Kansas Cattlemen's Association (KCA) hosted a regional cattlemen's meeting in Junction City to discuss industry topics and animal health manage-ment. Dr. Dave Rethorst, DVM, of Beef Health Solutions gave a presentation on "Flipping the Iceberg, a discussion on animal husbandry methodologies designed to offset vaccination and antibiotic overusage. James Pinegar discussed his role as a Kansas Brand Investigator, statistics on cattle theft, ways to prevent cattle theft, and finally, actions to take if you suspect illegal activities.

Pinegar discussed felony livestock theft, felony livestock pharmaceutical theft, and brand violations as well as assisting the Kansas Dept. of Ag with animal health emergencies in Kansas. Cattle theft is a personal property crime in Kansas, so the punishments hardly fits the crime. Pinegar explained that cattle thieves can often receive market value for the cattle stolen. so it's a much more profitable enterprise than stealing electronics and other personal assets.

He explained that we must remain alert within our communities. If you see someone hauling cattle at 2:00 a.m., consider the activity to be suspicious. Ask yourself, how often are vou working and hauling cattle during the overnight hours? He encourages citizens to report suspicious and illegal activity to local law enforcement. He recommended keeping your distance, and not to engage individuals you suspect of actively committing a crime.

Pinegar continued that there are a high preva-lence of incidents resulting from the demand for illegal narcotics. He noted time is of the essence when reporting missing cattle due to low odds of recovery after 24 hours.

Patsy, native of Mitchell County, is the 2020 Livestock and Meat Industry Council (LMIC) Stockman of the Year. Patsy graduated from Kansas State University (K-State) in 1977 with a bachelor's degree in Animal Sciences and Industry (ASI) and in 1979 with a master's degree in Reproductive Physiology. After graduation from

K-State, Patsy taught at California State University-Fresno for two years and served as a youth educator for the American Simmental Association for two years. She then



from Purdue University in 1986. After serving as the K-State Northwest Extension beef specialist for four years, Patsy started Heartland Cattle Co. near McCook. Nebraska, in 1990. With the establishment of Heartland Cattle, she innovated the "professional heifer development" concept. From 1990 to 2018, Heartland Cattle Co. turned out more than 125,000 AI-bred heifers that were placed across America. Between heif-

er rotations, more than 205,000 bawling calves were weaned and started, and multiple research projects completed, including FDA-controlled studies for clearance of product usage in replacement heifers and feeder cattle. Through the years,

Patsy has devoted her time and resources to the beef industry. Patsy also served as co-chair of the National Cattlemen's Beef Association Cattlemen's College for 11 years and has been a member of the K-State Livestock and Meat Industry Council since 2011. Tacking onto her industry achievements, she was named the K-State ASI Distinguished Alumnus in 2011. She was also named to Purdue University's College of Agriculture Distinguished Alumni Class of 2010 and selected for Purdue's Old Masters Mentoring Program, which is

university-wide, in 2009. Additionally, she received Purdue's Outstanding Animal Sciences Alumni Award.

Patsy has served as chairman of the K-State ASI Family and Friends Reunion since its inception in 2015.

In her nomination to the LMIC board, the Stockman of the Year committee said, "Patsy is truly remarkable and well known; a good stockperson who has provided tremendous service to LMIC and KSU. When one reviews the diversity and depth of her involvement in and commitment to the livestock and meat industry,

Patsy Houghton ranks with the best of the Stockman Award recipients."

to cattle which can reduce productivity and profitability of a cattle operation. Internal parasites affect the gastrointestinal tract by damaging and irritating the stomach and intestinal lining. The damage results in decreased digestion and absorption of nutrients as well as protein and blood loss. This can lead to further production losses like decreased feed intake, reduced weaning weight, poor feed efficiency, reduced milk production and reduced reproductive performance. Dr. Tarpoff's discussion will identify types and symptoms of internal and external parasites as well as ways to diagnose and treat

the parasite problems. Lameness is leg or foot pain that affects how cattle move. If left untreated, this can lead to lost production and animal welfare concerns. There are many causes of lameness, it can be caused by nutrition, injury, environmental factors, and infections. It is important that the source of the lameness be diagnosed and treated quickly to reduce or minimize economic loss.



