

Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Grain markets had a wild week. We had trade talks, freeze talks, and the October Supply and Demand Report. After some big swings, the corn, wheat and beans had all made new multi-month highs

As far as the Supply and Demand number, the USDA gave us a yield increase in the corn, whereas most people were expected a yield cut. There was a small cut in both planted and harvested acreage, the overall production was cut to 13.779 billion. Ending stocks were lowered to 1.929,

which is lower than the past three years, but that was about 150 million higher than the average trade guess. The result was sharply lower trade, which stopped at trend line and 50-day moving average support. We followed that up with very large gains Friday, which keeps the December contract on track for an eventual move up to the \$4.25 area. There is a feeling that USDA will have to cut production further in the November and January reports, and that eventually we will see ending stocks closer to

For the wheat, the report was a non-event, which was expected. The wheat is mostly tagging along with the corn and soybeans. The charts are looking pretty good though, since we are trading at the highest level since mid-August in the December KW and at the highest level since July 25th in the December Chicago

The wheat ending stocks estimate is still over 1 billion, and until that changes, it is going to be hard for the wheat to do much. We need to see our strong export pace contin-

ue for, well, years really. The U.S. Dollar Index is beginning to test some long-term trend line support, and a failure of that support would bode well for the wheat market.

Soybean ending stocks

came in lower than expected at 460 million. We had lower beginning stocks, lower acreage, lower yield, and higher usage, so it was a pretty friendly report all around. Since there is potential for further yield cuts it is actually possible that we see ending stocks come in below 400 million at some point. The market doesn't really get bullish until ending stocks are below 300 million, so we have a ways to go for that, but perhaps "Phase 1" of our trade deal with China will result in big sales. The Chinese have been big buyers in recent weeks, maybe we will see even more buying. Supposedly the Chinese will buy 40-50

million in ag products as part of the deal. The timeframe of the buying is still a mystery.

On the charts, the beans are looking good. We reached the \$9.35 objective in the November contract, so we may be in for a bit of a pause, but it is probably time to start looking for a move up to the \$9.70 area. If we see big Chinese buying, or talk of a big yield cut in November, the market could do more. Chasing after the bean market on good trade news has been pretty danger-

ous, so be careful. Cattle had a very good week. The live cattle and feeder cattle all made new highs for the move, and the live cattle even finished the week at the highs. Feeder cattle weren't quite as strong on Friday because of the strength in the corn, rising live cattle prices will keep the feeders going in the long run.

On the charts, the next upside objective for the December live cattle is the \$114 area, and for the November feeders we can look for a move up to

Grass & Grain, October 15, 2019 Page 13 the \$149 area. Be patient with your hedges. Beef demand is strong, competing meat demand is strong, and the packers are making good money, so there is no rush to get rid of cattle.



establish foot-and-mouth disease vaccine bank Representatives of the Naan FMD outbreak in the Unittional Pork Producers Council, the National Milk Producers

Federation, the National Corn Growers Association and Iowa State University recently called on the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to move as quickly as possible to establish a foot-and-mouth disease (FMD) vaccine bank. At a press conference, these groups recognized the steps

USDA has taken to establish the bank, but called for expedient use of mandatory funding included in the 2018 Farm Bill to purchase the volume of vaccines required to effectively contain and eradicate an FMD outbreak. Currently, the USDA, which has prescribed vaccination for dealing with an FMD outbreak, does not have access to enough vaccine to avoid devastating economic consequences to the U.S. economy, should an outbreak occur.

FMD is an infectious viral disease that affects cloven-hooved animals, including cattle, pigs and sheep; it is not a food safety or human health threat. The disease is endemic in many parts of the world and would have widespread, long-term fallout for livestock and crop agriculture, including the immediate loss of export markets. According to Iowa State University research, an outbreak would result in \$128 billion in losses for the beef and pork sectors, \$44 billion and \$25 billion, respectively, to the corn and soybean farmers, and job losses of more than 1.5 million across U.S.

agriculture over ten years. "If the U.S. had a large outbreak of FMD, it may be impossible to control without the rapid availability of adequate supplies of vaccine,' said Dr. James Roth, a professor in the department of Veterinary Microbiology and Preventative Medicine at Iowa State University's College of Veterinary Medicine, during today's press conference. "The U.S. vaccine bank is our best insurance policy to respond to ed States. As with most insurance policies, we hope to never use it, but it's paramount that we have fast access to enough vaccine if we ever need it. The funding provided in the 2018 Farm Bill provides a good start toward building up a more robust FMD vaccine stockpile to help protect American agriculture," he added.

