

21st annual KCA Convention & Trade Show begins Oct. 25th

membership business meeting at 3:00 p.m. that Friday. The meeting consists of policy resolution review and approval. A mail-in ballot will then ratify the membership meeting decisions. Friday evening is set to include a cattlemen's supper and entertainment.

Saturday, October 26th, is set to be a day full of expert speakers beginning with a presentation on ag economics by Bob Baker, ag research specialist of Executive Intelligence Review. Dusty Turner of MasterHand Milling will then present, "Revolutionizing the Range," educating producers on dried distillers feed products. of Genomics (Herd Genetics Technology).

Things to consider when selecting a winter feeding site

Winter feeding of cattle is a necessary part of nearly all cow-calf operations. The

feeding site is the area that a producer will feed the cattle regularly, providing hay and sometimes grain or other supplements to provide the nutrients cattle need.

When cattle are closely

confined, especially in the winter, manure and wasted hay can accumulate. The manure contains bacteria, viruses, and protozoa that increase susceptibility to calf scours and other dis-

eases such as navel ill and coccidiosis. When cattle are fed hay, unrolled or in a ring feeder, the hay can become trampled and wet, until it is eventually rotten and unusable as feed.

Animal energy requirements are increased with muddy conditions, whether they are created in feeding areas, or just in wet pasture conditions. Performance can be reduced when cattle have to walk through mud, or maintain body temperature when their legs and belly are covered in mud. That extra energy requires more feed.

Lots of effort is required on the part of the producer also, in time and fuel to haul feed. Tractors and other equipment create ruts, which encourages standing water or mud. Combined with the cattle foot traffic around the feeder, heavy equipment creates even more mud, destroys vegetation, and can increase erosion. All of these factors degrade pasture quality and increases the chance of polluting surface water runoff.

As hay breaks down, nutrients, like nitrogen and phosphorus are creat-

ed. When water and sludge drains, these excess nutrients are added to the runoff. Neither of these nutrients are positive if introduced to local waterways. Feeding densely stocked cattle concentrates all these pollutants. It is common to see a "sacrifice" pasture, where producers will confine animals to a smaller area to reduce the land damaged from winter feeding. A poorly chosen site for winter feeding can have significant negative impacts on soil and water quality. A well-chosen site will be on a summit, well drained and easily accessible during all winter weather conditions.

Providing a space of land between the feeding sites and water bodies will decrease the risk of water pollution. These riparian areas give nutrients a place to go rather than into the water system. Designated riparian areas are fenced so animals do not graze those areas and add their own personal little piles of nutrients.

Concrete or gravel pads under hay feeders or feed bunks can greatly decrease the creation of mud. Situating feed bunks and hay rings across the pasture from the water source or mineral will encourage animals to utilize the entire pasture rather than hanging out in small areas creating more mud.

I always encourage producers to forage-test their hay. This is the most economical practice to save quite a bit of money on supplement feed. Keep in mind the animals nutrient requirement, it changes based on stage of gestation and with temperature. Knowing what nutrients your hay provides could save on the amount of feed that needs to be put out.

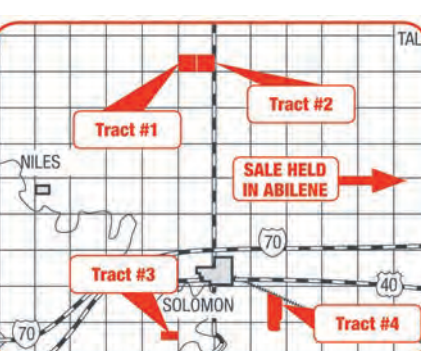

KDA participates in Heartland Tour in Japan

The Kansas Department of Agriculture was among 23 different organizations represented during the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF) Heartland Tour in Tokyo and Sendai, Japan, September 1-7, 2019. Suzanne Ryan-Numrich, KDA international trade director, and Bob Haselwood, Berryton, Kansas Soybean Commission, represented the state on the mission.

The Heartland Tour visited Japan upon the announcement of the U.S.-Japan bilateral agreement. "The agreement is exciting for Kansas. Japan is consistently one of our leading and most valuable trade partners," said Ryan-Numrich. "In 2018, Kansas exported over \$754 million in agricultural commodities to Japan. This agreement will reduce tariffs and put us at a more level playing field with our competitors."

