Pork checkoff moving remittance payments into online system

has announced plans to migrate Pork Checkoff remittances to its online platform. The online Checkoff remittance system is designed to significantly reduce the processing time, paper and other expenses for the Pork Board, while also providing pork producers flexibility with payment options, improve operational efficiencies and create cost savings.

"Our expenses for collecting and reconciling manual payments run about \$150,000 annually," said Calvin VandeKrol, vice president of finance for the Pork Board. "That includes bank fees, postage, paper, printing and several

hours of staff time each month. By migrating remittances to the online platform, we're saving producer Checkoff dollars that can be redirected to other, more critical work related to our research, promotion and education efforts."

"Producers around the country have told us loud and clear they want today's Pork Checkoff to move at the speed of business," said Bill Even, CEO of the Pork Checkoff. "The online reporting system reduces processing costs and time on both sides of the transaction, and provides greater transparency and accountability."

With the online system,

there are three ways to report and submit payments:

ACH Payment - Producers can file their report and pay online with an ACH withdrawal from your checking account. This is the most widely accepted and most efficient method of payment.

Paystub - Producers will file their report online and print a paystub to mail in with their check. This provides the option of forgoing an ACH withdrawal, and works well for producers that have a separate department that cuts accounts payable checks. It still allows the producer to track and report on prior payment information through the online

system. "Zero Reporting" - This option is to be used when a sale has not occurred for the period and no Checkoff remit-

Producers not currently using the system, which has been available since 2017, will need to register before they can begin using the secure system. During the month of September, the Pork Board will mail letters to those producers who need to register so they can establish their login credentials. Producers may also register at http://www.pork. org/pay or call 1-800-456-7675 to sign up.

Delayed planting effects trition. "If we're prepared at Many producers may have have a long arm.

The effects of delayed planting are still being felt, and silage quality may be another potential victim. The good news is producers can make adjustments during harvest and ensiling to maximize the quality and quantity of silage available to feed.

"This planting season was way out of the ordinary, so we need to make changes to our usual silage plans, too," explains Renato Schmidt, forage products specialist with Lallemand Animal Nu-

already changed their hybrid maturity at planting to help address this concern. However, selecting a range of maturities can increase variation in moisture content at harvest, leading to variability in moisture levels and forage quality in the ensiling structure. "The most important factor

influencing forage quality is the maturity of the crop," he says. "Harvesting forage with a high degree of variation in maturity levels means you're going to see the same variations in the silage. This greatly

affects the initial fermentation process, which sets producers up for pitfalls." Harvesting less-mature

corn also can increase risk of seepage, Schmidt advises. The first plants to be harvested are typically the wettest. When placed at the bottom of the storage structure, the weight of the silage on top will increase the likelihood of seepage. To control the fermenta-

tion process, he recommends including a research-proven forage inoculant to stimulate a rapid, efficient fermentation. Inoculants that include lactic-acid bacteria (LAB) such as Pediococcus pentosaceus 12455 help increase the rate of pH drop. Quickly lowering the pH helps inhibit the growth of protein-degrading bacteria and reduce losses of the most highly digestible nutrients.

Preparing for mold challenges

The wet planting season could lead to increased opportunity for mold and mycotoxins. In particular, producers battling high insect pressure should be prepared for this challenge. Any physical damage to the corn plant - from

insects, disease or weather can lead to mold infestation and increase the potential for mycotoxin production.

In many cases, mycotoxins may be present even when there is no visible mold or bad smell coming from the silage. causing unforeseen decreases in production, increases in herd health issues and lower fertility rates when fed.

To help minimize myco-

toxin-producing molds - and all molds that cause spoilage - producers should use a proven silage inoculant containing Lactobacillus buchneri NCIMB 40788, which reduces the growth of yeasts, the initiators of spoilage. In fact, L. buchneri 40788 applied at 400,000 colony-forming units (CFU) per gram of silage or 600,000 CFU per gram of high-moisture corn (HMC), has been uniquely reviewed by the Food and Drug Administration and allowed to claim improved aerobic stability.

