

Consumer demand for beef remains strong, new report shows

The new "Today's Beef Consumer" report from the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) shows demand for beef continues to remain strong.

According to the report, more than two-thirds of consumers reportedly eat beef on a weekly basis, or more. Inflation is certainly top of mind and more

than three-quarters of consumers, 78 percent, report noticing an increase in the price of food whether at retail or foodservice.

However, in the "food at home category," beef has experienced far lower levels of inflation when compared to other proteins. In 2022, fresh ground beef accounted for 50

percent of volume of beef sales. This trend is expected to continue as a recent survey found that 20 percent of consumers say they plan to purchase more ground beef in the coming year.

Another pandemic trend that seems to be here to stay is online shopping, both at retail and foodservice. Sixty-four percent of consumers say they are ordering groceries online, with 44 percent of consumers including fresh beef in those grocery orders. When it comes to foodservice, online ordering has also become overwhelmingly popular. Eighty percent of consumers say they order meals online and 70 percent use online ordering for burgers.

Meanwhile, fresh meat to protein sources, and beef substitutes consumers consistently rank beef as a top source of protein. continue to represent a small percentage of the market. When it comes

K-State to host Whole Farm Health series beginning Feb. 23

From the outside, it may seem as though the success of Kansas farms is evident only by lush

crops growing in a field, or burly livestock grazing green pastures, but Margit Kaltenecker knows better.

"The true value of our farm families," says Kaltenecker, an agri-

cultural and natural resources agent in K-State Research and Extension's Douglas County office, "depends on the health of our soils and our communities."

In late 2022, Kaltenecker was approached with an idea to put on a mental health workshop for farmers, spurred by data indicating that "Kansas has a 45% higher rate of farmers taking their lives than any other state in the country," she said.

But, she notes, "multiple stressors affecting farmers and farm families – continued supply chain shortages forcing increased prices for fertilizer, chemicals, part and other inputs; combined with ongoing drought – have created the perfect storm," Kaltenecker said.

"We soon realized we cannot address farmers' mental health and wellness without also addressing deeper, root causes," she said.

K-State Research and Extension will host three

upcoming workshops to address issues facing Kansas farm families. The series, Whole Farm Health: Building Resilience from the Field to the Farmer, will be held on three upcoming Thursday evenings:

- Feb. 23 – Regenerating Soil Health One Field at a Time.

- March 2 – Increasing Farm Financial Resiliency.

- March 9 – Sustaining Personal Mental Health and Wellness.

All three sessions will be held at the Grace Community Church in Overbrook from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Admission is free and a meal will be provided.

"These workshops offer an opportunity to pull together as a farm community and address strategies for building more resilient farm systems through diversified cropping systems, incorporating cover crops, and grazing, as well as simple methods to identify indicators of mental health in ourselves or our loved ones who are suffering," Kaltenecker said.

In addition to K-State Research and Extension, workshop sponsors include the Kansas Farm Bureau, Kansas Soil Health Alliance, Frontier Farm Credit, Kansas Alliance for Wetlands and Streams, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Douglas County Conservation District and the Kansas Watershed Restoration and Protection program.

Sheep and goat learning opportunities coming up

My Dad hated sheep and goats and took pride in the fact that our generational homestead had never had either touch the soil. Makes me think of an episode of the show "1923" I watched not long ago that highlighted struggles between sheep and cattle producers on grazing lands. It's an age-old debate. Now, Mom's family had both species and Grandma told me that sheep were preferred because they gave two cash crops a year, in wool and lambs. Since I was never allowed to have sheep or goats in 4-H, my practical knowledge with these species is limited.

The small ruminant has seen increased popularity in Kansas in recent years, both sheep and goat. Smaller acreages, increased value in the marketplace, mob grazing, weed/brush control

and many other factors have contributed to this increase. 2021 USDA data shows that Kansas ranks 15th in both species, but is a relatively small player compared to the top five states in either category. Texas leads the pack in both sheep and goats, with most sheep found in the mountain west and goats in the south/south-east United States.

All of this information so far could be seen to have a slight negative context, but that is not the intent at all! In fact, the intention is to highlight some educational resources and events for those interested in learning more about sheep and goats. One of the more comprehensive publications that addresses both production systems can be found at Penn State Extension publication "So You Want to Raise Sheep or Goats?" There is no way to cover all the information found within these pages or any of

the many other University Extension publications, in the space allowed here. Suffice it to say, that there are many things to consider and while they are both small ruminants, sheep and goats are not created equally. Many production practices will crossover, but there are differences, maybe most notably fencing!