During the Heartland Tour, participants observed the USMEF staff working to promote U.S. red meat and were able to join in on promotional events such as the USMEF Urban BBQ, a U.S. Beef and Pork promotion event with a celebrity chef, and a consumer event where they were able to demonstrate how to grill a ribeye steak and pork ribs.

The group was provided a market briefing by U.S. Department of Agriculture - Japan officials, toured the Tokyo Meat Market and beef carcass auction, and met with the Japan Meat Traders Association, Prima Ham, and Starzen, one of Japan's largest meat importers and distributors. The team also traveled to Sendai, Japan, toured Kawaguchi Wagyu Farm, and met with the Sendai Beef Tongue Association.

Kansas exported nearly \$726 million in red meat to Japan in 2018. "Not only can we look at exports in terms of red meat, but also exports of corn and soybeans in all forms. In 2018, the U.S. exported 40 million bushels of corn and 9.7 million bushels of soybeans to Japan in the form of red meat," said Haselwood. "The

USMEF has partnered with corn and soybean checkoff dollars to promote U.S. corn- and soybean-fed pork at the retail level. As a Kansas farmer, that's meaningful work."

Immediately following the USMEF Heartland Tour, the Kansas Department of Agriculture, along with the Kansas Department of Commerce, participated in the 51st Annual Joint Meeting of the Midwest U.S.-Japan Association and Japan-Midwest U.S. Association in Tokyo, Japan. The meeting is an annual gathering of business leaders from each association to reinforce the economic, political, and cultural ties that link the national economy of Japan with the regional economy of the Midwest.

KDA strives to encourage and enhance economic growth of the agriculture industry and

NCGA: farmers thank Trump administration for listening and upholding the RFS

The National Corn Growers Association welcomed an announcement from President Trump directing the Environmental Protection Agency to follow the letter of the law and keep the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) whole.

The RFS and corn farmers have repeatedly come under attack from big oil and the EPA, including the most recent approval of 31 additional RFS exemptions for oil companies, reducing corn demand

for ethanol and increasing total waived biofuels demand to 4.04 billion gallons under the Trump administration. The announcement that EPA will reopen the rulemaking for the 2020 RFS volumes and propose to account for waivers in the volume requirements allows EPA to follow the law and restore integrity to the RFS.

"We're very grateful the President listened to our concerns and is upholding his

commitments to put the RFS back on track," NCGA president Kevin Ross said. "Corn farmers weren't shy in telling the president that the impact of these waivers would lead to significant consequences for farmers, folks working at ethanol and biodiesel plants, and the countless other rural jobs that depend on this market."

Earlier this year, Ross joined President Trump at an Iowa ethanol plant and pressed that he address the impact waivers are having on the RFS. NCGA has advocated that the EPA use its available tools to account for expected waivers in the annual

Kansas grain stocks report released

Kansas corn stocks in all positions on September 1, 2019 totaled 78.5 million bushels, up 3 percent from 2018, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Of the total, 6.80 million bushels are stored on farms, down 16 percent

Renewable Volume Obligation (RVO) rule-making so that waivers do not reduce the RFS volumes. The EPA, to date, had ignored these calls and the clear requirement of the law, refusing to take steps to keep the RFS whole or even consider comments pertaining to waived gallons in RVO rulemakings.

"The President is finally telling the EPA that enough is enough, they must follow the law, and we appreciate that," Ross said. "NCGA is thankful to our elected senators, representatives, governors and other state lawmakers who consistently pressed the

administration to find a real solution to the harm caused by refinery waivers. A special thanks to USDA Secretary Perdue who continues to be an outspoken advocate on this issue and for farmers. We stand ready to work with them to ensure these commitments are finalized."

In addition to the commitment to redistribute waived gallons, the Administration is also proposing to take further steps supported by farmers, including removing additional barriers and supporting infrastructure to help grow demand for higher blends of ethanol.

from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 71.7 million bushels, are up 5 percent from last year.

Wheat stored in all positions totaled 474 million bushels, down 4 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks of 31.5 million bushels are up 47 percent from 2018 but off-farm stocks of 442 million bushels are down 6 percent from last year.

Sorghum stored in all positions totaled 46.0 million bushels, up 117 percent from 2018. On-farm stocks of 1.70 million bushels are down 23

percent from a year ago but off-farm stocks of 44.3 million bushels are up 133 percent from last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions totaled 46.8 million bushels, up 154 percent from last year. On-farm stocks of 5.50 million bushels are up 67 percent from a year ago and off-farm stocks, at 41.3 million bushels, are up 172 percent from 2018.