Getting ahead of clostridial fermentations

Delayed planting also may result in harvesting at higher moisture levels, which can in-

Any time forage is harvested below 30% dry matter (DM), there is a risk of clostridial fermentation. Clostridia are soil micro-organisms naturally present on forages. When allowed to grow, they can produce butyric acid and a range of biogenic amines, resulting in a telltale fecal, or putrid, smell. Proper packing at ensiling, covering and sealing the structure quickly and efficiently, and using a research-proven forage inoculant for a fast initial ensiling fermentation all help reduce the chances of clostridia growth.

"A forage inoculant is always a good investment, but this year it's even more important to help drive the initial ensiling fermentation and manage aerobic spoilage at feedout," Schmidt says. "Even after we open this season's silage, I recommend getting regular forage analyses to ensure livestock are getting a steady supply of nutrients. Make sure you check the dry-matter levels of the silage being fed daily, as this alone can help minimize a major source of production variability."

Don't underestimate the importance of harvest safety By David G. Hallauer, **Meadowlark District** Extension agent, crops & soils/horticulture

Harvest time: that time of the year when we get to see the fruits of our labor in the form of a harvested crop. It gets a romanticized depiction in paintings and photographs and even videos. It looks like it's a lot of fun – and it is. It's also high stress and dangerous.

The 2019 harvest season will likely be characterized to some degree as a waiting game. Crops are maturing behind schedule, potentially causing a greater overlap in corn and soybean harvest windows. Weather has been anything but predictable this year, and will likely be a factor at some point during harvest season as well. What can we do to be as safe as possible?

Start by checking equipment. A Nebraska Extension educator that has served for over 35 years as a firefighter and EMT shared last fall about his department's discussions this time of year as fire calls increase due predominantly to combine fires. Residue buildup around engine and exhaust systems and concealed drive belts and pulleys are huge. Taking a little extra time to make sure harvest residue is cleaned off and out of machines is a huge

first step towards avoiding fires. Take a peek at electrical systems. Problem areas can spark, igniting grain dust, crop residue, or fuel vapors. If you haven't initiated preventative maintenance yet - do so now.

There are also some relatively simple steps you can take to help in case preventative maintenance doesn't do the trick. Start harvest operations on the downwind side of the field. If a fire occurs, the flames will be pushed towards the harvested portion of the field, reducing potential damage. Carry a cell phone - and know what level of service you may have as well as how to compensate for service issues in case of an emergency. Knowing field location is extremely important, not only for you, but for the entirety of the harvest crew. Field locations should be able to be relayed to emergency personnel using local road numbers and letters.

Have three fire extinguishers ready: one in the combine cab, one accessible from the ground, and one in a piece of equipment or service truck nearby. If you do get a field or equipment fire, don't hesitate to use it, but call 911 first.

Road safety is important as well. Think about the number of times you pull that combine out of a field and move it to

do you encounter? Do you have working flashers, lights, and adequate slow moving vehicle signs? It may seem logical for those of us in an agriculture community to slow down when we see a semi with flashers on following a slower-moving combine. That slow moving vehicle may only be another obstacle to pass on the highway for someone who doesn't understand.

Having a plan cannot be stressed enough. Lots of moving parts make up a harvest operation. Combine. Tractor and grain cart. Semi. Auger. Grain Bin or Elevator. All have their own moving parts and hazards. Have a plan to make sure that all are operated safely and that plans are in place should an accident occur. We don't like to think about it, but we need to.

Take care of yourself. Sleep should not be replaced with one more energy drink. Meals shouldn't be reduced to a simple candy bar or skipped altogether. Take time on a regular basis to stop, stretch, and move around. Taking good care of yourself physically will also help you stay more alert and can help prevent you from making unsafe or time wasting mistakes.

