USDA grant supports new K-State hotline for diagnosing toxic animal emergencies

Rapid response to animal health emergencies has prompted the creation of a new veterinary toxicology training program at K-State. A \$248,000 USDA grant will enhance the ability of researchers in the College of Veterinary Medicine to answer calls for help. The goal of the program, developed by Steve Ensley, clinical veterinary toxicologist, and Bob Larson, professor of production medicine, is to create impactful and innovative outreach tools. This will better enable livestock veterinarians to recognize and address toxicology problems in food animal species, especially cattle, small ruminants and pigs. This project will utilize veterinary telemedicine and other distance-based education resources, including a toxicology call-in hotline for practicing veterinarians called CONSULT - Collaborative, Online, Novel, Science-based, User-friendly, Learning Tool — for common livestock toxicology problems, and YouTube training

U.S. animal protein increasingly dependent on diversified export market

Over the last two decades, U.S. animal protein exports have nearly tripled, growing from \$7.4 billion to \$20.7 billion. That growth is largely the result of successful industry marketing programs and shrewd government trade negotiations. Today, exports account for 10%-30% of U.S. animal protein production, depending on industry segment.

According to a new re-

port from CoBank's Knowledge Exchange, trade policy remains a vital component to building consistent and reliable export markets, and the U.S. needs to be at the negotiating table as new trade developments unfold. The recent nomination of a chief agriculture negotiator with the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative is an important step in that direction.

The Trump administration's harder line on trade. continued by the Biden administration, has led to mixed results for U.S. agriculture. Agricultural exports to China have flourished under the Phase One agreement, but the U.S. withdrawal from the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) has likely resulted in lost opportunities for U.S. exporters.

"Continued diversifica-

tion of markets and products is critical for a vibrant U.S. protein export trade," said Brian Earnest, lead animal protein economist with CoBank. "The successes the U.S. meat industry has enjoyed during the Phase One agreement with China are not assured in 2022 and beyond. And the lack of U.S. participation in evolving global trade partnerships in recent years has put export success at risk.'

Since 2000, the share of U.S. meat and poultry volume exported has increased from roughly 6% to over 13%. Those gains were made on the heels of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and other trade agreements reached by U.S. administrations dating back to President Reagan.

However, for more than a decade, free trade has become decidedly less popular in the U.S. Unfortunately for U.S. meat exporters, the rest of the world continues to make headway on trade agreements that threaten to put U.S. producers at a disadvantage in global markets.

As exports to East Asia and North America have

expanded, European markets have eroded for U.S. protein exporters. Nations outside of East Asia and North America make up nearly one-third of all U.S. protein export volume. And many of those countries are directly involved in multilateral trade deals that don't include the U.S., such as the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP).

The impact of the U.S.-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) has been minimal, as U.S. beef and pork had already enjoyed duty-free access to trade partners under NAFTA. However, revising a commitment with the U.S. first- and third-largest food and agricultural export markets calmed participants as policy makers sought to rebalance trade at the time. As export volume to China has eroded recently, a healthy trade relationship with Mexico is critical.

Access to diverse markets remains vital for U.S. meat exports, as well. For instance, USDA trade data shows that the U.S. exported 650 million pounds of broiler meat to 111 destinations in August. While nearly 65% went to the top three destinations (Mexico, China, and Cuba), 20 destinations claimed at least 1% of U.S. broiler meat exports.

While China has become a growing source of opportunity for meat exporters in recent years, it will become increasingly important to seek global opportunities for U.S. meat exports. This is especially true if CPTPP continues to gain top protein export nations and the U.S. is not a member.

Latest edition of cover crop field guide released

Cover crops are used to slow erosion, improve soil health and capture nutrients. However, from planting to termination, growers face many production de-

cisions. The Midwest Cover Crops Council (MCCC), composed of representatives from 12 Midwest states and the province of Ontario, agricultural stakeholders and universities, is releasing a new edition of the Cover Crops Field Guide. The popular pocket-size infield reference helps growers effectively select, grow and use cover crops. Topics include cover crop selection, cropping system recommendations and effects

of cover crops. Updates to the guide include recommendations for cover crop termination in unfavorably wet springs and planting green into cover crops. The cover crop species section of the guide has also been expanded to incorporate white clover, forage brassicas, balansa clover and several cover crops commonly used in a mix.

The third-edition field guide will be available for purchase in early December. The guide will cost \$6, with a 10% quantity discount available on boxes of 25. Purchases can be made through Purdue's Education Store online.

The MCCC will hold a live, one-hour webinar at 11:30 a.m. Dec. 8 to outline the updates and answer questions. To register for the webinar or view a recorded version later. go online. Attendees who pre-register will be eligible to receive a free copy of the new field guide after the webinar; limited quantities are available.

Supply and demand help maintain strong pork values

An article in Feedstuffs looked at labor issues and plant disruptions leading to reduced pork produc-

Limited labor availability and plant disruptions due to operational issues contributed to a 3.6% year-over-year (YOY) decline in September pork production, according to Rabobank's recently released Agribusiness Re-

At the current pace and given projected holiday slaughter, Rabobank expects a slightly larger 2% YOY drop in 2021 pork production. For 2022, the bank expects hog supplies will remain constrained during the first quarter but will gradually improve.

