# Kansas Hay Market Report

Compared to the last report demand remained good,prices remained steady, and trade activity was moderate. Seems as though the hay market is currently in kind of a holding pattern, after the frenzy between August to December. Most report that they feel feed yards have enough feed, whether it is alfalfa, grass, silage, or distillers, to get to first cutting and most of the hay moving up and down the roads is previously purchased hay. There still is some alfalfa out there to buy but it is pretty hit or miss, and several folks are looking to purchase grass hay, to help get them through. A winter storm system moved across the state bringing much-needed rain and snow to many. Good news out of NOAA's Climate Prediction Center which indicates that we should be transitioning out of La Nina this spring and according to some experts, ample precipitation will arrive right around planting time. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor for January 17th, Kansas areas remain in extreme to exceptional drought with no changes to the categorical percentages. The categorical percent area for abnormally dry conditions(D0) remained at 15%, moderate drought (D1) remained at 16%, severe drought (D2) remained near 12%, extreme drought (D3) remained at 19%, and exceptional drought (D4) remained near 38.

# NCBA, KLA file lawsuit to overturn lesser prairie chicken listing

Texas Cattle Feed-Association, Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association. New Mexico Cattle Growers' Association and Permian Basin Petroleum Association, has filed a notice of intent to sue the Department of the Interior and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) over the listing of the lesser prairie chicken under

Act. This is the first step in court toward overturning the listing and revoking FWS's final rule for both the northern and southern distinct population segments (DPS).

"The lesser prairie chicken only survives today because of the voluntary conservation efforts of ranchers," said NCBA Associate Director

Sigrid Johannes. "Science has proven repeatedly that healthy, diverse rangelands, like those cultivated by livestock grazing, are where the lesser prairie chicken thrives. There are numerous places where this listing goes seriously wrong and we are defending cattle producers against this overreaching, unscientific rule."

University's Beef Cattle Institute. Speaking on a recent

Cattle Chat podcast, the experts agreed that the time to evaluate the udder condition is at calving or shortly thereafter.

"The best time to assess udder condition is when the cows start nursing their calves because the udder is full of milk, and it is easy to see teat size and structure," said veterinarian Brad White.

White advises producers to keep a record regarding udder quality at calving that can be referred to later when culling decisions are being made.

"In the fall when you check for pregnancy the udder may look fine, so it is good to be able to

refer to your notes to make sure there weren't any concerns with the udder condition during calving time," he said.

When assessing udder quality, veterinarian Brian Lubbers looks at the udder attachment, conformation and functionality.

"As the cow gets older. some of the ligaments that hold the udder in place will begin to break down causing the udder to hang low making it more susceptible to an injury," Lubbers said. "Also, producers need to look at the teat size to be sure that they are not abnormally large, making it difficult for the calf to nurse."

Lubbers also encouraged producers to observe the calves nursing to see how many quarters of the udder they can get milk

"If a cow has a severe case of mastitis, it may cause one or more of the quarters to no longer produce milk," Lubbers said, adding that this condition is caused by a bacterial infection in the mammary gland that impacts the teats.

Along with evaluating the udder, beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster encourages producers to look at the quality of the calf she is raising.

"If the cow has a high genetic milk potential but only three functioning quarters, she may be fine raising a calf," Lancaster said. "Look at the average weaning weight of the calves and see how her calf rates. As long as the calf is getting the nutrition they need, I'd keep her in the herd because she is making producers money



# Alex Parker, Circle P Processing

way of describing the creation of a certain Kansas rural business, which is located in what was once one of the first state-inspected meat plants and is again serving the processing needs of Kansans.

Alex Parker is owner and founder of Circle P Processing, a meat processing facility in Waterville. He grew up in nearby Washington, where he judged livestock, meats and horses in FFA. After high school, he joined the Marines.

While stationed in Okinawa, he volunteered at a local stable. A farrier came to trim hooves and shoe the horses, and Alex became fascinated by this work. After finishing his service, he came back to Kansas and graduated from professional farrier school to become a farrier himself.

Using the initial of his last name, he adopted the brand Circle P. He also married Karly. They now have two daughters with another child on the way.

As Parker visited his various farrier customers during 2020, a question came up consistently: "Do you know anywhere we can get in to get our beef processed?" All the local locker plants were booked up for a year or two ahead.

When Parker saw how the retail price of meat had skyrocketed, he decided there might be a market opportunity to

"Full circle." That's one process beef locally. As he explored the idea, he learned that a former locker plant in Waterville was for sale. It was the facility where Alvin and LeeAnn Roepke had operated one of the first state-inspected locker plants beginning in the 1970s. The building had changed hands several times since the Roepkes retired in the early 1990s. Most recently it had been used for seed storage.

With support from the Small Business Administration, Parker bought the building in February 2021. He found that Alvin Roepke still had his original blueprints. Parker used those blueprints, made necessary modification to reflect the larger size of cattle today, and rebuilt the processing facility from scratch. "I used his blueprints

and rebuilt the railing and coolers and everything," Parker said. "That was four months of 20-hour (work) days." He received two USDA

grants to modernize the equipment, including new wiring, lighting, and refrigeration. He designed and built the outside pens on

Using Parker's existing brand name, the facility opened as Circle P Processing on June 14, 2021. It began as strictly a custom processing plant for individuals until he could get the necessary inspection for him to do commercial processing. The Kansas cessing is plant #6 once again. Circle P Processing continues to grow, processing beef, pork, and even bison and yak. "We've worked with the Kansas State University meat science program," Parker said. "(Professor) Liz Boyle has been really informative."

