sidewall disks
- Using heavy equipment tire beads
- Finding alternatives to tires, such as gravel or sand bags

Dr. Schmidt advises producers to choose an option that maintain the integrity of the plastic. Tears or holes reduce the effectiveness of the covering and allow oxygen into the pile.

"Covering and sealing silage bunkers makes economic sense," Dr. Schmidt says. "There are options for producers looking for alternative ways to weigh down covers. Don't drop a best practice that pencils out in the long run."

Pioneer Bluffs receives Humanities Kansas grant

Humanities Kansas has awarded a grant to Pioneer Bluffs of Matfield Green in support of "Farming and Ranching Heritage Pilot Project: Tallgrass Tales."

Tallgrass Tales is a short film project that will collect and preserve favorite stories from Flint Hills cattle ranchers and cowhands.

"Humanities Kansas supports projects that examine culture and tradition," said Julie Mulvihill, executive director of Humanities Kan-

sas. "This short film project, which documents the stories of women and men working in the Flint Hills' cattle industry, tells us much about one of the state's most unique environments."

This project will record interviews of ranchers, conducted and produced by Mark Feiden of Roeland Park, Kansas.

"Someone who is 80 years old today, and who grew up in farming and ranching, has witnessed considerable change.

They knew the ranch before cattle trucks and stock trailers and they likely knew the county before paved roads and rural electrification. Many of them spent their days on horseback, routinely drove cattle between distant pastures, and worked livestock without the aid of pens and chutes," says Feiden. "If we wish to preserve the timbre of a largely bygone era, we must act now."

Mark Feiden is a sixth-generation Kansan with pioneer roots in both Reno and Wa-

baunsee counties. Originally from Wichita, Mark began exploring the back roads as an alternative to the Kansas Turnpike while earning the first of two degrees from the University of Kansas in Lawrence. Mark cofounded The Konza Press in 1997—"Celebrating the people, places and rich traditions of the Great Plains." Mark is an accomplished writer, photographer, and filmmaker—who has collaborated on a number of books about Kansas including The Kansas Land-

scape, Volume One; The Kansas Landscape, Volume Two; Panoramic Kansas; The Flint Hills; and Prairie Fire.

Results of this project will be presented in community events this fall at Pioneer Bluffs and the Volland Store. Around this same time, stories will be available to the public on a dedicated website, on Pioneer Bluffs' website, and on

the Ranching Heritage kiosks at Pioneer Bluffs.



USDA announces buy-up coverage availability and new service fees for noninsured crop coverage policies

USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) has announced that higher levels of coverage will be offered through the Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP), a popular safety net program, as of April 8, 2019. The 2018 Farm Bill also increased service fees and made other changes to the program, including service fee waivers for qualified military veterans interested in obtaining NAP coverage.

"When other insurance coverage is not an option, NAP is a valuable risk mit-

igation tool for farmers and ranchers," said FSA administrator Richard Fordyce. "In agriculture, losses from natural disasters are a matter of when, not if, and having a NAP policy provides a little peace of mind."

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of commercial crops for which insurance coverage is not available in order to protect against natural disasters that result in lower yields or crop losses, or prevent crop planting.

NAP Buy-Up Coverage

Option
The 2018 Farm Bill reinstates higher levels of coverage, from 50 to 65 percent of expected production in 5 percent increments, at 100 percent of the average market price. Producers of organics and crops marketed directly to consumers also may exercise the "buy-up" option to obtain NAP coverage of 100 percent of the average market price at the coverage levels of between 50 and 65 percent of expected production. NAP basic coverage is available at 55 percent of the average

market price for crop losses that exceed 50 percent of expected production.

Producers have a one-time opportunity until May 24, 2019, to obtain buy-up coverage for 2019 or 2020 eligible crops for which the NAP application closing date has passed. Buy-up coverage is not available for crops intended for grazing.

NAP Service Fees

For all coverage levels, the new NAP service fee is the lesser of \$325 per crop or \$825 per producer per county, not to exceed a total of

\$1,950 for a producer with farming interests in multiple counties. These amounts reflect a \$75 service fee increase for crop, county or multi-county coverage. The fee increases apply to obtaining NAP coverage on crops after April 8, 2019.

NAP Enhancements for Qualified Military Veterans

The 2018 Farm Bill NAP amendments specify that qualified veteran farmers or ranchers are now eligible for a service fee waiver and premium reduction, if the NAP applicant meets certain eligi-

bility criteria.

Beginning, limited resource and targeted underserved farmers or ranchers remain eligible for a waiver of NAP service fees and premium reduction when they file form CCC-860, "Socially Disadvantaged, Limited Resource and Beginning Farmer or Rancher Certification." Researchers target cattle disease with grant funds

A research grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture for nearly \$1.2 million is supporting work at Kansas State University toward combating a disease that affects cattle in the U.S. and globally.

