

## Baxter

Alert readers of Grass & Grain will have seen a recent notice that Baxter Black's weekly column would be his last, due to health reasons. As he retires from doing his column, it seems a fitting time to reflect on Baxter's career and many contributions.

For decades, I read his column in this newspaper. The column was fittingly titled On the Edge of Common Sense, because his way of looking at things bordered between hilarity and lunacy. With all due respect to Waddie Mitchell, Wally McRae, Red Steagall and others, Baxter Black is undoubtedly the most well-known and successful cowboy poet of all time.

Baxter grew up a cowboy, was president of his FFA chapter, and went to veterinary school at Colorado State. He always describes himself as a "former large animal veterinarian" - which made me think that he was a veterinarian for formerly large animals. His experience dealing with agribusiness customers evolved into a public speaking career, and that is when his cowboy poetry came into full

bloom. A long-shot submission of one of his cowboy poems to the National Public Radio office in Washington D.C. led to him becoming an on-air columnist for NPR. He went on to produce a nationally syndicated weekly radio program which has been running since 1989. His newspaper column appeared in more than 150 publications, one

of which was Grass & Grain. He gained fame with appearances on the Tonight Show with Johnny Carson. He wrote or co-wrote 35 books. He sold more than two million books, CDs, and DVDs.

He inspired me. I enjoyed reading his columns and books and was honored to get acquainted with Baxter. I recall when he performed before a packed house at K-State's McCain Auditorium for the rodeo club. Years later, he spoke at Kansas Farm Bureau in Manhattan. On the cowboy poetry circuit. I got to meet him again at such places as the National Cowbov Poetry Gathering at Elko, Nevada and the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, I still recall happening across him in the Denver airport and having a good visit.

What made him so successful? In my opinion, it is three things: He is real. he is gifted, and he is caring. Baxter is an authentic cowboy who could ride, rope, and work with cattle. His poems made oldtime cowboys know that he had lived the cowboy life first-hand. Only someone who had lived the day-today experience of ranch work and cowboy life would have the depth of his knowledge and understanding.

Secondly, he is gifted. He's a prolific writer with an unparalleled talent for words and stories, with a humorist's eye and a creative mind. He is also a talented stage performer, with a voice and a manner that led hilarity to his spoken word. He had a knack for being able to communicate effectively with an increasingly urbanized

Third, he is caring. I always found him to be friendly and approachable. He cared about the people around him and cared deeply about telling agriculture's story.

So as Baxter prepares to ride into the sunset with his columnist pen, I want to thank him for his decades of telling the cowboy story and for brightening the millions of lives he touched. Rest easy, Baxter Black

## **Argentina limiting beef** exports two more years

Argentina will keep in place limits on exports of some beef cuts through the end of 2023 in a bid to curb domestic inflation, Bloomberg reported.

The restrictions cover seven cuts of beef, including flank and short ribs. that are popular with Argentine consumers, the report said. The government is also prohibiting exporters from shipping full and half cattle carcasses, it

Argentina initiated a temporary ban on all meat exports in May, prompting a strike by producers in the country. It then extended the restrictions on certain beef cuts.

# Morel of the story: Online classes will help enthusiasts ID rare mushrooms

K-State Research and Extension, in partnership room enthusiasts. False morels include a number of with the Kansas Department of Agriculture, is offering online classes on March 16 and 17 to help people earn the necessary approval to sell wild morel mush-

The class will be offered online through Zoom from noon to 1 p.m. on March 16, and 6-7 p.m. on March 17.

As their name suggests, wild morel mushrooms grow in the wild, but can be hard to find. For that reason, they are highly favored among chefs and mushspecies that look similar but are actually poisonous.

The classes are intended to help ensure that wild harvested mushrooms sold as morels in the state of Kansas are safe to consume. Current regulations under KDA's food safety and lodging program require that mushrooms picked in the wild for sale must be individually inspected for safety by an approved mushroom identifier.

Upon completing the class - which includes pass-

as approved morel identifiers in Kansas to meet this regulation.

Registration for the classes is now open and costs \$5. Participants will receive the Zoom link for the training after registering.

## Record numbers enrol feedout programs

Seedstock and commercial cattle producers enrolled a record 756 head of Hereford and Hereford-influenced steers in the American Hereford Association's (AHA) 2022 feedout programs. The significant increase in cattle numbers from 104 participants in 17 states underscores the value producers are gleaning from the opportunity.

"I enrolled cattle because I wanted to get the carcass data back and attribute how those cattle perform going back to their dam and sire," says Lee Elzemeyer, a Hereford breeder from Richmond, Ind., who is participating in the Hereford Feedout Program (HFP) for the second year. "As a producer it is important for us to know which animals produce the highest quality meat, while also looking at other traits that can add premiums to the final product." He encourages others to participate.