"U.S. pork producers and other farmers are currently faced with a wide range of challenges, including export market uncertainties, flooding and other weather events, said NPPC chief veterinarian Liz Wagstrom. "Unlike challenges beyond our control, a solution for FMD preparedness is in our grasp. We urge USDA to move as quickly as possible to establish the bank."





"We have said since the beginning that by participating and partnering in CattleTrace, you have a voice in what an expanded national traceability system can look like in the United States. Our partners at all production levels are the foundation of CattleTrace," said Brandon Depenbusch, CattleTrace, Inc., Board of Directors chairman. "The CattleTrace Industry Symposium is our way of providing an opportunity for our partners and any interested industry stakeholders to share their ideas and

opinions." Launched in late June 2018, CattleTrace is being implemented by a cooperative public-private partnership including private industry, university and state and federal government sectors. While it started in Kansas, the program has expanded with partners in multiple states across the country. During the pilot period, approximately 90,000 calves in Kansas, Missouri, Oklahoma and other states will be tagged with an ultra-high frequency ear tag. As the calves move through the supply chain, minimal data, including an individual animal identification number, GPS location of the readers, and the date and time, is captured and maintained in a secure, third-party database.

The CattleTrace team started to conduct mock traces in late summer 2019 to test the infrastructure and determine its effectiveness in tracing animal movements in the event of a disease outbreak. The CattleTrace Industry Symposium will be the first opportunity for beef industry stakeholders to get a glimpse of the database in action and see a demonstration of a mock trace.

"We are excited to host the

symposium to demonstrate how the database would be used in the event of a disease outbreak and solicit feedback on specific policy decisions the CattleTrace Board will be making this year. This is the industry's opportunity to take action and determine what comes next on the topic of disease traceability," says Depenbusch. Register by November 7,



Study: Farm size not always a true gauge of profitability A pair of Kansas State University agricultural economists have taken a look at the characteristics that make farms successful in Kansas, and have found that bigger doesn't always mean better.

Greg Ibendahl and Terry Griffin reviewed ten years of data from the Kansas Farm Management Association to develop a ranking of several hundred farms based on their economic performance.

KFMA is a program offered through K-State's Department of Agricultural Economics that provides production and financial management information to farm families in the state.

"Based on the farm sizes that we have in our KFMA database, there really is no advantage to being a bigger farm," Ibendahl said. "I expected the bigger farms to be more efficient because they have the ability to buy inputs at lower prices and because they may have better market-

ing opportunities." Ibendahl noted that the K-State analysis has not yet looked at all potential factors of profitability, "but the surprising thing I've seen so far is that once you get to a certain

USDA modernizes swine slaughter inspection for the first time in over 50 years

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced a final rule to modernize swine slaughter inspection and bring it into the 21st century. For the first time in more than five decades, the USDA's Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) is modernizing inspection at market hog slaughter establishments with a goal of protecting public health while allowing for food safety innovations.

"This regulatory change allows us to ensure food safety while eliminating outdated rules and allowing for companies to innovate," Secretary Sonny Perdue said. "The final rule is the culmination of a science-based and data-driven rule-making process which builds on the food safety improvements made in 1997, when USDA introduced a system of preventive controls for industry. With this rule, FSIS will finally begin full implementation of that program in swine establishments."

Background:

The final rule has new requirements for microbial testing that apply to all swine slaughterhouses to demonstrate that they are controlling for pathogens throughout the slaughter system. Additionally, FSIS is amending its meat inspection regulations to establish a new inspection system for market hog establishments called the New Swine Slaughter Inspection System (NSIS).

In the final rule, FSIS amends the regulations to require all swine slaughter establishments to develop written sanitary dressing plans and implement microbial sampling to monitor process control for enteric pathogens that can cause foodborne illness. The final rule also allows market hog establishments to choose if they will operate under NSIS or continue to operate under traditional inspection.

