The Bennington State Bank celebrates 135th anniversary first expanded in 1986.

In 1887, the Bennington State Bank became one of the first banks chartered by the State of Kansas. What started as a single-branch operation in the small town of Bennington has grown these past 135 years into an expansive operation with nine locations in eight Kansas communities. While that growth story may be impressive, president and CEO Darren Gragg said it has also been with intentional focus on customers, employees and communities. The Bank, he said, will never grow beyond its means to do business face-to-face and to develop deep-seated relationships in the communities it serves. "It's about the value of the conversation," Gragg said. "Most banks want to get that loan booked and move on to the next one as fast as they can. We're the opposite. The quality of those conversations and our willingness to spend the time is what's been important to us." That model speaks to the Bank's legacy of being locally owned and operated for its entire 135-year existence. It also speaks directly, Gragg said, to the lessons taught for 55 years and counting by Mike Berkley. On December 1,1967, Berkley and his seven siblings purchased the Bennington State Bank from their parents and uncles, who had owned the Bank since 1945. The family tapped

Berkley to run the operation, though he initially agreed to do so under the condition that he'd only be there a few years. "I had just gotten out of law school and was working in Denver for a CPA firm, Berkley recalled. "I liked it in Denver, and I was planning on getting a CPA certificate. My plans were eventually to come to Sali-

na and practice law." Fifty-five years later, while now retired, he chairs the Bank's board of directors. He never practiced law, as banking became his lifelong business endeavor.

When Berkley took control of the Bank in 1967, it had assets of about \$5 million. Today, total assets are approaching \$1 billion. Through it all, the Bennington State Bank has maintained strong capital and holds a fivestar rating by Bauer Financial, the nation's leading independent bank rating firm. Berkley and team adding a branch in Minneapolis. Then in 1989, they opened their first Salina branch on 9th Street and moved the Bank's charter to Salina. They opened a second Salina location in 1995 on Ohio Street. The Wamego branch opened in 2004, followed by Sylvan Grove in 2010, Lucas in 2011, Abilene in 2021 and Wichita in January of this year. The Bank has also significantly expanded its Trust and Wealth Management Division over the past eight years to over \$380 million in assets under management. Berkley attributed the Bank's growth and ongoing success to investing in people and communities. He said that while the Bank's portfolio may have included more risk than other banks would tolerate, he's always seen the value in erring on the side of helping his fellow community members. "Seeing somebody who was maybe turned down at other banks go on to be successful, that's very rewarding," Berkley said. "I think our customers and communities realize that we're going to work with them. Just because they have a bad year or two, they know we are not going to cut and run." Gragg credited Berkley with also having the foresight to retain talented employees by investing

about ten years into his ownership, Berkley instituted an Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP) that allows staff members the opportunity to own shares in the Bank and participate in the Bank's financial success. This program is completely bank funded on behalf of participants. "In my heart, one thing that I always felt wrong about was when you would see a retirement picture where the person gets a plaque and a thank you for 20 years or more of service," Berkley said. "And you know what, that kind of bothered Mike Berkley. So I promoted that we start the ESOP." Gragg said that in 2022, more than 100 participants owned Bank stock through the program, which owns 10% of the Bank. Additionally, in 2016, the Bank began a program to sell stock directly to an employee. Today, ten employees together own more than 3% of the Bank, outside the ESOP. With 135 years now in the books and a 55-years-and-counting career for its chairman, the Bennington State Bank has history on its side. "The key to the future is to not outsmart your common sense," Gragg stated. "Our goal is to continue to improve on the foundation Mike has put in place while staying true to the principles that have made

in their wellbeing. In 1978, BSB successful." EPA and Army finalize rule establishing definition of WOTUS and restoring fundamental water protections

Last Friday the U.S. **Environmental Protection** Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Department of the Army (the agencies) announced a final rule establishing a durable definition of "waters of the United States" (WOTUS) to reduce uncertainty from changing regulatory definitions, protect people's health, and support economic opportunity. The final rule restores water protections that were in place prior to 2015 under the Clean Water Act for traditional naviga-


well as upstream water resources that significantly affect those waters. It will take effect 60 days after it is published in the Federal Register.

"When Congress passed the Clean Water Act 50 years ago, it recognized that protecting our waters is essential to ensuring healthy communities and a thriving economy," said EPA Administrator Michael S. Regan in a statement after the announcement. "Following extensive stakeholder enprevious rules, EPA is working to deliver a durable definition of WOTUS that safeguards our nation's waters, strengthens economic opportunity, and protects people's health while providing greater certainty for farmers, ranchers, and landown-

"This final rule recognizes the essential role of the nation's water resources in communities across the nation," said Assistant Secretary of the Army for Civil Works Michael L. Connor. "The rule's clear and supportable definition of waters of the United States will allow for more efficient and effective implementation and provide the clarity long desired by farmers, industry, environmental organizations, and other stakeholders."