Analysts for the bank reported that while pork

carcass values have declined from the previous season, they still remain 17% ahead of year-ago levels, at \$1.08/lb., on strong belly and ham values remain supportive. Belly prices are up 28% YOY due to strong foodservice demand for bacon and very low cold storage inventories. Ham values are also higher because of strong demand but also because of labor issues at deboning facilities, they

"Even with the seasonal decline, strong retail demand for pork during the October Pork Month and smaller supplies of competing proteins are likely to limit downward pressure."

On the export front, Rabobank said U.S. pork

exports and year-to date shipments were down slightly in August. Sharply higher August exports to Mexico, up 50.3% YOY, reflected peak herd shortfalls, but Rabobank said that should dissipate over the balance of the year.

Exports to Japan, Columbia, and the Caribbean were also higher, more than offsetting the weaker shipments to China, which were down 49%, the bank reported.

"We expect negligible improvement in exports to China through year end, given the sharp decline in pork prices witnessed in recent weeks and strong competition from Brazil and Spain. But we should see steady shipments to most other top markets," Rabobank noted.

While higher pork imports in August are putting additional pressure on the domestic market, Rabobank said they remain a relatively small share of total supply.

Regarding prices, Rabobank said they remain higher than year-ago levels, up 17%, but are still well below peak summer levels. A 16% YOY increase in imports has more than offset smaller domestic supplies, the report added.

"Overall demand remains disappointing due to weaker economic conditions, but it is beginning to stabilize. We expect further improvement in pork







Federal judge dismisses Quivira water rights case

A lawsuit filed by the Audubon of Kansas over water rights at the Quivira Wildlife Refuge in central Kansas was dismissed by U.S. District Judge Holly Teeter October 22. The organization had filed the suit against the U.S. Department of Interior, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), Kansas secretary of agriculture Mike Beam and Kansas chief engineer Earl Lewis in January, alleging violations of the National Wildlife Refuge System Improvement Act, the **Administrative Procedures** Act and the National Environmental Policy Act. The alleged violations were related to whether the federal government had appropriately secured water under its senior water right for the refuge near Staf-

Judge Teeter dismissed the case against the state defendants because Audubon's causes of action were barred by the 11th Amendment, which generally prohibits suits against states in federal court. She also ruled Audubon had not identified any final action that would allow it to sue the federal agencies, stating the memorandum of agreement between USFWS and Groundwater Management District No. 5 was just an agreement to come to an agreement about the refuge water right and not a final agency action. It is unclear at this time whether Audubon will file an appeal to the 10th

Circuit Court of Appeals.

Kansas State University plans winter calving schools

In anticipation of calving season, Kansas State University Animal Sciences and Industry and K-State Research and Extension are planning a series of calving schools beginning in December and continuing through January

2021 Farm Service Agency county committee elections under way; ballots being mailed to eligible voters

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has begun mailing ballots for the Farm Service Agency (FSA) county and urban county committee elections to all eligible agricultural producers and private landowners across the country. Elections are occurring in certain Local Administrative Areas (LAA) for these committee members who make important decisions about how federal farm programs are administered locally. To be counted, producers and landowners must return ballots to their local FSA county office or be postmarked by Dec. 6, 2021.

"Now is your opportunity to elect fellow farmers and ranchers in your community to serve on the local county committee," said FSA administrator Zach Ducheneaux. "These committees are a critical piece to the work we do by providing knowledge and judgment as decisions are made about the services we provide. Your voice and vote matters."

Producers must participate or cooperate in an FSA program to be eligible to vote in the county committee election. A cooperating producer is someone who has provided information about their farming or ranching operation but may not have applied or received FSA program benefits. Also, for County Committee elections, producers who are not of legal voting age, but supervise and conduct the farming operations of an entire farm, are eligible to vote.

Producers can find out if their LAA is up for election and if they are eligible to vote by contacting their local FSA county office. Eligible voters who do not can request one from their local FSA county office. To find your local USDA Service Center, visit farmers. gov/service-locator. Visit fsa.usda.gov/elections for more information.

About Committees

Each committee has from three to 11 elected members who serve threeyear terms of office, and at least one seat representing an LAA is up for election each vear. Newly elected committee members will take office Jan. 1, 2022.

Urban and Suburban County Committees

Ballots to elect urban committee members were sent beginning Nov. 1, 2021. These elections will serve local urban producers in the same jurisdiction. A fact sheet on the urban county committee election and a list of eligible cities can be found at fsa.usda. gov/elections.

The 2018 Farm Bill directed USDA to form urban county committees as well as make other advancements related to urban agriculture, including the establishment of the Office of Urban Agriculture and Innovative Production. Urban county committees will work to encourage and promote urban, indoor and other emerging agricultural production practices. Committee members will provide outreach to ensure urban producers understand USDA programs and serve as the voice of other urban producers. Additionally, the new county committees may address areas such as food access, community engagement, support of local activities to promote and encourage community compost and food waste reduction. 