As genomic advancements have progressed, cattle producers have more information than ever before to help with their selections. But for some, all that data can be overwhelming and make it difficult to know what information they should prioritize

Experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute addressed data-driven bull selection during a recent podcast to help cattle producers sort through the data. Dan Moser, president of Angus Genetics, Inc., joined the Kansas State team and offered the following ad-

#### Genetic Priorities on Data

"Focus first on the economic indexes," Moser said. He explained that an index is a number that combines trait EPDs (Expected Progeny Differences, which are an estimate of the animal's genetic merit for a given trait compared to other animals) weighted by their economic impact.

K-State beef Extension specialist Bob Weaber cautioned buyers to align with the right index for their operation.

"One of the biggest mistakes producers make with indexes is that they select bulls on one index, but raise the calves under a different scenario,"

ther by citing the terminal index. "Think about it as a steer index because it combines growth and carcass traits, but does not include maternal traits such as calving ease and cow longevity," he said.

In a scenario where those who are raising cattle don't retain ownership through the cattle feeding phase or participate in a feeder cattle marketing program that documents carcass merit there may not be a benefit to selecting on the terminal index because the cow/calf producer isn't getting paid a premium on the calves.

While studying the data is an important part of the buying process, Weaber recommends producers do a visual inspection of the cattle.

"While we are improving EPDs and indexes, it is still important to look at the cattle for structural issues so you know that the bulls are sound and will be able to service cows for a long time," he said.

The experts also agreed that there is some data that producers can discard.

"Don't focus on the actual weights and measures because those have already been included in the EPDs," Moser said. Weaber added that the buyer needs to confirm with the seedstock operator that all of the actual data has been turned into their respective breed association so that the purchaser is assured of accurate data.

"I advise commercial buyers to extend that review of data to the dams of the bulls in consider-

are going to base your selections on indexes and EPDs, which you should, then you also need to be working with seedstock producers who are the complete recorders and submitters of the data.'

#### **Bull-to-Cow Ratio**

As producers plan for their upcoming bull purchases, it is advisable that they know what the breeding demands of that sire will be. Age of the bull, terrain, length of the breeding season are just some factors for consideration when trying to estimate that number according to veterinarian Bob Larson.

"The national average is one mature bull for every 30 cows," Larson

vearling bulls will not be able to breed as many cows in season as mature bulls. "Figure out how many months old the bull is at turnout and then follow the rule of one cow per bull for each month of his age," he said.

Larson also stressed the importance of watching the bulls closely during breeding season to look for signs of their inability to mate.

If there are breeding challenges during the season, Weaber and Larson said that the relationship with seedstock producers in the area will be of importance.

U.S. Department of ing the damage done by Agriculture Secretary Sonny Perdue recently announced a Secretarial Agriculture Disaster Declaration for Riley and neighboring counties.

"Farmers and ranchers are always at the mercy of Mother Nature," said U.S. Rep. Roger Marshall, M.D. "It is important that we provide them with the resources necessary for rebuilding and overcomprolonged severe weather events. I applaud Secretary Perdue for implementing this disaster declaration and continuing his support for our producers and rural communities."

The disaster declaration was made as a result of damage sustained from excessive rain, flash flooding, high winds, and hail that occurred from Jan.

1-July 10, 2019, Marshall has been designated as the primary natural disaster area. Nemaha, Pottawatomie, Riley and Washington counties have been named as contiguous disaster counties and are also eligible for assistance.

A Secretarial disaster designation makes farm operators in primary and contiguous counties eligible for certain assistance from the Farm Services Agency (FSA), provided eligibility requirements are met. This assistance includes FSA emergency loans. Farmers in eligible

counties have eight months from the date of the disaster declaration made on to apply for assistance. Local FSA offices can provide affected farmers with additional information.

# Strong demand, leverage shift add optimism for year ahead

Beef demand is strong and with U.S. cattle numbers plateauing, prices are likely to be stronger in the year ahead as consumers at home and abroad support industry profitability. That was the message delivered Feb. 6 during the popular CattleFax outlook session, hosted as part of the 2020 Cattle Industry Convention in San Antonio, Texas.