It is time once again for the Northeast Kansas Sheep and Goat School. K-State Research and Extension is currently without a Sheep and Goat Specialist, but we are charging on with the school, bringing in local resources. This event will be held at the McLouth High School in McLouth on Thursday, March 9, beginning at 6:30 p.m. Dr. Matthew Kelso from Cedar Ridge Veterinary Clinic will cover health related topics, including changes coming with antibiotic requirements this summer. Bennie Phillips from Phillips and Sons,

Leavenworth Livestock Auction will give his perspective on the markets, giving tips on ways to get the highest value when marketing. The final presentation will be a question and answer panel

format with the host Extension agents, addressing basic production practices.

Crop insurance in focus during second ag committee hearing on 2023 Farm Bill

U.S. Senator Roger Marshall, M.D. questioned witnesses during the recent U.S. Senate Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry's second hearing on the 2023 Farm Bill, a five-year legislative package that is critical for providing support to Kansas' agriculture industry. The hearing focused on the Farm Bill's commodity programs, crop insurance, and credit titles of the Farm Bill. Marshall used his time to stress the importance of the farm safety net programs for not only production agriculture but also its importance in keeping food affordable for Americans. Marshall also gained the commitment of Zach Ducheneaux, Administrator for the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency, to make technical changes to current law to ensure ranchers who suffer from wildfire losses outside the normal grazing season can be compensated under the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honey Bees, and Farm-raised Fish Program (ELAP). In December 2021, Kansas was met with strong and damaging winds that produced dust storms and multiple wildfires. An estimated 163,000 acres burned on the first day wildfires spawned due to dry fuel and strong wind gusts reaching up to 100 mph. Unfortunately, ELAP was unable to cover the damages to the pasture land because of USDA regulations.

marks by emphasizing that this hearing on crop insurance is the hearing that will have the most impact on Kansans, saying in part,

"...This is the number one farm bill hearing we're going to have for producers in Kansas. I have no doubt without crop insurance, without Title I funding, many farmers would be out of business... crop insurance and Title I funding are working to keep cost of food down... without crop insurance, without Title I funding, that budget would be the roof as well that allows farmers to stay in production allowing them to produce next year's crop..."

Marshall questioned Administrator Ducheneaux on ELAP Programs, asking if he supports adjusting the regulations or statute to insure future losses of nature are covered. Mr. Ducheneaux responded in part,

"We would sure welcome an opportunity to engage on some technical assistance on that to make sure we got it right, had a chance to get out and visit a couple of those effected ranches out in that part of the country and it was devastating...we have to do a better job on this and we look forward to working with your team."

On work from home policies at the Federal Crop Insurance Board, Marshall said in part,

"One of the strengths of the federal crop insurance program is that it is designed to be flexible to


farmer needs and is a big tent meant to provide an opportunity for coverage for all types of farmers in all regions of the country. However, the Federal Crop Insurance Board that is tasked with reviewing and approving these new and improved policies has been short-handed since early in this Administration's tenure and are still operating virtually."

K-State ag economist urges producers to review crop insurance options

A Kansas State University agricultural economist is encouraging farmers to know their options before considering a pair of crop insurance policies that would allow them to increase their coverage for row crops beyond what is allowed for individual policies.

Jenny Ifft said the March 15 deadline to sign up for crop insurance includes options for what is known as high coverage crop insurance. They include the Supplemental Coverage Option (SCO) and Enhanced Coverage Option (ECO).

"High coverage policies – such as SCO and ECO and Margin Protection that is purchased in the fall – represent a different approach to managing risk that requires a larger up-front investment," Ifft said. "I suggest producers work closely with an agent to make sure you fully understand what you are getting into."

Crop insurance is purchased by farmers and subsidized by the U.S. government to protect against the loss of their crops due to natural disasters, or loss of revenue due to declines in the price of the particular crop they're insuring.

High coverage policies are county-level crop insurance options that provide additional coverage for a portion of the producer's deductible.

According to Ifft, farmers should understand a couple important considerations before purchasing SCO and ECO coverage:

- High coverage policies require a long-term perspective. Premiums and payouts are substantially higher than traditional crop insurance policies. "Although producers will likely come out

ahead in the long run, a few years can go by without a payout," she said.