The subject of WOTUS has long been a concern for agriculture producers. In April 2022, National Association of Wheat Growers filed an amicus brief along with other agriculture groups in the Supreme Court case, which is examining the scope of federal jurisdiction as a Water of the United States under the Clean Water Act. "The National Association of Wheat Growers (NAWG) is deeply concerned that the EPA and U.S. Army Corps rushed to get this revised definition out prior to the end of the year instead of waiting for the decision in the Sackett case before the Supreme Court," said NAWG CEO, Chandler Goule. "While we continue reviewing the final rule, since the rulemaking process was announced last year, NAWG has stressed that farmers need clarity regarding jurisdiction, recognize important agricultural water features, and more long-term certainty from the courts and administrations."

"It's extremely disappointing to see the Biden Administration move forward with a new WOTUS rule before the U.S. Supreme Court has had a chance to review the previous, Trump-era rule," said Senator Roger Marshall. "The EPA's new rule has significant flaws and will allow the agency to operate well outside of its jurisdiction. Today's announcement will amount to another massive land grab by this Administration."







Sen. Marshall, colleagues unveil bicameral measure nullifying lesser prairie-chicken listing

U.S. senators Roger Marshall, M.D., Jerry Moran (KS), James Inhofe (OK), and James Lankford (OK), along with U.S. representatives Tracey Mann (KS-01), Jake LaTurner (KS-02), Ron Estes (KS-03), Markwayne Mullin (OK-02), Frank Lucas (OK-03), and Stephanie Bice (OK-05) have officially introduced a Congressional Review Act (CRA) joint resolution of disapproval in their respective chambers to strike down the Biden administration's recent listing of the lesser prairie-chicken (LPC) under the Endangered Species Act (ESA). If the CRA resolution is enacted, the measure would prevent the listing from having any force or effect.

"The recent listing of the lesser prairie-chicken is terrible for Kansas' economy but great for the climate activists who have way too much influence over President Biden. Private property in the LPC range might as well be federal lands if this egregious policy goes into effect," said Marshall. "While high inflation is the greatest challenge facing our nation, this listing will increase financial difficulties for the Kansans who raise cattle for your hamburgers and drill oil for your gasoline. This president says lowering costs is a priority, but yet again he is making decisions that will do the exact op-

posite." "The decision to list the lesser prairie-chicken as threatened will negatively impact crucial industries in our state and place unnecessary restrictions on farmers, ranchers and energy producers," said Moran. "Kansas and surrounding states have contributed millions of public and private dollars to successfully conserve the habitat area and increase the population of the bird. Listing of the lesser prairie-chicken will harm our state's wildlife conservation efforts in the future by removing any incentive for similar local efforts."

"I was extremely disappointed to learn the Fish and Wildlife Service has decided to list the lesser prairie chicken under the Endangered Species Act (ESA)," Inhofe said. "I have emphasized time and again the harm this listing will have on Americans, especially those in our agriculture and oil and gas industry. The reality is that this listing is also

entirely unnecessary due to successful conservation efforts benefiting the LPC and its habitat. I am glad to join my colleagues in introducing a resolution that would overturn the unnecessary listing of the LPC under the ESA."

"The Endangered Species Act is being used as a tool for a federal takeover of energy, agriculture, and commerce in my great state," said Lankford. "Oklahoma energy, agriculture, and construction companies have cooperated with the federal process to recover the Lesser Prairie Chicken and prevent its listing under the Endangered Species Act. Now Fish and Wildlife is moving to list the Chicken under the Act, which would create new requirements-no longer voluntary - for Oklahomans and other states. I remain opposed to listing the Chicken under the ESA, which is why I'm standing up with our neighbors in Kansas and elsewhere against this rule."

"I refuse to sit idly by while the United States Fish and Wildlife Service imposes burdensome regulations on producers with no input from Congress," said Mann. "The designation of the lesser prairie-chicken as a threatened species in places like Kansas is unacceptable. This resolution calls for an absolute refusal of this rule, which should have no force or effect until Congress is consulted. At a time when inflation is at a 40-year high and families are struggling to fuel their cars while keeping food on their tables, we should be working to eliminate barriers for the agriculture and energy sectors. not hamstringing hardworking Americans with government overreach. Since this rule threatens the livelihoods of the men and women who feed, fuel, and clothe us all, I hope that all my colleagues in Congress will join me in refusing to accept it."

"Agriculture and energy producers in Kansas are already suffering from the Biden Administration's failed policies and burdensome government regulations," said La-Turner. "The decision by Washington bureaucrats to designate the lesser prairie-chicken as an endangered species is completely unnecessary as landowner and state-level efforts to restore the LPC habitat have been successful. All this reckless listing will do is create additional red tape making it more difficult for hard-working Kansans to succeed."

"Time and again we've seen the Biden administration assert their overreaching and burdensome regulations on the lives of hardworking Kansans. The recent classification of the lesser prairie-chicken is another example of using Washington bureaucrats to dictate how Kansans live and work. The farmers, ranchers and energy producers of the Midwest have made great strides in conserving our land and protecting our natural resources. Now it's necessary for Congress to rein in these out-of-control regulators and restore the rights of Kansas ranchers and energy producers," said Estes.

