Entangled Love

Isaac M. Ruth's death astonished all who heard the news on the streets of Lawrence, the morning of April 27, 1871. The well-known business manager for the Law-

rence Tribune was not known to have health problems, although his wife, Kitty, regularly consulted the family physician, Dr. Medicott, for an undisclosed chronic ailment.

Isaac met Kitty in St. Louis after the death of his first wife. Kitty was in an unhappy marriage to Seymore Voullaire. They soon divorced.

The first time Voullaire saw Kitty with Isaac Ruth, both men pulled pistols and fired. Voullaire was seriously injured. Kitty tended to him until

he had sufficiently healed, and then promptly married Mr. Ruth. The couple moved to Lawrence in 1868.

That same year Dr. John J. Medicott and his wife, Sarah, moved to Lawrence. Mrs. Medicott was a widow and used her fortune from the previous marriage to establish Dr. Medicott's office in their Lawrence home. The doctor developed a respectable practice and Mrs. Medicott, "many years his senior," was loved by all who knew her. Imagine

the shock of finding her dead the morning of December 15, 1870. Dr. Medicott called in other physicians but nothing could be done to resuscitate her. The attending physicians noticed signs of poison but Dr. Medicott insisted she had died of a stroke. She was buried the very next day.

Four short months later Isaac Ruth lay dead behind a mysteriously locked door in his own home. Dr. Medicott had been playing chess with him the evening before. Most

damning for the doctor was a note left by Mr. Ruth for his wife. Ruth wrote that Dr. Medicott had given him medicine that was making him feel numb and blind. "I write this so that if I never see you again, you may have my body examined and see what the trouble is. Good-bye and ever remember my last thoughts were of you."

Dr. Medicott was immediately arrested. On his person were found a photograph of Kitty Ruth and two love poems written in her hand. Rumors had persisted for some time that the doctor and Mrs. Ruth had been carrying on in an unseemly way. Now, the question of Mrs. Medicott's poisoning was revisited.

The trial was set to convene in October with a change of venue fifty miles south of Lawrence at Garnett. The newspapers were convicting Dr. Medicott and his "lover" with each edition. The Lawrence Standard published photographs of Dr. Medicott and Kitty Ruth taken when they visited at a photo gallery together. Kitty's love poems to Medicott were also printed and picked up by other newspapers.

The trial began on October 10, 1871. Dr. Medicott's cell mate, Henry Johnson, testified that the doctor had concocted an elaborate escape attempt. Johnson said that he passed coded letters out of the jail for Medicott. Kitty was appalled that the prosecution would rely on Johnson, a convicted felon for truthful testimony. In a newspaper interview she said that she and her husband were deeply in love, and Mr. Ruth had never been jealous of Dr. Medicott. She did not believe that the doctor could have murdered her husband. She kept her medication in the room in which her husband died and believed he may have taken something by mistake.

Other "witnesses" offered sordid details of the affair between Dr. Medicott and Isaac Ruth's wife. A maid told of Dr. Medicott visiting twice a day after his wife had died in December. Mr. Ruth was always away at the newspaper office. The two often went behind a locked door for up to an hour in Mrs. Ruth's room. A neighbor of Medicott testified that Mrs. Ruth had visited the doctor's home several times after Mrs. Medicott had died. The body of Mrs. Medicott was exhumed. Morphine was found in her stomach; the same for Mr. Ruth.

The jury was out for about eleven hours from Wednesday to Thursday morning, October 26, 1871. At 8:30 a.m. the jury rendered the verdict; guilty of murder in the first degree. He was sentenced to be hanged. An appeal was referred to the Kansas Supreme Court.

Mrs. Ruth was arrested Sunday, October 29, 1871, as "an accessory before the fact" in the murder of her husband. The "pretty, pretty baby" was summarily found guilty, but all was not lost. On the very day scheduled for Medicott's hanging, January 26, 1872, the Kansas Supreme Court announced a stay of execution to review the case.

