# What's the value of heifers in your

I appreciate finding heifer calves when tagging babies, especially out of proven cow fam-Admittedly, my love for that same heifer declines when it comes time to deliver her first calf. If you sell weaned heifer calves as feeders, you know there is a price discount that comes from the lower feedlot performance in the next production phase. There is much discussion in the industry right now about the value of calves and future of the national cow herd. Heifers definitely play a key role in this discussion, so let's take a look at some factors to

consider in deciding a

heifer game plan.

For the cow-calf producer it is a very real possibility that heifers have more potential value than their steer mates, maybe any year, but surely as we reach record low cow numbers. Mostly this comes from the versatility and opportunities heifers have over bulls or steers. Obviously, the national cow herd is made up mostly of cows, with relatively few bulls in comparison, for propagating the next generation. Cows also have the most impact on pastures and other resources of the operation as well.

Heifer calves give a cow-calf producer several marketing options. Here are a few:

are valid, there is the heifer development cost discussion too. Operations need to determine if is more economical to sell heifers now and buy back bred females or pairs later in the cattle cycle, develop bred heifers/pairs or some other strategy. Extended drought, reduced forage inventory and market factors all come into play in this discussion. If feed is short, it may be needed to focus on keeping the existing cow herd producing. There are some tax benefits of selling breeding females versus feeder calves, so consult your tax preparer and/or accountant for advice. Needless to say, there are many factors to consider in all of

this discussion.

current cattle market and the long-term cattle cycle are a big part of this discussion. The heifer calves that will generate the most value are the ones who produce calves when prices are high and then are sold themselves as a bred cow or for harvest when prices are near the cyclical peak. Market conditions and the long-term cattle cycle trends impact the potential lifetime value that will be generated by a heifer calf. Heifers purchased for high prices on the peak of the last cattle cycle took longer to return profitability, when calf prices dropped as quickly as they rose.

All of this said, each operation is likely in a different place, needing to make their own deci-

sions. One only needs to look at a sale barn market report to see the current, real-dollar value of steers versus heifers on a price-per-pound basis. There are other factors at play, like genetic potential of known and tested genetics, versus commodity, unknown origin heifers. Understanding of operational goals, use of a sharp pencil and a little luck in forecasting markets helps with making the "right" marketing decisions and answering the question of the value of heifers. To quote a colleague I've read, "For cow-calf producers who understand and leverage a heifer's value potential, steers are great for providing income, but heifers can be used to generate wealth."

# Kansas **Profile**

## Ray Flickner, Innovation Farm

NASA are studying the landscape closely. But they aren't viewing a satellite image of the moon. This is a group of NASA earth scientists who are visiting a Kansas farm in person so as to better understand the challenges facing farmers in water resources.

The farm they are visiting is a leader in conservation practices.

Ray Flickner is the Kansas agriculturalist who met with the NASA scientists on his farm. He is the fifth generation to farm his family's land. The Flickners' base operation is an irrigated row crop operation that has been in his family since 1874.

Flickner grew up in Moundridge and studied agricultural education at Kansas State University before earning his master's degree. He met and married Susan who also earned bachelors and master's degrees in education from K-State.

Susan became a family life and resource management teacher and served as executive director of the Kansas Association of Family and Consumer Sci-

Ray taught college agriculture classes before pursuing a career in agricultural lending. He described education and finance as the first two phases of his life.

"In 2007, a couple of years after my father passed away, I made the decision to enter the third phase of my life and began tending the land full-time." Flickner said. The current operation produces irrigated corn, soybeans, sorghum and wheat. Through it all, an important theme has been the importance of conservation.

"Conservation and sustainability has been, still is, and always will be the key ingredient to keep farms and ranches thriving," Flickner said.

This includes economic

sustainability, he added.

"As the late, great Barry Flinchbaugh was famous for saying: Without profitability, a farm will not be sustainable," Flickner said.

Conservation and water quality have long been priorities for the Flickner family. Ray's grandfather planted shelterbelts and windbreaks in the 1930s. His father transitioned crop ground to minimum tillage in the 1980s. Ray installed the first sub-surface drip irrigation system on the farm in 2001 and has expanded that system significantly since.

The Flickners have constructed miles of terraces, built acres of grassed waterways, enhanced efficiency of their irrigation systems (enabling their water use to be 40% less than the county irrigation average), and transitioned to a fully no-till or minimum tillage operation provements

They have grid soil sampled nearly 1,000 acres on a four-year rotation, enabling them to variably apply nutrients and improve organic matter in the soil.