- Payouts are triggered by county yield declines, which may or may not be related to what happens on an individual farm. Ifft said this is a unique feature of the high coverage policies because "if they weren't triggered by county yields, the policies would be even more expensive than they currently are."

In addition, for the SCO option, farmers must purchase Price Loss Coverage, which provides assistance if crop prices are low.

"If producers are interested in SCO or ECO and haven't used them before, now is the time to be talking to a crop insurance agent," Ifft said.

Ifft has published an article available online outlining the SCO and ECO options, as well as several decisions tools available from the K-State Department of Agricultural Economics, including:

- Kansas crop insurance maps (including actual and historic yields).
- Kansas county yield correlation tool.
- SCO and ECO payment calculator.
- SCO and ECO webinar.
- Risk Management Agency fact sheets.
- Farmdoc Daily Crop Insurance Decision Tool (Spring, 2023).

"These decisions tools can help producers understand what is exactly at risk, including how much revenue you can expect for 2023 based on yields and current futures prices," Ifft said. "That can help you determine the level of revenue you are comfortable paying to protect through crop insurance, given that the cost of protection increases for higher levels of revenue."

Cattle Chat: Giving calves a healthy start

Good nutrition is important to overall health, and it begins at birth, said the experts at the Kansas State University Beef Cattle Institute on a recent Cattle Chat podcast where they discussed the importance of the calves nursing within the first 24 hours of life.

"Colostrum is the first milk that the calf gets from its mother that contains a lot of immunity to set it up for the first four to

five months of life," said K-State veterinarian Brad White. "As soon as the calf starts drinking, it has 12-24 hours to absorb the colostrum before its gut closes."

To help facilitate the delivery of colostrum to the calf, veterinarian Bob Larson said there needs to be selection pressure put on teat size and udder structure.

"I want the cows to deliver the colostrum, so I am going to retain females that have a good mothering ability along with a quality udder," Larson said.

Another tip is to make sure the calf completely nurses all the quarters of the udder, White said.

"Once the calf starts to nurse, make sure they get a full dose of colostrum because once milk enters their gut, the process of closing begins," he said.

One step that producers can do to set up the cows for success is to make sure they maintain a good body condition entering the calving season and while they are nursing calves.

"Cows that are thin will produce colostrum that is of lower quality than those that are receiving good nutrition," said Phillip Lancaster, beef cattle nutritionist. "Research has

shown that a calf born to a thin cow in a stressful delivery will experience a diminished absorption of the colostrum, as well."

To make sure the cows maintain their weight pre-calving, Lancaster said producers need to be sure that the energy and protein requirements are an emphasis in the supplemented ration.

Even with the best preparation, the experts agree that difficult births do happen occasionally and at a higher rate with heifers calving for the first time.

"When the female and her calf have gone through a difficult birth, often both the dam and the calf are

exhausted and nursing becomes a challenge," Larson said. "This may be a time when the producer needs to intervene and supplement the colostrum."

In such a case, producers have options to consider on sourcing the colostrum.

"The best option for the colostrum is to get it from the dam herself even if that means you have to milk out the cow and give it to the calf through a bottle or tube depending on how well the calf is thriving," Lubbers said.

If that is not possible, then Lubbers recommends supplementing with a commercial replacement powder or obtaining colostrum from another cow within the herd that the producer was able to collect earlier in the calving season.

"Because of the biosecurity risks, I would only use colostrum from my own herd or provide it by way of a commercial supplement," Lubbers said.

Larson agreed with this recommendation, adding: "Make sure to keep some commercial supplement on hand because the timing of when this needs to be delivered is important."

The January and February 2022 bulls posted an average weight of 1,397 pounds and are sired by KR Rally 9064; Car Don Annuity 114 and Kraye Big Country 0179. The pen first won early calf champion. John Grimes, Hillsboro, Ohio; Steven Mohnen, White Lake, S.D.; and Andrew Musgrave, Pittsfield, Ill., evaluated the one carload and 17 pens.

