

Kansas Wheat mourns passing of David Radenberg

Kansas Wheat joins wheat producers and farm advocates from across the state in expressing condolences to the family of David Radenberg, who passed away on October 9, 2021, ending his 21-year battle against a rare form of brain cancer.

"David was passionate about continuous innovations for Kansas wheat farmers through work at the Kansas Wheat Innovation Center," said Justin Gilpin, Kansas Wheat CEO. "His dedication to our mission will be missed, as will



his joyful demeanor whenever he was in the office, especially when accompa-

nied by his family."

Radenberg was a lifelong wheat farmer in Clafin, where his family has farmed for more than 100 years. He served as a board member for the Barton County Farm Bureau Association and the Sterling Co-op in addition to membership in the Masonic Lodge.

He represented central Kansas on the Kansas Wheat Commission from April 2011 to March 2020, including serving as chairman from August 2018 to May 2019. During his tenure as a commissioner, he supported wheat research and international marketing efforts, including attending the 31st annual Latin American Millers Conference in Lima, Peru, in 2013. At the time, he

expressed how he enjoyed sharing with millers, bakers and merchandisers about the research investments Kansas farmers are making to provide a better quality product.

Radenberg was also a founding board member of the Kansas Wheat Commission Research Foundation. Established in 2011, the foundation helps fund scholarships for students conducting research.

Additional funding for supply chain announced

USDA recently announced an additional \$100 million investment into the food supply chain infrastructure. This funding is on top of the \$500 million announced earlier this year and, according to USDA, will leverage hundreds of millions more in lending through community and private sector lenders to expand meat processing capacity and finance other food supply chain infrastructure. Specifically, the funds will help finance mobile processing facilities and expansion of cold storage capacity, and help producers establish co-ops to brand or market their products.

"The pandemic accentuated a number of vulnerabilities within our supply chains - chiefly the choke point at the meatpacking sector, which has resulted in unsustainable prices for cattle producers and increased the cost of beef for consumers. This announcement is another step toward returning stability to the markets, and NCBA urges USDA to announce eligibility requirements and application instructions as quickly as possible," said NCBA vice president of government affairs Ethan Lane.

NCBA submitted comments earlier this year calling for federally guaranteed, low-interest loans and grants to be distributed to small meatpackers looking to expand, and new market entrants desiring to construct new regional small to mid-size processing plants.

Gene editing in today's beef industry and the future

"The United States produces 18% of the world's beef with 6% of the world's cattle. That's why genetics are important," said Dr. Alison Van Eenennaam, professor of cooperative Extension in animal genomics and biotechnology at the University of California, Davis. Van Eenennaam gave her presentation, titled "Gene Editing Today and in the Future," during the Beef Improvement Federation (BIF) Symposium June 24 in Des Moines, Iowa.

Van Eenennaam explained the concepts of introducing editing components into the genome.

Genetic engineering versus gene editing

The 2009 sequencing of the bovine genome allowed for the development of a 50,000 SNP chip, also known as the 50K. Very

rapidly adopted by the global cattle breeding community, the genomic test result is incorporated in the genomic-enhanced expected progeny difference (GE-EPD) as an additional data source. GE-EPDs are made up of the animal's pedigree, performance, progeny and genomic test result. This technology has evolved greatly since 2010 when DNA information competed with EPDs.

According to Van Eenennaam genome editing allows the introduction of double strand breaks at a specific sequence in the genome.

"Genetic engineering, or GMOs, to use the more controversial term, is basically introducing a trait to a breeding program that brings a useful characteristic along," she explained. "The difference with ge-

nome editing is you can very precisely target any location in the genome for the introduction of a new gene or also just tweaking the DNA within an animal. It is that precision that is kind of new with genome editing, which opens up opportunities to very precisely inactivate genes in the genome without necessarily introducing 'transgenic' or 'exogenous DNA' from another species. This is one of the distinguishing factors between genetic engineering and genome editing."

Gene editing technologies

Van Eenennaam explained that gene editing will be able to introduce useful alleles without linkage drag and potentially bring in useful novel genetic variation from other breeds. There are various advantages and disadvantages of somatic cell nuclear transfer (SCNT) cloning to produce an animal carrying a targeted genome edit. Advantages include germline transmission, confirmed genotype with higher knock-in efficiency in somatic cells. Disadvantages are very low cloning efficiencies, use of a single cell line and not all cell lines clone well.

Van Eenennaam also explained that cytoplas-

mic injection (CPI) of editing reagents into embryos has multiple advantages and disadvantages. Advantages include no cloning artifacts, diversity of germplasm, and a high efficiency for gene knock-outs. Disadvantages of this technology are mosaicism (more than one genotype in an individual), variable rates of obtaining an edited genome in calves born, and gene knock-in is less efficient in early embryos.