Harvest should be an enjoyable time of the year. It's



Letter to the Editor

name is Olivia L'Ecuyer, I am 13 years old and this is my sixth year in the Busy Bee 4-H Club in Washington County. It is my fourth year in plant sciences. I have competed on the River Valley District State Horticulture Judging team for four years and the RVD State Crops Judging team for three years. I would have never selected these projects on my own, but I am very glad I found them. In August I competed in the State Horticulture judging contest in Manhattan and there were barely 100 participating. At the Kansas State Fair, I competed in Crops judging and there were about the same number of kids. Border to border, Kansas is an agriculture state. My dad is a proud son of a fourth-generation farmer and I am a proud daughter of the fifth. Our farm depends on me taking an interest in the family business. Understanding the weeds

in our fields is important. This guides our decisions about crop rotation, fertilizer usage, and herbicide usage. Healthy crops lead to higher yields and a better bottom line for our family farm. I think more Kansas kids need to participate in horticulture or crops judging. I want to share the ways I prepare for these judging events and how my study guides end up becoming fair First, horticulture judging.

This is where I started. I took the judging test at Club Days for fun. The test included identification, evaluation and general knowledge. We grow fruits and vegetables so it was easy to get started, however, we don't grow trees or flowers and I need to work on them. The past two

years, we focused on studying trees. We go on nature walks, collect leaves and work on identification. The leaves are pressed, dried and added to a notebook that I use to study. I also enter it in the Washington County Fair under the Forestry project. The notebook was a lot of work, but it helped. Between flowers, potted plants and forestry, I also had three fair entries. I have also made a visual art project using the seeds on the study guide. Next year I am focusing on flowers by visiting area greenhouses and community gardens. I am always trying to find ways to develop unique fair entries.

Crops judging is all iden-

tie-breakers. My dad and I use the list and tour our farm and back roads looking for specimens. I also walk my dad's milo fields and pastures to eliminate noxious weeds. We take what we collect, press them as they dry, mount and label them and then add them to a binder. The binder is a study guide and a fair entry under crops. I worked really hard on my weed notebook and it really paid off. My notebook received Grand Champion at the Washington County Fair and a blue ribbon at the Kansas State Fair. I placed ninth individually and my team placed third overall in the intermediate division at the Kansas State Fair. It felt really good to know that I worked hard to do my best and that my hard work paid off.

tisan legislation to encourage investment in biodigester systems, while establishing a market for farmers who already have a surplus of waste materials that can be used for biogas production. This bill, the Agricultural Environmental Stewardship Act, will help expand the market for biogas by providing a 30 percent investment tax credit to help offset the upfront costs associated with building biodigester systems. Right now, farmers across

the country have a surplus of organic material like manure, food scraps, agricultural residue, wastewater solids and liquids. All of which can be used to create biogas that can be used to produce heat, electricity, fuel and can be injected into natural gas pipelines. It can also be used to process wastewater up stream, which reduces runoff and containments that impact potable water in a number of communities, especially those around Lake Erie.

"This legislation promotes a common-sense way to turn waste into energy, reduce

greenhouse gas emissions, create jobs and grow the economy," said Sen. Roberts. "The Warrior Biogas project near Dodge City is a shining example of what could happen across Kansas and America if we incentivize further development of these innovative technologies."

"Ohio farmers are struggling to safely dispose of livestock waste that could be used for renewable energy," said Brown. "This legislation will encourage investment in the technology needed to convert these waste materials into natural gas that can be used to power households and businesses across the country."

The legislation is supported by the American Biogas Council and the American Farm Bureau Federation.

"The Agricultural Environmental Stewardship Act provides an advancement to sustainable agricultural technologies. When biogas systems recycle manure and the nutricleaner waterways, healthier soil and new commodities," said Patrick Serfass, executive D\director of the American Biogas Council (ABC). "The ABC is very grateful for senators Brown and Roberts' continued leadership in sustainable agricultural. We believe this bill will incentivize greater investment in digester and nutrient recovery technologies which will create new jobs, promote sustainable farm practices, and protect our air,

New Kansas State University study confirms possible danger of imported feed contaminated with African swine fever

veterinary researchers at Kansas State University sheds new light on a threatening swine disease: African swine fever.