Parker continues to help his father-in-law run cattle, which gives him an appreciation for the producer perspective.

"Something we do that's unique is that I will weigh the animal's live weight, hanging weight, and the product weight," he said. This provides key information which can be useful feedback to the cattle producer.

"I want to get more data points back to the producer so that he can adjust with genetics or nutrition to get a better product. I also have my own numbering system so that the customer can view the individual carcass."

Circle P Processing customers have taken their product home to as far away as Michigan, Arizona, and Nashville, Tennessee. "Kansas beef just tastes better," Parker said. It's a remarkable ac-

complishment for a business in the rural community of Waterville, population 658 people. Now, that's For more information,



ment. For this reason, the AGE continues its Scale and Rail Contest and Steer Challenge. These two projects provide the information and funds necessary to generate data sets to advance Gelbvieh carcass merit. # Plant-based products can harbor the same pathogens as meat, USDA says

The growth of plant-based alternatives is due in part to a belief that plant-based products are healthier than animal meat and less susceptible to pathogens like E. coli, Salmonella and others. However, plant-based products can harbor the same pathogens as real meat, according to Agricultural Research Service (ARS) scientists.

Anna Porto-Fett, scientist at the ARS Eastern Regional Research Center's (ERRC) Food Safety and Intervention Technologies Research unit, says many consumers believe plant-based burgers are not raw since they contain plant material, and some plants can be eaten raw. "In reality, plants often harbor high levels of foodborne pathogens and, as such, plant-based burgers should be considered and handled just like raw ground beef, for

The November exports of U.S. pork were the largest of 2022 in both volume and value, according to data released by USDA and compiled by the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF).

Pork exports to Mexico set another value record in November, topping \$200 million for the second consecutive month, and volume was record-large at 87,809 mt.

Overall results were also bolstered by excellent growth in variety meat exports, which were up more than 25% year-over-year at just over 50,000 mt, valued at \$116.9 million - up 21% and the fourth highest on record, driven by growth to China and Mexico.

NPB also analyzes trade data YTD compared to the five-year averages and with and without China - an important perspective as the world looks to normalize trade trends after a global pandemic.

Nevertheless, plantbased products might contain these pathogens if they were processed with contaminated raw materials or in a poor-quality processing environment.

# Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

The March corn started last week under pressure, but found support at the 50-day moving average, then managed to post four consecutive higher highs on the chart. The March contract is now in position to challenge the post report high made

on 18th. Taking out that level would give us a fresh multi-month high and put the bulls in control of the market.

While the March corn in on the verge of a breakout to the upside, the opposite is the case for the new crop December contract, which looks like it may be on the verge of a new multimonth low. We have seen about two months of bull spreading in the corn market and the March contract is now 96 cents over the December. The old crop contracts are still being supported by the strong basis and the recent improvements in the export market, while the fears of expanded acreage and a big crop weigh on the new crop. Last year the March – December spread got out to \$1.40, and it is certainly conceivable that we could see something similar this year.

The March KW futures made the first close above the 50-day moving average since November 15th, which looks promising on the chart. Funds are net short wheat, and this is a good technical reason to start covering those positions. The next major technical hurdle is the

\$8.95 area, which we could see a test of in the next week or so.

Fundamentally, drought conditions have improved a little in parts of the HRW Belt, but so have export sales. Demand has been lacking for quite a while, so the recent improvement was much needed. If we could sell 15 million bushels or more a week like we have been, USDA would be forced to increase the export estimate and cut ending stocks. Since the new crop isn't going to be big, it would mean we have another year of relatively tight supplies. As long as there is war in Ukraine, our supplies aren't growing, and we have decent demand, the wheat market will remain on solid footing.

Soybeans futures keep being whipped around by the ever changing headlines. Between worrving about Argentine weather, which has improved greatly, and export sales, which were supposed to dry up, but definitely haven't, traders don't know which way to go. March soybean chart now either suggests a new contract high is imminent, or we are working on a head and shoulders top. The picture is far from clear. but with a couple more weeks of big export sales, and the Chinese economy perhaps really opening up, the bulls may have the advantage for the time being. The bears need the export sales to stop soon if they are going to get the market

to roll over.

April live cattle were higher for the week, but Thursday's sell off really killed the upward momentum. Our showlist numbers were much tighter than the week prior and year ago levels, which gave us some hope the cash market would be firmer, but that was not the case, so we lacked a big incentive for the futures to shoot

higher.

gest we have a chance at the April making a new contract high, but we need help from the cash market.

Feeder cattle were strong on Monday when the corn was weak, but after that was a sideways, choppy, affair. March feeders stalled out just below the 50-day moving average, which looks ominous, and the August contract stalled out just below the contract highs. Consider bear spreading this market.