In 2019, the Flickner Innovation Farm was created as a site where various water conservation initiatives, soil health practices, and weed management tools are tested on a pro-

located west of the rural community of Moundridge, population 1,974 people. Now, that's rural.

"K-State Research and Extension and the Kansas Center for Agricultural Resources and the Environment have been instrumental in truth-testing many of the trials and experiments," Flickner said. The farm hosts summer field days and winter meetings where peer-reviewed research is shared with other producers and partners.

"Hearing from producers who have taken something they learned from one of our events back home to implement is music to my ears," Flickner said. The Flickners received

a Success Story award at the Kansas Governor's Water Conference, the Kansas Farm Bureau statewide Natural Resources award, the Kansas Banker's Association Water Conservation Award, and even testified before Congress. In 2022, earth scientists from NASA visited the Flickner Innovation Farm to learn about the challenges farmers face related to water resources.

"Susan and I have been blessed with a multi-generational legacy," Flickner said. "We have committed ourselves and taught our children, who are in turn teaching our grandchildren, that we must leave the land in a better condition than how we found it."

It's time to leave these NASA scientists at the Flickner Farm. We commend Ray and Susan Flickner and family for making a difference with innovation and conserva-

They are making these principles work in a way that is truly down to earth.

# Illinois-led team puts cows and microbes to work to reduce greenhouse gases

crucial tipping points on a warming planet, an international team of scientists is recruiting a surprising ally to make a powerful dent in greenhouse gas emissions: the cow. Animal sciences researchers from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign are driving a new project to reduce methane production resulting from rumen fermentation in beef and dairy cattle. The threeyear, \$3.2-million project is part of the Greener Cattle Initiative, led by the Foundation for Food and Agriculture Research (FFAR).

According to the researchers, aggressively targeting methane could help course-correct our climate trajectory on a quicker timeline than controlling carbon dioxide (CO2) alone. Methane is 28 times more potent than CO2 and degrades in the atmosphere within a dozen years, compared to the hundreds of years it takes CO2 to dissipate.

"What this means is that anything we do now with ruminant animals can have a huge impact on warming within decades, rather than centuries. Our challenge is to reduce enteric methane emissions by about 30 to 40% with the technologies we have," said project leader Rod Mackie, professor in the Department of Animal Sciences, part of the College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences (ACES) at U. of I. Mackie is also affiliated with the Division of Nutritional Sciences in ACES and the Carl R. Woese Institute of Genomic Biology.

six research hubs around the world, all tackling the challenge of enteric methane, which is produced in the rumen as part of the microbial fermentation process. Mackie, along with Illinois animal sciences professor Josh Mc-Cann, will start by tracking hydrogen production and utilization during fermentation.

A key step in the fermentation process is the regeneration of a high-energy carrier molecule known as NADH. For microbes to keep producing energy during glycolysis, NADH has to dump its hydrogen — the H in NADH — and wait for a recycled one to take its place from breakdown of carbohydrates and other fermentable organic matter provided in the diet.

Normally, the excess hydrogen from NADH is used to convert CO2 to methane, a molecule comprised of one carbon and four hydrogen atoms. However, the research team thinks there may be ways to redirect the excess hydrogens towards more productive end-products.

"In anaerobic fermentation in the rumen, you have to have some way of recycling hydrogen through the conversion of NADH to NAD. In that process, most of the excess hydrogen goes towards methane. If you shut down methane production, hydrogen builds up and inhibits glycolysis," Mackie said. "We don't want that to happen. Instead, we want to redirect hydrogen into other products, such as propionate and butyrate, reduced fatty acids that serve as the primary energy source for all ruminants.'

McCann added, "There are a lot of groups working on inhibiting methane directly using dietary additives. Our focus is trying to figure out how we actually make it work in an animal and make it more energetically feasible. That's realhe said. "If cows can't metabolize the excess hydrogens for productive benefit and to improve growth, there will continue to be limited adoption of methane reduction strategies or additives. There's no economic incentive."

The team will start by taking a close look at hydrogen production and utilization in the lab. They will take rumen microbial communities from beef cattle that naturally produce more or less methane to explore potential adjustments they can make to the system with promising inhibitor compounds. Later, they will bring their findings back into cows.

"Most of the grant is focused on the basic and the mechanistic side, but once we make something that might work within a microbial community, it still has to work in an animal," McCann said. "We have complicating factors like diet components and how much they want to eat. Not to mention dairy cattle and beef cattle are eating different things, so the bugs in the rumen function differently. So, if we apply a methane inhib-

itor to a dairy microbial community, we might have to approach the hydrogen capture a little bit differently than in a beef rumen community."