"I envision gene editing impacting breed associations and future genetic evaluation by offering an opportunity to repair deleterious genetic conditions, and an opportunity to introduce useful alleles into breed germplasm. It is currently primarily used for single gene or Mendelian traits, and it could potentially be used to alter a defining characteristic of a breed," Van Eenennaam said.

NASS conducts its first hemp acreage and production survey

On Oct. 18, USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) sent its first Hemp Acreage and Production Survey to Kansas producers. The hemp survey will collect information on the total planted and harvested area, yield, production, and value of hemp in the United States. "The Hemp Acreage and Production Survey will provide critical data about the hemp industry to assist producers, regulatory agencies, state governments, processors, and other key industry entities," said Doug Bounds, NASS Kansas state statistician. Survey recipients are

asked to respond securely online at agcounts.usda.gov, using the 12-digit survey code mailed with the survey, or to mail completed questionnaires back in the prepaid envelope provided, by Oct. 25. As defined in the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (2018 Farm Bill), the term "hemp" means the plant species *Cannabis sativa L.* and any part of that plant such as the seeds, all derivatives, and extracts, whether growing or not, with a delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of not more than 0.3% on a dry weight basis. The Domestic Hemp Production Program established in the Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018 (2018 Farm Bill) allows for the cultivation of hemp under certain conditions. All information reported by individuals will be kept confidential, as required by federal law. NASS will publish the survey results Feb. 17, 2022 on the NASS website and in the NASS Quick Stats searchable database. AICA announces Clint Rusk as new executive vice president

The American-International Charolais Association Board of Directors has selected Clint Rusk, current department head of the Animal and Food Sciences Department at Oklahoma State University, as its new executive vice president. Clint will be replacing J. Neil Orth, who is retiring at the end of 2021 after two decades of leading the organization.

Clint grew up on his family's Hereford and Angus ranch near Sun City. After graduating as valedictorian of his high school class, Clint at-



tended Colby Community College, where he was a Presidential Scholar and a member of the National Champion Livestock

Judging Team. He graduated Summa Cum Laude from Kansas State University with his B.S. degree in 1980. After graduation, Clint returned to his family's ranch for five years. In 1985, Clint and his family moved to Fort Collins, Colorado, to manage the purebred cattle unit at Colorado State University. In 1987, he also accepted the duty of coaching CSU's livestock judging team. Clint coached ten livestock judging teams at Colorado State University. His teams were reserve national champions in 1987, 1991, 1993 and 1995.

Clint was named "Coach of the Year" by the Intercollegiate Coaches' Association, in 1991 and 1992. For the past 24 years, Dr. Rusk has helped coordinate livestock judging contests for collegiate, 4-H and FFA contestants at contests across the country.

Clint completed his M.S. degree in 1992 and his Ph.D. in male reproductive physiology in 1997 at Colorado State University. Fall is a good time for musk thistle control

A 2020 Kansas Department of Agriculture summary of acreages infested by musk thistle showed the noxious weed to be well-established and present in every corner of the state. Even as infestation levels across the three Meadowlark Extension District weren't as high as some, it's still a weed that deserves some attention - and fall is one time to give it.

Chemical control methods are far and away the most popular methods of musk thistle control, but there are mechanical and even biological approaches as well. An integrated approach is typically the most effective, but for purposes of space and time, chemical will be my focus.

Because musk thistle is a biennial or winter annual species, there is a rosette stage of the plant prior to it bolting during the next growing season. Fall is when we can capitalize from a chemical control standpoint and implement control practices while plants are still small - and drift potential is reduced.

Chemical control opportunities will likely extend until the ground is frozen and musk thistle plants have shut down activity until warmer temperatures in the spring. As long as green tissue exists, plants are susceptible to herbicides, but freezing temperatures will start to damage plants, resulting in yellowing and curling of leaves. Dry conditions

can reduce efficacy a well. Products containing 2,4-D (LVE formulations were found to be more effective than amine formulations in Kansas research), dicamba (in combination with 2,4-D) and picloram have all shown very good effectiveness. Other potential active ingredients to consider would be aminopyralid (Milestone) and aminopyralid + metsulfuron (Chaparral). Products con-

taining picloram or aminopyralid will have carry-over to control emerging seedlings the following spring.

Fall thistle control efforts should be performed on warm, sunny days for best results.

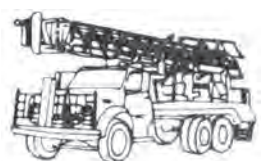

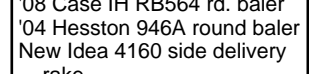

Planning for upcoming pregnancies

Most would agree that planning ahead is one of the best ways to meet a goal and that is true of the cow herd as well, say the experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute.