2022 beef exports set annual records; strong finish for pork exports

U.S. beef exports set annual records for both volume and value in 2022, according to year-end data released by USDA and compiled by the U.S. Meat Export Federation (USMEF). Pork exports finished lower year-over-year but export value was the third largest on record, trailing only the highs reached in 2020 and 2021. Pork exports continued to gain momentum in December, led by another outstanding performance in Mexico. While lamb exports slowed in December, 2022 shipments were sharply higher than the

previous two years, approaching the pre-COVID levels of 2019.

Beef exports reach new heights in several key markets

Despite slowing toward the end of the year, beef exports reached 1.47 million metric tons (mt), up 2% from the previous high in 2021. Export value climbed to a record \$11.68 billion, up 10% from 2021 and nearly 40% above the previous five-year average. The U.S. exported a record share of its record-large beef production in 2022, and at higher prices. Export value to South Korea was \$2.7 billion, up 13% and an all-time record for any single destination, while exports to China/Hong Kong jumped 22% to \$2.55 billion. Other markets in which beef exports achieved annual records included Taiwan, the Philippines, Singapore, Colombia, Guatemala and the Dominican Republic.

In December, beef exports trended lower than a year ago at 112,707 mt, down 7%, while value fell 21% to \$782.6 million. The December decline was due in part to a sharp drop in exports to China/Hong Kong, where demand had been constrained by persistent zero-COVID policies. China lifted most COVID restrictions in early December and resumed some international travel in early January. Along with the recent easing of COVID-related cold chain regulations and inspections, these changes offer a more optimistic demand outlook for 2023.

"2022 was a ground-breaking year for U.S. beef's international presence, with global demand stronger than I've seen in all my years in the industry," said USMEF president and CEO Dan Halstrom. "Late in the year, exports certainly felt the impact of persistent headwinds in our large Asian markets, including depressed trading partner

currencies and COVID-related challenges in China, but the long list of countries in which records were set showcases the industry's focus on diversifying export markets. While the year ahead will be challenging due to supply constraints, the exchange rate situation has improved and we still see room for growth in the foodservice sector as more regions continue their gradual rebound from COVID."

Pork highlights include \$2 billion year for Mexico, value record for variety meat

Pork exports finished 2022 on a decidedly upward trajectory as December shipments reached 244,718 mt, up 13% year-over-year and the second largest of 2022 (slightly below November). December export value climbed 14% to \$687.3 million. These results pushed 2022 exports to 2.67 million mt, down 8.5% from a year ago, while export value was \$7.68 billion - down 5% from the record achieved in 2021. Exports of U.S. pork variety meat were the second largest on record at more than 530,000 mt, while export value was record-high at \$1.27 billion.

Pork exports to Mexico set a volume record in December on the way to a record-breaking year in which exports increased 10% to nearly 960,000 mt. Export value to Mexico soared 21% to \$2.03 billion, topping the \$2 billion mark for the first time. December exports also set a value record in Central America and trended higher year-over-year to China/Hong Kong, the Dominican Republic, the Philippines and Australia. 2022 exports to the DR were record-large in both volume (85,551 mt, up 46%) and value (\$233.6 million, up 55%).

"The Mexican market has been a star performer for U.S. pork for many years, but the 2022 results were truly remarkable," Halstrom said. "In the face of growing competition in Mexico, the U.S. pork industry has expanded product offerings and found innovative ways to meet the needs of processors, retailers and foodservice operators. In addition to Mexico, it is gratifying to see such a broad range of markets contributing to our recent export growth, making the prospects for 2023 very promising."

Strong year for lamb exports, led by Caribbean and Mexico

Exports of U.S. lamb muscle cuts finished 2022 sharply higher year-over-year at 2,225 mt, up 59% and the largest since 2019. Export value increased 49% to \$13.2 million, also the highest since 2019. Growth was led by strengthening demand in the Caribbean, where exports increased 47% to 1,043 mt, valued at \$7.5 million (up 32%). Exports also increased substantially year-over-year to Mexico, Canada, the Philippines and Taiwan.

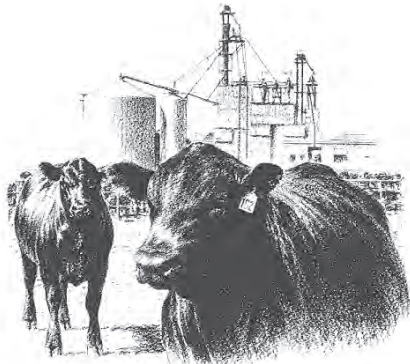