"Once again, the federal government is playing its 20-year back-and-forth game, re-listing the lesser prairie chicken as "endangered" under the Endangered Species Act," Mullin said. "I firmly believe that the radical environmentalists are doing all they can to hinder energy independence and production in Oklahoma. We do not need the federal government interfering in state business ¬– this is not a one-size-fitsall solution. Our farmers, ranchers, and domestic producers deserve better."

"I am extremely frustrated at the actions of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service listing the lesser prairie-chicken under the Endangered Species Act," said Lucas. "The Fish and Wildlife Service's listing of the lesser prairie-chicken creates an unnecessary and burdensome layer of regulation on Oklahoma's agriculture and oil and gas industry, despite strong conservation efforts by farmers, ranchers, and landowners in Oklahoma and other states. In fact, the extensive conservation measures that were developed by states, landowners, and industry stakeholders has benefited the lesser prairie-chicken and the population of the species has increased by more than 50 percent since the Fish and Wildlife Service began their process. I'm proud to join my colleagues across Oklahoma and Kansas in introducing this legislation to strike down the Biden Administration's illogical action's listing the lesser prairie-chicken under the Endangered Species Act."

air land lease workshops to be held in southeast Kansas

Nearly fifty percent of all crop and pasture land is leased. The vast majority are verbal leases and were agreed upon long ago. This can create a great number of problems, a big one being when it comes to estate planning. The following scenario happens entirely too often. A (mostly) retired farmer or land owner dies, the

estate is settled, and then the surviving family has no idea what the leases of the farm ground are. More often than not, everyone has already moved away from what was once the family farm. In the end, the family wants to know what is fair to the leasing farmer, but still make the most rent or crop share profit. The only good solution is to get these leases in writing now, not only for the next generation, but also for the landlord to protect their assets and for the farmers and ranchers to protect their businesses

What's in a Good Lease?

If at all possible, the first step in creating an agriculture lease is to know what lease is currently held. To get this information, you will have to ask the person who made the lease what the contract details are. If you are lucky, the details are already down in a written contract. If you are that person, then do your family a favor and write the contract details down. Whether writing down a verbal contract or starting

tract, the following contract details are import-

Contracting parties: This might seem simple but often farmers have shared operations and multiple family members can own land. A land contract is not automatically transferred when a farmer retires and the farming partner takes over.

Property Description: The legal boundaries can be determined at the county deeds office and is required for a proper contract.

General Terms of the Lease: Pretty cut and dry terms like dates on the contract, no subleasing, right of entry, etc. It is important to detail hunting rights, as well as road and fence repair obligations.

Payments and Due Date: Payments of cash rent and the date in which payments are to be made by.

Land Use: This is the meat and potatoes and by far the biggest part of the contract. This will be the hardest part for people not familiar ly in crop share agreements as it will contain the percentages; expenses and income. Sometimes a landlord will designate a specific practice such as cover crops, tillage, or conservation practices.

Maintenance: Who is responsible for fencing, conservation. noxious weeds, repairs and general maintenance?

Hunting: Who can hunt on the land and can the land be leased to hunt-

Examples of agricultural contracts can be found on agmanager.info or other state Extension websites. Even though many are fill in the blank, it is ideal to have a legal professional look them over.

What is a 'Fair' Lease? Determining 'what is fair' for cash rent or for a crop share can be difficult. Data is collected from yearly surveys to determine average cash rents. which can be a starting point. However, the data does not differentiate between land types; upland or bottomland, native or fescue, or state of condition. In addition, not many people submit completed surveys so rental rate averages are sparse and variable. For crop share. the question is who pays for what and in what percentages.

The majority of crop share contracts in southeast Kansas are on a one-third: two-third ratio basis. Data from surveys about leasing agreements were collected last year. Seventy-five to one-hundred percent of the onethird: two-third contracts split fertilizer costs, depending on crop type. Splitting herbicide cost was more common in soybeans and wheat than it was in corn, and splitting insecticide cost was less common in each crop type. Looking at the arrangements from the rest of the state, splitting of fertilizer and herbicide costs is common in one-third: two-third agreements. For sixty-forty and fifty-fifty arrangements, nearly all split fertilizer, herbicide. and pesticide are split

makes sense because the landlord should cover more costs as they receive a higher percentage of the crop. The surveys do not ask about liming costs, which are often split fifty-fifty by the landlord and farmer, no matter the crop share percentages.

In the end, what is fair is subjective, and the data that we use to determine what is common or fair isn't always statistically robust because so few turn in the land use surveys. Forming a well written lease and telling family members about the lease details will always be helpful later on. Statistics on rental rates, crop share agreements, and blank contracts can all be found on K-State Research and Extensions Economics Website, agmanager.info.