Speaking on a recent Cattle Chat podcast, veterinarians Bob Larson and Brad White shared why fall is a great time to perform pregnancy checks on spring calving cows.

"The earlier in the pregnancy, the easier it is for a veterinarian to stage the pregnancy," Larson said.

Confirming the fetus development through a pregnancy test will allow producers to group their herd into calving groups, White said. Larson added that cows that calve within the first 30 days of the calving season will better respond to a synchronization protocol for rebreeding.

"With a protocol like a prostaglandin injection followed by the bull

turnout, it is reasonable to expect about two-thirds of the cycling cows to get bred in the first few days of the breeding season," Larson said. But he stressed that if the cows aren't cycling yet following calving then this protocol will not be successful.

"It only makes sense if you have a large group of the herd cycling postpartum," White said.

Knowing when those cows will calve through pregnancy staging allows producers to better plan for the future, they said.

Another factor influencing the breeding success of the herd is the cow's body condition said beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster.

"The cow's body condition at calving often is a factor in the postpartum interval," he said. "So, by planning winter supplementation, we can make sure those cows are at a body condition score of 5

or 6 at calving, which allows them to come back into heat quickly."

White suggested that beef producers review their breeding and calving records to help guide the plan for the upcoming season.

"Use the numbers to

help assess if a protocol worked, and understand that cows that calve early will be the ones that will best respond to a synchronization program for the next season," White said.

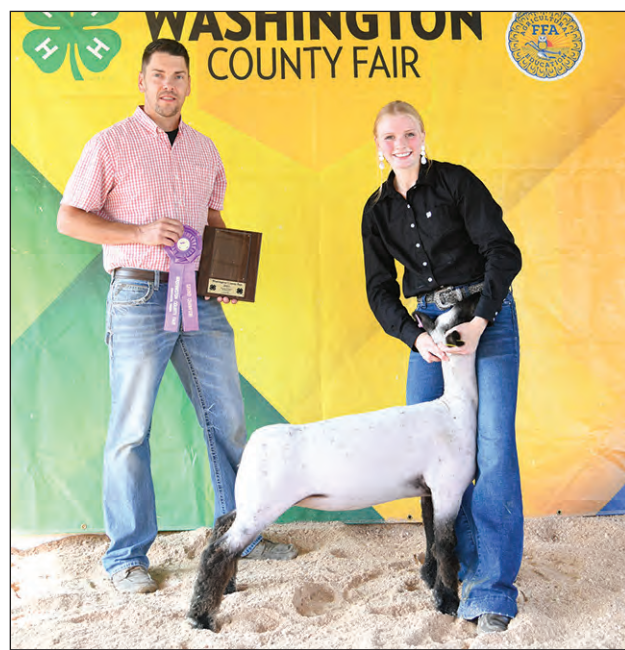

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 Cup White Elmer's Glue
- 3/4 Cup Sta-Flo Liquid Starch
- 3 drops of Neón yellow food coloring
- 1 drop of blue food coloring

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. In a bowl pour in the white glue.
2. Add in the Sta-Flo liquid starch.
3. Add in 1 drop of green food coloring.
4. Add in 1 drop of yellow neon food coloring.
5. Mix in with a plastic spoon.
6. Glue will start contracting and start Looking like a very sticky slime.
7. When you can't move the spoon anymore to blend the ingredients, pour a little (like 1/4tsp) of liquid starch in your hands and rub them.
8. Grab the slime mixture w/ your hands & start stretching & folding it.
9. Mixture might look stringy at first but just keep stretching and folding for about 2-3 minutes.
10. When slime is no longer sticking to your hands and stretching it is ready to use!

North American Meat Institute issues statement on Cattle Contract Library Act

The North American Meat Institute (Meat Institute), a trade association for meat and poultry packers and processors of all sizes, released the following statement regarding the Cattle Contract Library Act of 2021, H.R. 5609, which was marked up and reported out of the House Committee on Agriculture:

"Members of the Meat Institute are still analyzing

the bill and how it might affect their operations," said Julie Anna Potts, president and CEO of the Meat Institute. "More time is needed to consider how the bill will affect livestock producers, feedlot operators and packers and processors. And due to the limited time allowed to consider the legislation, we ask the House to pause and include packers in the conversation, since

the packers would bear the burden of complying with this new government mandate."

The bill must be approved by the full House and would also need Senate consideration before it could be signed into law.

"The Meat Institute and its members will work with the Congress to address any unintended consequences," said Potts. "There is already robust price discovery provided by beef packers on a daily basis. We urge members of Congress to slow down and to first do no harm."