FSIS will continue to conduct 100% inspection of animals before slaughter and 100% carcass-by-carcass inspection, as mandated by Congress. He added that the farms in the KFMA database are mostly between 1,000 and 4,000

"The higher your debt level was, the lower you tended to rank," Ibendahl said. "To me, when you relate that back to farm size, I don't think farmers should be looking at the fact that they need to expand aggressively because if you're already at a certain size, just getting bigger is not going to help you, but adding more debt is going to be more detrimental to your net farm in-

"I think it's more important to keep your debt in check. We're seeing this even with interest rates kind of low. If there was a situation where we had higher interest rates, I think that debt thing would stick out even more than what it does."

Griffin said the analysis considered the influence of five factors to profitability: farm size; level of debt; investment in machinery; machinery operation and maintenance costs; and the allocation of acres to given crops.

"Keep in mind that this

is a simplistic analysis, one variable at a time, which is not realistic because we know that all variables play together at the same time," he said. "But to make it digestible, we looked at one variable at a

"The takeaway here is that it's a good, quick benchmarking for growers to see how they compare and hopefully they will realize that they are not different from average and above average farms."

The full analysis as well as other fact sheets related to characteristics of successful farms is available from K-State online at www.agmanager.info. Griffin said some of the information they've been providing dates back several months.

"There is a lot of stress right now, and stress is caused by low commodity prices," Griffin said. "The weather in 2019 is not what anyone anticipated, and so there are lots of different stresses out there.

"One of the things that I'm trying to get across to producers that I'm talking with is that this study allows you to compare yourself to the majority. A lot of farms were putting more pressure on themselves than

they needed to; they thought they were being outliers or their ratios weren't where they should be. This allows them to get a clearer sense of where they stand."

"By looking at a ten-year horizon," Ibendahl added, "and keeping the same farms in there the entire time... it made a fair comparison.

"If you were consistently a good farmer and ranking in the top five or ten percent of the rankings every year, that probably says you are doing something better than your competing farmers, and the same thing on the low end."

In another surprise finding, the economists noted that farmers who had higher investments in machinery were ranked as more profitable farms in the long haul.

think extra machinery would be a drag on profitability, but it's really not," Ibendahl said.

'I think farmers are using machinery as a cash flow tool, so that when they do have good years, they tend to take those extra profits and invest in more machinery as a way to hold down their taxes."

Griffin added: "If we dig into it, we probably would find out that farms that had more

invested in machinery might be more efficient, might be able to plant and harvest more timely. But we have not tested the hypothesis of whether more profitable farmers are investing more in machinery, or did the investment in machinery lead to more profitability."



those products. Glynn Tonsor has completed an analysis of meat demand before, during and after the U.S. Department of Agriculture had implemented mandatory country of origin labeling for meat products.

Known as MCOOL, the law was in place in the United States from 2009 through 2015, and required food laclude a statement indicating where the animal was raised before it was harvested for a meat product.

Essentially, said Tonsor, "if beef and pork products went through the grocery store, then they had to be labeled. With that (labeling) comes the cost of compliance, which goes into a benefit-cost assessment, and an attempt to quantify the benefit. So what we tried to determine is the impact on the demand for meat of that law, and ultimately whether there was

a positive benefit-cost ratio.

a positive demand development following implementation of the law," Tonsor said. "So if you don't have evidence of a benefit, and you do have evidence of a cost, that's not a desirable benefit-cost ratio," which led to the law being repealed in late 2015.

Four years later, Tonsor said there is "no reason to think" that repeal of MCOOL would provide a measurable boost to the demand for meat products. "One of the estimates we have reported looks that way, but there are a lot of things that change. Beef demand or pork demand could be better after MCOOL, and have nothing to do with MCOOL being repealed."

Recent drivers in meat demand are more likely due to consumers' higher preference for protein diets, and the population mix from ten years ago has changed, Tonsor said. He and his colleagues

the last two or three years have been very good on domestic meat demand, and I am not going to attribute that to the absence of MCOOL. There are other factors that are in play, such as consumer incomes rising, favorability of protein in the diet, and more."