The March 14, 1872, Saline County Journal announced that the Supreme Court had reversed the judgement, citing several legal exceptions relating to the proceedings. Mrs. Ruth was released, but Dr. Medicott languished in jail while Douglas County determined whether to retry the case. Medicott was finally released in September after seventeen months in jail. When asked if he knew the whereabouts of Mrs. Ruth "he responded heartily, 'God knows, I do not'."

The way in which the entire episode ended did not convince many of the innocence of Dr. Medicott and Mrs. Ruth. Was it murder? Did Isaac Ruth take the medication by accident or did he commit suicide to revenge the lover of his unfaithful wife? Only eternity can unveil the mystery of entangled love and death on The Way West.

MU study: Accelerated milk replacer benefits dairy calves

Dairy calves that are fed higher-protein milk replacement produced more milk and had earlier weaning dates, improved health and better fertility rates, according to a new paper by University of Missouri Extension specialists.

Before weaning calves, producers feed them a milk replacement, a concentrated powdered milk diluted with water. In a two-year study on a pasture-based dairy, calves fed higher-protein milk replacers showed fewer health problems, says dairy veterinarian Scott Poock. As calves matured, they had higher conception rates at first breeding, and they bred at a younger age. They also gave 1,000 pounds more milk at first lactation. All of this translates into more money for the producer, says extension dairy specialist Stacey Hamilton.

fed 28.5:15 protein-fat accelerated milk replacer to one group of heifer calves and traditional replacer to others. They used a mob feeding system of multiple calves per feeder at MU's Southwest Research Center near Mount Vernon.

Poock says conventional milk replacer feeding programs limit dry matter intake of milk to 1-1.5% of body weight at birth. Higher-protein milk replacer allows dry matter intake of 2-3%.

"The higher level of milk feeding is counterintuitive to the goal of increased grain feeding and subsequent rumen development," says Poock. However, the study shows that calves eat more grain after weaning when the milk ration is reduced one to two weeks before weaning.

A 2005 University of Minnesota analysis of feeding of high-protein milk replacers

to dairy calves reported an 18% decrease in calf mortality. A Cornell University study found that calves inoculated with cryptosporidium and fed accelerated milk replacer had fewer days of diarrhea, less dehydration and improved feed efficiency than traditionally fed calves.

Hamilton recommends the accelerated milk replacer to push calves to weaning sooner and improve overall herd health. "We've seen the extra growth and health benefits," he says.

He says it is important to mix the replacer thoroughly with the right ratio of powder to water. Clumps of undissolved powder can cause gut issues in the calves.

Poock, Hamilton and MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources interim associate dean Rob Kallenbach are authors of the paper.

KDA provides updated reports on the economic contribution of agriculture

The Kansas Department of Agriculture has recently updated its interactive map of Kansas, showing the economic contribution of agriculture

across the state broken down by county. Located on the KDA website, the interactive resource can be used to find the agricultural economic facts

for each of the 105 counties in Kansas, as well as a report for the entire state.

"As we review the economic contribution of Kansas

agriculture, we are pleased to report a total direct output of \$46.9 billion supporting 134,057 jobs in the agriculture industry," said Secretary Mike Beam. "This output is slightly higher than our data published last year at this time, so we know our farmers, ranchers and agribusinesses across a variety of commodity sectors continue to be critical to Kan-

sas communities despite very challenging economic times for our industry."

KDA annually updates the state and county economic statistics to provide an understanding of the vast influence of the 68 sectors of agriculture on the state's economy. In addition to the direct output, the reports include the indirect and induced effects of agriculture

and ag-related sectors, which demonstrate the total impact that agriculture has in Kansas communities. This total economic contribution of agriculture totals over \$65 billion and supports more than 245,000 jobs statewide.

The interactive map allows users to see detailed agricultural statistics including farm numbers, leading agricultural sectors, and value-added data for each county. KDA utilizes data compiled by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service. The economic contribution data is sourced from the most recent IMPLAN data available (2017) and adjusted for 2019.