For background on transparency and price discovery in cattle and beef markets:

Congress established and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) administers the Livestock Mandatory Reporting Act (LMR) program to facilitate open, transparent price discovery and provide all market participants, both large and small, with comparable levels of market

information for slaughter cattle and beef, and other species. For more on LMR see this resource from USDA.

Under LMR, packers must report to the Agriculture Marketing Service (AMS) daily the prices they pay to procure cattle, and other information, including slaughter data for cattle harvested during a specified time period and with net prices, actual weights, dressing percentages, percent of beef grading Choice, and price ranges, and then AMS

publishes the anonymized data. AMS publishes 24 daily and 20 weekly cattle reports each week. Weekly reports start Monday afternoon and end the next Monday morning. These reports cover time periods, regions, and activities and the data include actual cattle prices.

Further, packers report all original sale beef transactions in both volume and price through the Daily Boxed Beef Report. This data is reported twice daily, at 11:00 a.m. and at 3:00 p.m. Central time. The

morning report covers market activity since 1:30 p.m. of the prior business day until 9:30 a.m. of the current business day. The afternoon report is cumulative, including all market activity in the morning plus all additional transactions between 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., and is on the USDA DataMart website. The boxed beef report covers both individual beef item sales and beef cutout values and current volumes, both of which are derived from the individual beef item sales data.

BQA training and certification sessions scheduled for November

The Kansas Beef Council (KBC) and Kansas State University will hold two advanced beef cattle care and health training sessions in November. The location for the November 8 training will be Eureka Livestock Sales. The November 16 session will be hosted by the Washington

Vet Clinic at the Washington Sales Pavilion.

K-State Extension veterinarian A. J. Tarpoff will lead the training at each location. The curriculum will include Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) recommendations on animal husbandry, downed animal care and low-stress handling. Those attending will earn BQA certification.

Each workshop is free

and will start at 6:00 p.m. with a complimentary dinner. To attend the Eureka training, please register by November 1 by contacting Greenwood County Extension agent Lindsay Shorter at lindsayshorter@k-state.edu or (620) 583-7455. Register by November 9 for the Washington session by calling the Washington Vet Clinic at (785) 325-2391.

Kansas Hay Market Report

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor for the week of October 12th, abnormally dry conditions (D0) decreased to 24.5%, moderate drought (D1) remained near 11%, and severe drought (D2) decreased to near 3%. Tip your hat to your local co-op in October for National Co-op Month

Whether stopping by for a quick chat and a cup of coffee, picking up fertilizer for planting or discussing the ups and downs of prices, local elevators are a hub of activity and advice for farmers, especially during the busy fall fieldwork season. And each October since the 1930s, the American agriculture industry has expressed appreciation for these member-owned, member-controlled businesses during National Co-Op Month.

The 2021 theme for National Co-Op Month is "Build Back for Impact," reflecting how agricultural cooperatives have adapted throughout time to meet the changing needs of their farmer member-owners. Just as Kansas farmers have continuously adopted new technologies and updated management practices, agricultural cooperatives are continuously investing in new services and resources and improving infrastructure to help their farmer member-owners fulfill their mission.

"As farmer-owners, Kansas wheat producers are the lifeblood of grain marketing and ag retail cooperatives," said Brandi Miller, president/CEO of the Kansas Cooperative Council, the organization that has represented

the cooperative business model in the Sunflower State since 1944. "In the cooperative structure, Kansas farmers can exercise the cooperative principle of democratic control. They are truly at the helm of making decisions and setting the strategic path for their local cooperative through board participation. Cooperatives, in turn, are able to provide value back to members and keep dollars local."

By definition, a cooperative works for the mutual benefit of its members, who own and control the business. Nearly one out of every three Americans are member-owners of a cooperative of some type, according to the National Council of Farmer Cooperatives (NCFC). NCFC reported there are 1,779 co-ops in the United States as of 2019, including 1.9 million farmer members.

Agricultural cooperatives have existed nearly as long as farmers have been farming as producers learned how to pool resources and expertise to support each other's operations. The local co-op is where farmers deliver and store their grain, market their crops, obtain field recommendations and purchase inputs. Agricultural cooperatives also return earnings to their members,

known as patronage.

Outside of this now-standard set of services, cooperatives provide credit, insurance, electric service, health care, housing, telephone services and even child care. Cooperatives also support the health of local economies by creating jobs, paying property taxes and income taxes and giving to charity.

In Kansas, cooperatives continue to invest in the grain industry, including building to meet the demand for increased grain storage capacity, improved efficiency in weighing and dumping time and more crop input warehouse space. Cooperatives are also meeting needs for replacing aging infrastructure with newer, updated facilities. This investment in new facilities and services is a continuation of the proud cooperative tradition of matching the innovation and dedication of their farmer members, contributing to the reliability, quality and value of the Kansas wheat crop each year.