Weather is expected to play a supporting role for agriculture during the year ahead, according to Art Douglas, professor emeritus at Creighton University. He said that following repeated El Niño events during the past five years, the United States will shift to a La Niña pattern, which will shift much of the nation outside of the northwest and southeastern portions of the country toward conditions slightly warmer and drier than last year, which will be favorable for planting and growing conditions during the spring and summer.

CattleFax vice president of Research and Risk Management Services Mike Murphy predicted that corn and soybean acres will increase during the year ahead, with corn plantings rising 4 million acres to 94 million acres and soybean acreage rising 7 million acres to reach 83 million acres.

# **USDA NRCS in Kansas** announces Environmental **Quality Incentives Program sign-up**

Kansas State conservationist Karen A. Woodrich, of the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) has announced the statewide cutoff for fiscal year 2020 Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funding. All Kansas agricultural producers and landowners who wish to be considered for this year's financial assistance must apply by March 2, 2020.

While customers can apply year-round, this application cutoff announcement is for all general EQIP, as well as some special initiatives such as: On-Farm Energy, Organic, Seasonal High Tunnel, and the Working Lands for Wildlife. Producers should discuss these signup options with their local NRCS field office to see if any of the initiatives or projects are right for them.

**EQIP** contracts provide financial assistance to help plan and implement

conservation practices to improve soil health, water quality, improve grazing and forest lands, and establish or improve wildlife habitat. "NRCS is here to help Kansas farmers, ranchers, and private landowners make the best use of their land and natural resources," said Woodrich. "Programs like EQIP, encourage management techniques that help the producer maximize their economic and environmental benefits."

Historically underserved producers approved for funding through EQIP are eligible for the advanced payment option. This option allows these producers to receive conservation practice payments in advance of the practice implementation. A historically underserved producer is described as one of the following:

Beginning Farmer or Rancher: One who is new to farming or ranching and/or has operated a farm or ranch for less than ten consecutive years.

Socially Disadvantaged Farmer or Rancher: One who is a member of a group whose members have been subjected to racial or ethnic prejudice because of their identity as members of that group without regard to their individual

qualities. Veteran Farmer or Rancher: One who has served in the armed forces and has not operated a farm or ranch, has operated a farm or ranch for less than ten consecutive years, first obtained status during the last ten

years. Limited Resource Farmer or Rancher: One who has a household income at or below the national poverty level.

Under the advance payment option, such producers with approved contracts may request payments when they have final designs and job sheets, and are ready to begin their EQIP practices. Advance payments provide at least 50 percent of the payment rate for each practice. The funds must be spent within 90 days of receipt, and practices must be completed as agreed to in an EQIP scheduled plan of operations. Producers may also opt to have NRCS pay the contractors or vendors directly.

Interested producers can apply at their local USDA Service Center by submitting a Conservation Program Application (NRCS-CPA-1200). For more information

on how to sign-up for EQIP in Kansas, visit https:// www.ks.nrcs.usda.gov or contact your local NRCS field office.



# Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

If you are an ag commodity bull, you are probably impatiently waiting for the Chinese to show up in the market. The Phase One deal was signed a month ago, so it is now in effect, and perhaps that means we will see some buying soon. There are still many questions regarding corona virus and how that will impact the trade deal, along with all the old questions about quantities, timing, and logistics. Unfortunately, all we can do is wait and see if any trade ever occurs.

In general, the grain markets are quiet, and choppy. We had a supply and demand report last week that didn't give us much market-moving information, and other than the report, there wasn't very much market-moving information. We can talk about the coronavirus, but if the stock market is making new highs, there must not be very much concern.

Soybean and wheat ending stocks were cut in last week's report, but wheat ending stocks are still over 900 million, which makes it hard to get speculators excited. There is a very good chance that we see ending stocks cut further this spring, thanks to good export sales, but stocks are still going to be about 400 million bushels too high to be considered 'bullish."

The current soybean stocks estimate is less than half of last year's level, which is nothing to complain about. The tightening of the ending stocks means that we need more acres this spring, but it doesn't look like it will be much problem to pick up 8 to 10 million acres. If we can keep production below 4 billion bushels, which would be 85 million harvest acres and a yield of 47 bu/ac, stocks will drop again, and we will have the potential for a bull market. Keep in mind that things don't get really good until ending stocks fall below 250 million bushels, so we have a ways to go to get to that point.