Mackie said the project is the beginning of a longer-term endeavor to find enteric methane solutions. But by the end of three years, the goal is to be able to recommend specific amounts of inhibitors that don't hinder or even improve production performance.

Beyond that? "What we'd like is to have ruminants save the planet within 10 years," he said. "That would be amazing."

Institutions involved in the project include the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign as the project lead: the Grasslands Research Centre, AgResearch, New Zealand; the University of Alberta; Lethbridge Research and Development Centre, Agriculture and Agi-Food Canada; the Norwegian University of Life Sciences; Queen's University Belfast, Northern Ireland; Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, Israel; and ProAgni, Australia.



# Food deserts in rural America expose need for broader distribution strategies

Food insecurity remains prevalent in the U.S. with sparsely populated rural areas often being disproportionally affected. Rural communities comprise 63% of all U.S. counties but 87% of counties with the highest food insecurity rates. The primary challenge for rural residents is the prevalence of low-access food deserts, where the distance to supermarkets impedes the ability of consumers to access a wide range of food and beverage options.

According to a new report from CoBank's Knowledge Exchange, the sheer volume of consumers experiencing food insecurity due to poor access represents a potential market opportunity for food manufacturers. Serving these customers through direct-to-consumer ecommerce platforms or direct

delivery could be a relatively easy and profitable means to improve their food options.

"A sizable portion of the country falls within the realm of a food desert and with 10% of the U.S. population experiencing some degree of food insecurity, the market is there," said Billy Roberts, senior food and beverage economist for CoBank. "Innovation in the areas of driverless and drone delivery could ultimately provide food and beverage companies even more opportunities to establish direct relationships with underserved rural consumers."

U.S. Census Bureau data indicates that 27 million Americans suffered from food insecurity as of July 2023. Feeding America estimates the number of food insecure is closer to 34 million.

Dozens of rural coun-

ties have no food store options. Walmart is the largest food retailer in the U.S. but there are considerable gaps in its market penetration. Population density suggests many of the food deserts in less-populated areas of the country simply do not have the consumer base to support a full-size grocery store.

Research from The Brookings Institution finds 93% of the U.S. population—including of people living in food deserts-has access to food delivery from at least one of four major players: Amazon, Instacart, Uber Eats or Walmart. However, only 37% of rural residents within limited-access food

deserts have access to the major food delivery services Significant barriers remain for these communities, often including the lack of reliable broadband connectivity.

Convenience and dollar stores have increasingly focused on foods, improving access in some rural communities. However, low margins may be an obstacle to their continued growth in food sales. Dollar Tree recently pared down its profit expectations, citing an increase in low-margin purchases such as food, as well as issues with shrink and fuel

Roberts said agribusinesses and food manufac-

turers looking to establish a more direct line to their consumers may well consider adopting tactics seen during the height of the pandemic. "Farmers in rural America expanded their own delivery capabilities to meet consumer demand that stemmed from empty grocery store shelves or consumers efforts to isolate them-selves," he said.

For shelf-stable food and beverage, delivery mechanisms exist even if it takes the form of FedEx, UPS or USPS. Fresh food offerings present another challenge altogether. But direct-to-consumer approaches will become more viable as delivery technologies improve. Food and beverage manufacturers could incorporate those technologies and establish their brands as part of rural consumers' ensconced ordering proce-

# Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The grain markets had a positive initial reaction to the October supply and demand report The corn and soybean yield estimates both came in below expectations, which helped the ending stocks estimates also come in below expectations. Statistically it is very likely that USDA makes an additional yield cut in the November supply and demand report, which added to the optimism and the short covering rally. The markets failed to hold all of the gains Friday, with the exception on the Chicago wheat, but Friday's weakness can be at least partially attribut-

ed to general uneasiness in the marketplace due to the conflict in Israel/Gaza.

It is interesting to note that a big reason for the Chicago wheat held onto gains is that we have seen two large sales of SRW to China in recent weeks. In the sales report for the week, USDA



Fundamentally, the ending stocks levels of the corn, wheat, and soybeans are all too high to be considered bullish, but if we do end up seeing further cuts to the yield estimates it will help the markets tremendously. All three markets need to see consistently better export sales figures to go along with lower production. With the recent spike in wheat sales and the steady improvement in soybean sales, perhaps USDA has done enough cutting to the export estimates. The new soybean export estimate of 1.755 billion is very low compared to sales over the past 10 years, and any issues in S. America would almost certainly result in a much bigger figure than that. For the next 4-5 months the two most important fundamentals will be