Participants in the HFP, which began in 2020, enroll a minimum of five head of steers that comply with a specified 45day weaning and preconditioning protocol. They receive feedlot performance data for their cattle throughout the feeding period, as well as carcass data at the end.

Similarly, the National Junior Hereford Associ-

ation (NJHA) Fed Steer Shootout (FSS) program, begun in 2017, enables NJHA members to enroll a minimum of one steer. meeting the same weaning and preconditioning requirements of the HFP. Juniors also receive feedlot and carcass data for their entries and have the opportunity to compete for lucrative prizes by participating in an associated feedlot education program. This year's FSS includes 200 steers from 74 NJHA members in 17

"The growth in the feedout programs provided by the AHA is exciting to see and is a great testament to the progressiveness of Hereford breeders across the country," says Trey Befort, AHA director of commercial programs. "These programs provide a great avenue for participants to gain a better understanding of the cattle feeding industry, while collecting valuable data to benchmark genetic merit and make improvements.

Cattle for both programs are fed at HRC Feed Yards at Scott City, which provides the platform for participants to maximize their profit potential and to expand their marketing avenues by gaining access to an industry-leading marketing grid offered by U.S.

Premium Beef®. This allows participating cattle to be candidates for the Certified Hereford Beef® brand through National Beef Packing Company. HRC offers participants convenient, cost-effective financing options. HRC also hosts an annual field day where participants have a chance to see their entries during the feeding period.

# K-State beef cattle experts talk about the importance of water to herd health

Water is an essential nutrient for people and animals alike. And while water consumption often increases on hot days, it is also an important nutrient in the winter, said the experts at the Kansas State University Beef Cattle Institute on a recent Cattle Chat podcast.

'A cow typically drinks a gallon and a half of water per 100 pounds in the summer, but in the winter that will drop to a half gallon to three-quarters of a gallon per 100 pounds," veterinarian Brad White said. "Still, she is drinking water and producers need to manage the water supply in the winter."

Veterinarian Bob Larson added that easy access to water is crucial.

The ground around water sources can get muddy with the changing weather, making it difficult for the cattle to come up and get access to the water," he said.

Veterinarian Brian Lubbers added: "In the winter, producers need to make sure the water sources aren't

Larson agreed and said cattle cannot be without water very long without having health challenges. "Water is the most important nutrient so in a winter event such as a snow and ice storm producers need to have a plan on how they are going to get water to the cattle," he said.

"Producers who use electricity to keep the cattle waterers open need to have a backup generator for the water pumps in a power outage."

Nutritionist Phillip Lancaster said producers need to routinely check for electrical shorts in the tanks.

'Sometimes there will be a short that will give the cattle a bit of a shock when they drink and they will stop drinking," he said. "If the cattle aren't drinking, they will often stop eating or reduce the amount of feed they consume, so that is something to watch for."

For producers who routinely take water to the cattle out on pasture, the experts stressed the importance of making sure the transport tanks - as well as the pumps

## and hoses - were not used for ag chemicals.

"Avoid hauling water in a tank that had herbicides or insecticides in it as well as making sure the pumps and hoses weren't used for the delivery of any chemicals,' Larson said.

White added: "Depending on what chemicals were used, a small amount can cause severe side effects.

"When cows have toxicology problems," Larson said, "they aren't just sick; a lot of times they are dead."

# **SCOTUS** denies year-round E15

The U.S. Supreme Court announced it will not take up Growth Energy's appeal of the D.C. Circuit Court decision that struck down the Trump-era Environmental Protection Agency's year-round E15 rule.

Now that SCOTUS declined to reconsider E15 use at the federal level, a state-level approach, such as one being pursued by eight Midwestern states, is "one promising way around the E15 barrier," Renewable Fuels Association President Geoff Cooper says.

Another approach is the bipartisan Consumer and Fuel Retailer Choice Act, Feedstuffs reports. Introduced in July, the bill would ensure EPA has the authority to grant waivers to retailers and allow E15 and higher blends to be sold year-round.



# CattleTrace gives update

As of December 2021, the U.S. CattleTrace Database now holds over 2,000,000 individual reads of cattle in the United States for animal disease traceability. The four points collected for the da-

tabase include the animal I.D. number along with the date, time and location of the read.

The organization also launched an online tag store last year in response to the difficulties of finding and purchasing RFID tags online. Now, interested parties can buy RFID tags on the U.S. CattleTrace website and have them shipped directly to their operations.