Corn ending stocks were unchanged at 1.892 billion bushels. Ethanol usage was increased by 50 million, but exports were cut by 50 million. It was a little surprising that exports were cut since sales have improved greatly, but we are still a long way from reaching the current estimate with only 27 weeks left in the crop year.

On the charts, the corn is stuck in a sideways pattern, but we are at the bottom end of the trading range in the March contract. The \$3.75 level will be critical support going forward in the March contract. Meanwhile, the December contract is testing the contract lows. Failure at these support levels would imply that selling pressure would accelerate and the next major downside target would be the \$3.57 level on the continuation chart.

Wheat, at least, had some strength in December and January, so there is still some distance between the current market level and the contract lows. At the moment, the charts are looking questionable and the March KW looks like another leg lower could start very soon. \$4.54 is the next downside target, but a move back to the December lows could be in play for the May contract.

Until proven otherwise, the recent gains in the soybeans are probably just an upward correction and the market is due to continue the downward pattern that started in 2016. The tightening ending stocks are certainly helpful, which is probably why we are more than \$1 off the 2019 low.

Unfortunately it feels like we are in a situation where if we don't see the Chinese purchase large quantities of something very soon, the grain markets are set up to take a dive. Hopefully that is not the case, but these markets are lacking a bullish catalyst, and without that, the path of least resistance is down.

Cattle futures have been trending lower since mid-January, but both the live cattle and feeder cattle futures posted good recoveries to close out the week. The feeders in particular look like they have bottomed for a while. It helps that the feeder index was up three of four days recently. The next step is for the cash cattle market to at least stabilize. Look for the April live cattle to head towards \$124 and the March feeders to make a

The land market in 2019 continued the plateau trend of the past several years during which the supply of agricultural land for sale on the market remained lower than average and prices for good quality cropland held mostly steady. Looking ahead to next year, will financial stress from lower commodity prices and poor harvests in some regions cause prices to decline?

Farmland sale activity in the first part of 2019 was slower than it had been for some time with late spring and early summer especially void of farms for sale. Planting delays and prevented plantings contributed to the lacklus-

"Despite the slower land market, Farmers National Company and its agents saw a 25 percent increase in acres sold in 2019 from the prior year and the most since 2014. Sellers are seeking the best advice and marketing strategy to sell their land and that is why the amount of land listed for sale at Farmers National is very strong at over \$300 million" said Randy Dickhut, senior vice president of real estate operations.

Land values in 2019 once again bucked the prevailing depressed mood in agriculture to hold steady or even increase slightly in some instances except for the most stressed areas or segments such as dairy. With generally more cautious buyers, some markets saw a move to private treaty listings or bid sales instead of the traditional public land auction.

"The lower supply of land for sale had much to do with land prices being mostly steady as did having adequate demand for quality cropland. Lower quality farmland had less demand and in many cases was harder to sell. Investor interest in cropland increased somewhat in 2019 with several new entities entering the market and also from an increase in purchasing activity by extors," said Dickhut.

Several other factors had a favorable effect on farmland values in 2019. Interest rates remained historically low and moved even lower during the year when at one time, most thought rates would work higher. The other significant factor supporting land values and buyer demand, especially by farmers, was the amount of government support for production agriculture. One third of agriculture's 2019 net farm income came from government provided sources including crop insurance, the Market Facilitation Program, and various other conservation

and program funding. In 2019, the ag industry endured floods, planting frustrations, trade uncertainty and struggling commodity prices. Financial conditions for some producers degenerated, but agriculture overall remains in better shape than expected due to support payments and the fact that land values remain historically strong. The land market weathered many storms in 2019 just like U.S. agriculture as both balanced precipitously on the plateau of the past five

So will 2020 be the year that the land market breaks out of its plateau?

"There are a number of factors that indicate that the land market will continue to be steady in 2020," said Dickhut. "Interest rates are low and are poised to remain so during the foreseeable future and government support through MFP payments will likely continue if Chinese trade issues are not fully resolved. Overall, agriculture is in adequate financial shape, but there are individual and regional concerns."

There are also factors that could have a more depressing influence on farmland values in 2020, Farmers National reported. In addition to ongoing trade disruptions, there is the concern if there will