Oat stocks stored in off-farm positions totaled 306,000 bushels, up 5 percent from a year ago

K-State Swine Day set for November 21

Research updates are the cornerstone of Kansas State University's annual Swine Day, planned for Thursday, Nov. 21.

"Swine Day incorporates the latest K-State research information on feed, pig livabil-

ity, management, and disease mitigation," said Mike Tokach, University Distinguished Professor and swine Extension specialist with K-State Research and Extension.

"We highlight thought leaders from the U.S. and Canada

on threats and opportunities for the swine industry, including African Swine Fever."

This year's event will kick off with a technology trade show at 8 a.m. at the K-State Alumni Center, 1720 Anderson Ave., in Manhattan, and

concludes at 4 p.m.

The program includes research updates by K-State swine faculty, highlighting nutrition, management, feed processing and feed safety.

Afternoon sessions include a talk by Josh Flohr, technical and production support manager with Seaboard Foods, on the decision processes and implementing a nutritional program in an integrated swine system. Egan Brockhoff, president of Prairie Swine Health Services and a practicing veterinarian, will share what the Canadian swine industry is doing to prevent the introduction of African Swine Fever.

The registration fee is \$25 per person if paid by Nov. 12, and \$50 after that date or at the door. Lunch and breaks are included. Students may attend free of charge if they register by Nov. 12.

As a child, I watched the sun go down over the Blue Ridge Mountains, sinking behind Fishers Peak and Fancy Gap on the Virginia/North Carolina line. Our lives had a soundtrack, and a part of the soundtrack was the song *Shenandoah*. While the Valley and the River by that name were both north of us we were part of the same Blue Ridge Mountains, that great blue wall that had to be overcome in the America's move to occupy the continent. I imagined what lay beyond those peaks – the prairies and plains, the rivers and the Rockies. I imagined the West, as those pioneers had imagined the West beyond the Blue Ridge.

Away, we're bound away, across the wide Missouri.

I grew up, crossed the Mississippi and the Missouri, and made my Kansas my home. Over the course of those years

in Kansas, I have seen the "wide Missouri" many times. In 1993 when the levee was breached in Atchison, I stood on the overlook at Benedictine College and beheld a Mighty River that had claimed the bottom land as far as you could see.

"The Mighty Mo," the "Big Muddy," "too thick to swim, too thin to plow."

America's longest river forms the northeastern boundary of Kansas. The relationship of Kansas with the Missouri River is far deeper than the map would suggest. The Missouri brought French trappers to what would become the Louisiana Purchase, it brought Lewis and Clark to our banks, and it brought the freestaters and the proslavers to Bleeding Kansas. Our Kaw, or Kansas River, formed at Junction City by the Republican and Smoky Hill Rivers, pours into the Big Mo at Kansas City. Steamboats plied the river, bringing goods to the docks at Leavenworth and Atchison, some even venturing up the Kaw. The Steamboat Arabia Museum, in the City Market area, is one of the most exciting finds in American archaeology, offering us just a clue of the treasures buried in the mud of the Missouri. Fine china and logging chains, pickles and perfume, buttons and nails, hats and boots and bolts of cotton – everything one needed to make a home and a living in 1856 was contained in the Arabia, buried for decades in a Kansas cornfield.

When we think of what is wild and wonderful in the great Kansas outdoors, our rivers are a big part of that story. The tributaries of the Missouri define the upper reaches of our state and the tributaries of the Arkansas, which eventually joins the Mississippi, are the arteries of the lower half of the Sunflower State. These waterways have been the lifeblood of the Plains for thousands of years, providing food and transportation, sustenance and sport.

Explore our rivers, and if you get the chance, take a riverboat along the Mighty Mo.

Smear Campaigns

The activist-funded Organization for Competitive Markets (OCM) has again resorted to half-truths and smear tactics to pit beef producers against one another. It's clear that their allies at the Humane Society of the United States (HSUS) have taught the staff some new tricks to help tear the beef industry apart from the inside. It should come as no surprise that they've chosen a time when the industry is struggling with market-related challenges and producer unrest to fire their latest shot.

OCM/HSUS would like you to think our industry is weak, when in fact, beef demand is strong and has been climbing for many years both in the United States and overseas. Much of that strength is a result of programs funded by the Beef Checkoff. The folks at HSUS know and understand this, and because they oppose the consumption of animals, they have partnered with OCM to organize and fund this ongoing smear campaign.