Fifer's Quest

While perusing through books at an estate sale a friend found a book about celebrated Civil War nurse Mother Bickerdyke. A passage from Mother Bickerdyke and the Soldiers described the defense of Corinth, Mississippi, from October 3 and 4, 1862. Through the day siege guns filled the air with powder and smoke. The air seemed to quake with "a rolling peal."

Hearing that an approaching brigade had marched all day to reach Corinth without food, Mother Bickerdyke requested a rest for the men before going into battle.

fused "The men heard a strong voice call 'Halt' as they were passing." It was Mother Bickerdyke. "With all possible dispatch each man was given a bowl of soup or coffee. While they were drinking, their canteens were filled with water and a loaf of bread was supplied to each." With the "Forward march" order "their steps were lighter and their faces brightened." To the boys that day she was not only "Mother," she was "the General.

During the night Confederate missiles showered destruction into the heart of Corinth. The hospatients were evacuated to a field hospital at Kincaid's Grove. In the midst of what would appear to be orchestrated chaos a "wounded" musician laying on the ground was overlooked. He would have remained that way had Mother Bickerdyke not made a final "round of inspection" with her lantern. When he was found he exclaimed in a voice that was like that of a frightened child, "Oh Mother Bickerdyke! I am so glad you found me, for it is awfully lonesome here."

At the bottom of the page a note was written in pencil stated, "That must have been me, and I was not wounded but was sick, and she took care of me and nursed me back to life and health. W. Y. Jenkins. Co. H 9th Ills. Vol. Inftv."

Being curious, a search found that Warren Young Jenkins was a fifer in the 9th Illinois Volunteer Infantry. There was much more to learn about Mr. Jenkins.

He published a family history, The Jenkins, Boone, and Lincoln Family Records, in 1925. Jenkins was born northeast of Hillsboro, Illinois, February 13, 1839 to Wickliffe B. and Artemesia R. (Thomas) Jenkins. The family later lived on Shoal

or glyphosate.

Panama, Illinois (about fifty miles northeast of St. Louis).

Jenkins relates many stories of frontier life in his Family Records, such as living through one winter on hominy and buffalo hide soup made from small bits of boiled hide. For three winters having no shoes he wrapped his feet in old rags or sheep hide. In that way he chopped firewood. The winter of 1847 he froze his feet so badly he couldn't walk for three months. Clothes were "flax patch and sheep backs." Hats were made of "platted straw" and "caps of possum, coon or wild cat hide."

Descriptions of Civil War battles were just as fascinating. After fighting at Fort Donaldson, Shiloh, and Corinth, the regiment became known as the Bloody 9th. More than half the men were either killed, wounded, or taken prisoner. By the end of his enlistment three hundred thirty-eight men remained from a total of thirteen hundred sixty-eight. He returned home New Year's Day, 1864, and married Sarah V. Boone February

Bush honeysuckle identification and control to be covered at Nov. 22 meeting By Ryan Schaub, Frontier Extension District crop production and farm management agent

The Frontier Extension District, in conjunction with Ecotone Forestry and the Kansas Wildlife and Parks, will host a meeting regarding "Bush Honeysuckle" on November 22nd at 2 p.m. They will meet at the Prairie Sprit Trail-Princeton Railhead just off Galveston Street in downtown Princeton.

What is bush honeysuckle? It is a "wild shrub" that has taken over the brush understories in many areas of Kansas. Bush honeysuckle is very noticeable in the spring as it greens up early and flowers in mid-May. In the fall bush honeysuckle holds on to its leaves much longer than our native trees and shrubs giving it an extreme competitive advantage. In fact, in the 1800s pioneers used bush honeysuckle as an ornamental plant in the landscape around the house. If you want to promote native species on your property, then controlling bush honeysuckle is a must!

Before you can control bush honeysuckle, you first have to identify it. Ryan Neises, owner of Ecotone Forestry, has scouted the area next to the site and has several plants that he can show you. Once they have identified the plant, they will then talk about a couple different control methods, one being the use of a backpack mist blower and a glyphosate herbicide in the fall, normally late-October through late-November. The other popular

"I'll be painfully honest with you. I don't know what marketing attempts you have in the works, but I will tell you this—it's not enough."

That's how demographer Ken Gronbach opened his remarks during the Texas Cattle Feeders

Association 2021 Annual Convention in Oklahoma City recently. That's because, he told convention attendees, the beef business is going into a battle.

"Don't pretend that the present is going to stay the same infinitely. It's simply not going to happen. You

need to put together a war chest. Once you have a war chest, you need to go to Madison Avenue."

Madison Avenue is simply a term for high-end marketing and advertising, he said. But it needs to be done non-stop, "Because that's the only way you're going to get the market you deserve.

Baby boomers have amassed a lot of wealth, they're conservative and they are dying. And Generation Y, people from 17 to 36 years old, are coming up behind them. Generation Y has more people and they are liberal. In between is a growing population of Hispanics and Generation X, the generation




That's important because Generation Y is now old enough to vote. "In 2024, there will be a 50-million vote advantage (for liberal-leaning candidates). We will have three more years of a liberal administration, then we're going to have two more election cycles of liberals winning, which means another 11 years," he told cattle feeders. "You have