The research team, headed by Megan Niederwerder, assistant professor of diagnostic medicine and pathobiology in the College of Veterinary Medicine, looks at the degradation of African swine fever virus in animal feed ingredients to understand the potential for taminated feed.

Up to now, data has been limited. Niederwerder's latest study, "Half-Life of African Swine Fever Virus in Shipped Feed," is now available online in the journal Emerging Infectious Diseases. It examines the possible risk of African swine fever virus spreading to the United States through imported feed. The study provides more accurate half-life

virus can survive a simulated 30-day transoceanic voyage in contaminated plant-based feed and ingredients.

"This study provides additional evidence supporting the potential risk that feed may play in the transboundary movement of African swine fever," Niederwerder said. "Our latest work provides robust half-life estimates, which include standard errors and confidence intervals, and characterizes the stages of viral decay over time for African swine fever virus in animal feed ingredients."

Detailed analysis shows that the half-life of African swine fever virus in feed ranges from 9.6 to 14.2 days after exposure to varying temperature and humidity conditions simulating transoceanic shipment. This means it would take approximately two weeks for the total viable virus concentration to decay by half its original count under the conditions of a transatlantic voyage. Niederwerder said that all feed matrices provided a more supportive environment for viral stability when compared to media, where the shortest half-

life was calculated. The new study expands on Niederwerder's previous work confirming the likelihood of African swine fever transmission through feed and can be used to implement science-based management practices such as storage time to

"Transmission of swine viruses through feed has been recognized as a risk since around 2013, but the probability of African swine fever virus infection through plant-based feed was unknown until our publication earlier this year," Niederwerder said. "Our research reports novel data and important quantitative information that can be incorporated into risk models for introduction and mitigation of African swine fever virus through

imported feed ingredients." Over the last year, African swine fever virus has emerged on new continents and spread to historically negative countries. If the virus can survive shipments overseas, this provides an opportunity to infect swine in the United States and other countries through imported feed, which would

production. "African swine fever virus is a rapidly spreading and emerging transboundary animal disease that threatens pork production and human food security worldwide," Niederwerder said. "The emerging threat of African swine fever virus being introduced into the United States is staggering and significant efforts are focused

African swine fever is now considered endemic in China, where the world's largest population of pigs live. Chinese production of pork is estimated to be cut by 25% by the end of the year. The disease has also spread to several other Asian countries and recently to Western Europe.

Are we seeing a peak In feedlot inventories? By Derrell Peel - Oklahoma pected at 98.5 percent of last

USDA reported September 1 feedlot inventories at 10.98 million head, down 1.3 percent from one year ago. This is the first year over year decrease in monthly cattle on feed totals in 33 months, since December, 2016. A larger than expected decrease in August placements, 91.0 percent of one year ago, pulled feedlot totals lower than expected. August placements dropped sharply partly in response to the market shocks resulting from the Tyson Finney County plant fire on August 9, 2019.

August marketings were as ex-

year. August had one less business day compared to 2018.

The September Cattle on Feed report highlights some regional differences in the current feedlot situation among the four largest feeding states. The September on-feed inventory in Texas was 101.9 percent of year earlier levels at 2.73 million head; with August placements up 4.8 percent year

Kansas had a September 1 feedlot inventory 93 percent of one year ago at 2.34 million head; with August placements 85 percent of year earlier levels. Nebraska showed a Sepof 2.16 million head, 101 percent of last year; with August placements down 7.3 percent year over year. Colorado had 0.93 million head of feedlot cattle as of September 1, 103.3 percent of last year with August placements 83 percent of year earlier levels.