Discrediting the Beef Checkoff and the work being done by contracting organizations allows OCM, HSUS and their bedfellows at R-CALF to build their own membership ranks. These organizations also depend on members, and they're loudest when conditions are at their worst. By accepting the help of activists (OCM has widely acknowledged their close ties with HSUS and it's well known that R-CALF is working closely with attorneys at Public Justice, a group that works closely with PETA and organizations such as the Animal Legal Defense Fund to attack and divide the beef industry) these groups are able to capitalize on the unrest in our industry and divide beef producers. Ultimately, twin campaigns by OCM/HSUS and R-CALF will tear the industry apart and cause irreparable harm unless producers speak up.

That's the point of my response. I've had enough and it's time to set the record straight. Let's begin with the OCM/HSUS claims about funding for NCBA's Beef Checkoff authorization requests. About the only information that's correct is the dollar figure. NCBA was awarded \$27.3 million in con-

tracts for work related to promotion, research, consumer information and industry information. NCBA was one of eight contractors who received funding for proposals brought forward for consideration.

The groups which had proposals funded include:

- National Cattlemen's Beef Association (five proposals for \$27,383,347)
- U.S. Meat Export Federation, a subcontractor to NCBA (one proposal for \$8,279,846)
- North American Meat Institute (four proposals for \$1,953,345)
- Cattlemen's Beef Board (one proposal for \$1,645,993)
- American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture (one proposal for \$698,300)
- Meat Import Council of America (one proposal for \$498,786)
- United States Cattlemen's Association (one proposal for \$359,126)
- National Livestock Producers Association (one proposal for \$99,757)

It's important to note that United States Cattlemen's Association is a new contractor to the process and is an outstanding example of the fact that many industry organizations can bring forward proposals and receive funding for work that falls within the scope of the Beef Promotion and Research Act of 1985. NCBA's critics would like you to believe that the association has the ability, or even the desire, to control the Beef Checkoff and its funding mechanism.

Contrary to the headline of the OCM/HSUS release, NCBA did not "grant" itself any funding. NCBA submitted authorization requests into the same competitive process to which each of the eight contractors were subjected. Submitted authorization requests were evaluated, scored and then reviewed by the Beef Promotion Operating Committee (BPOC). The 20 members of the BPOC then made funding decisions based on the merits of those proposals. It should be noted that there are 14 votes required to pass a budget, so even though ten members of the BPOC are cattlemen and cattlemen appointed by the Federation of State Beef Councils, NCBA does not, and cannot, control the process or the funding decisions made by the BPOC.

OCM/HSUS has gone out of its way to smear the Federation of State Beef Councils. The men and women who make up the Federation are volunteer cattle producers. They offer up their time freely because they believe it's important to represent the industry, to build beef demand and combat lies about the products we produce. The more than 700 cattlemen and cattlemen who serve on state beef council boards are working on your behalf. These volunteers are your voice and they help determine how investments in the checkoff are directed. These volunteers deserve a nod of thanks for their

service and time spent away from their operations. They don't deserve to be attacked by activists disguised as cattle producers.

Now that we've discussed the funding process, and how it actually works, rather than the OCM/HSUS version, let's turn to some of the other smears, lies and half-truths contained in the piece.

NCBA is a membership organization. Yes, we lobby every day on the issues our members identify as priorities, to ensure their voices are heard in Washington, D.C., and we're damn good at it. No, we won't apologize for doing the job our members pay us to do. But on this point, let me be crystal clear: WE DO NOT USE CHECKOFF FUNDS FOR ANY POLICY OR LOBBYING WORK. First, using checkoff funds for lobbying and policy work is illegal. Secondly, our members believe in the work we're doing on their

behalf and they willingly fund that work with their membership dues. We've had some big wins to benefit our members this year and we're proud of that work. We had two victories in September alone, including the announcement of a trade agreement with Japan that lowers tariffs on U.S. beef and a rollback of Waters of the United States (WOTUS) regulations that would have cost producers dearly. Our members feel that kind of work is worth the investment.

Ultimately, this division in the industry will drive beef producers to a breaking point, serving no one but our adversaries. It's discouraging that the animal rights activists have partnered with a small band of vocal producers to give them a foothold in the industry. If we stand silently and allow the attacks and smears to continue, the only winners will be the activists who pit cattlemen and cattlemen against each other in the first place.