Kathryn Reif, assistant professor in the diagnostic medicine and pathobiology department in the Kansas State University College of Veterinary Medicine, said the project focuses on optimizing antimicrobial use to control active infection of the hemo-

parasitic pathogen, *Anaplasma marginale*, the causative agent of bovine anaplasmosis.

"Different strains of the pathogen are actively circulating in the U.S.," Reif said. "We are using a combination of *A. marginale* strains, some of which we recently isolated from Kansas cattle herds, to help determine how strains differ in their susceptibility to tetracycline antimicrobials, specifically chlortetracycline, the most common antimicrobial used to control

anaplasmosis. We hope that by looking at three different chlortetracycline treatment protocols for cattle, we can provide practical recommendations for the Food and Drug Administration and ultimately for cattle producers toward controlling this disease."

Reif said that treatment policies should be based on a firm understanding of how antimicrobial therapeutic effect can be maximized while minimizing risk of resistance development.

"Cattle producers in Kansas and beyond are concerned that the current FDA-approved anaplasmosis treatment regimens are not sufficiently controlling diseases," Reif said. "Also, there is no fully USDA-approved vaccine for anaplasmosis, and the experimental vaccine,

available in some states, does not prevent infection. Efficacy concerns over the current anaplasmosis control measures underscore the need for updated science-based recommendations to help cattle producers manage this disease."

While Reif specializes in vector-borne disease research, her research team at Kansas State University consists of experts in many other disciplines, including molecular biologists, clinical pharmacologists, an antimicrobial resistance specialist, Extension agents, livestock veterinarians and experts in the development and delivery of innovative decision support tools.

"With these combined skill sets, our team is uniquely qualified to conduct the pro-

posed program of research," Reif said. "Together, we have the capability to answer these innovative research questions and communicate the outcomes effectively to the scientific community and stakeholders in the livestock industry."

Toward the latter effort, Reif said her group will host an anaplasmosis outreach event on May 20 at the Hil-

ton Garden Inn in Manhattan, which will include a number of invited speakers and a producer panel to discuss strategies and best practices for managing anaplasmosis. Mexico's convenience store sector a growing venue for U.S. meat

In a recent USMEF report, Gerardo Rodriguez, U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF) regional marketing director for Mexico, Central America and the Dominican Republic, reported on USMEF's efforts to expand demand for U.S. pork and beef products by working with suppliers of Mexico's largest convenience store chain, Oxxo.

"With a growing number of consumers turning to convenience stores for lunch and dinner, USMEF is working to develop a wider range of convenience items that feature U.S. red meat, including salads with pre-cooked pork and beef," said Rodriguez.

Mexico is the third-largest destination for U.S. beef exports, behind Japan and South Korea. Beef exports to Mexico totaled 239,110 metric tons last year, valued at just over \$1 billion.

Water Technology Farms report now available

Technology and management tools keep evolving to help crop producers make every drop of water count on their fields. Water Technology Farms were developed four years ago as part of the Long-Term Vision for the Future of Water Supply in Kansas. They began as three-year pilot public-private partnerships to demonstrate the latest in crop irrigation technology and water conservation research on the field scale.

"I'm pleased to see the growing interest in Water Technology Farms across the state," said Kansas Water Office acting director Earl Lewis. "We continue to see outcomes from these farms showing that water use reductions, coupled with irrigation technology adoption and water management improvements are leading to positive effects on the aquifer as well as the producer's bottom line."

Water Technology Farms have proven valuable in helping to expand the conversation and education of producers as well as decision makers on equipment and technology utilized in agricultural water conservation efforts.

"As one of the first three Tech Farms we have learned so much as far as water conservation production and how what we do affects the Ogallala Aquifer," Dwane Roth, Garden City Company/Dwane Roth Farm near Holcomb. "A fifth-generation Kansan recently said to me that western Kansas is different compared to other parts of the world - our water problems are solvable! I now ask with what we know, do we become resilient? And in doing so have vibrant local communities or do we become just another page in the history books? I say we become resilient."

The 2018 Growing Sea-

son Report shares information about each of the ten farms including the crop or crops grown, technology utilized to manage water application, as well as harvest data and sponsors of each location.

"My goal as a first year Water Technology Farm was to increase the bushels per inch of irrigation we produced," said Matt Long of Long Water Technology Farm near Marienthal. "We really pushed our crop using different application technologies, soil moisture probes and a weather station to utilize our irrigation water efficiently which resulted in growing 34 bushels per inch of irrigation. As we start this spring with adequate profile moisture and more knowledge about the application technologies and soil probes, I am excited to see how much more progress we can achieve."

It is anticipated up to five new farms will be added to the

network in 2019, bringing the total number of Water Technology Farms up to 15 for the 2019 growing season. Field days and other informational events in conjunction with the Water Technology Farm Program will take place later this summer.