Feedlot placements were down for the fourth consecutive month in August and total placements the last six months. capturing the bulk of current cattle on feed, are down 0.8 percent year over year. Meanwhile, monthly marketings for the past six months are up 1.0 percent year over year. Feed-

Does this imply that monthly feedlot inventories have peaked cyclically? Probably not quite... yet. The short-term disruption of the plant fire in August and early September likely delayed some feedlot placements and a larger 2018 calf crop and generally good forage conditions in 2019 likely means that significant numbers of yearlings are still to be marketed in the fourth quarter.

The estimated 2019 calf crop is equal to 2018 levels meaning that plenty of new-

this fall with feeder supplies ample through 2020. It will likely be a few more months before we will see sustained year over year decreases in feedlot inventories.

Feeder cattle prices in Oklahoma improved with nearby feeder futures rallying to fill the August down gap. The supportive cattle on feed report and growing demand

for wheat stockers will likely add further market support in the near term, at least until larger runs of calves and yearlings show up in October. USDA-NASS reported seven percent of Oklahoma wheat planted as of August 16. I have noticed numerous wheat fields emerged in the past week. Some wheat pasture will no doubt be ready for grazing by

"The United States is already the top supplier of agricultural commodities to Japan, and the agreement signed today Kansas Water Office will only build on this great relationship. The agreement seeking nominations for

our state to continue doing what they do best - providing the highest quality, safest, and most affordable food, fiber, and fuel to our partners around the world."

Japan is the U.S.'s number 1 market for wheat, beef, and pork, and is Kansas' number 3 export market, buying over \$1 billion in Kansas goods in 2018. The deal will cut tariffs on an additional \$7.2 billion worth of agricultural goods sold to Japan, under the first stage initial tariff agreement.

Kansas State University students serve Kansas feedyards through BQA assessments This summer, in collaboration with the Kansas Livestock Association and the Kansas Beef Council, several Kansas State University veterinary medicine, and animal sciences and industry students traveled

across the state to perform

Beef Quality Assurance assessments at feedyards.

According to Dan Thomson, Jones professor of clinical epidemiology in K-State's College of Veterinary Medicine, Beef Quality Assurance is the cornerstone program of

the beef industry to ensure safe, wholesome beef from cattle raised humanely. The BQA feedyard assess-

ment program was established in the spring 2009 and focuses on animal welfare, records, protocols, facilities and equipment. A copy of the BQA Feedyard Assessment Guide is posted online at bqa.org/.

The predominantly student-led BQA team operated out of the College of Veterinary Medicine with guidance from Thomson and Clayton Huseman, executive director of the Kansas Livestock Association's Feedlot Division.

Over three months, the group assessed 32 feedyards across Kansas. These feedyards represented 690,000 head on feed. "We have been proud to

provide service to our cattle-feeding stakeholders in the state of Kansas since 2012," Thomson said. "Our goal is to empower our veterinary and animal science students to run the BQA assessment project as a business."

Thomson said students developed a budget, set up a phone line, made a map of the feedlots in the state and directly contacted feedlot managers to set up the assessment visits.

"It is such a great learning,

networking experience for our students and a great service for our beef producers," Thomson said. "It is what the land-grant mission is all about."

To serve on the BQA team, students had to become BQA-certified and then attend a BOA feedvard assessment training at Cattle Empire in Satanta. Students also had to demonstrate a working knowledge of low-stress cattle hanunderstanding of its importance to beef consumers. "Aside from performing

assessments, our team was able to work with consulting veterinarians, nutritionists and feedyard managers, as well as provide training for feedyard employees," Thomson said.

Students on the BQA team said they enjoyed the opportunity to interact with people

who are so passionate about their role in the beef industry and getting to compare different feedyard handling facilities and management styles.

Student members of the BQA team include Jared Bourek, third-year veterinary medicine student and doctoral student in pathobiology, and Arlen Stoller, third-year veterinary medicine student, both from Manhattan; Damon Smith, senior in animal sciences and industry, and pre-veterinary medicine, Waterville.
