news service When dining at a new restaurant and the eating utensil is unexpectedly chopsticks instead of a fork, it can make for a challenging experience.

Similarly, newly weaned calves also have to adjust when they transition from a pasture to a dry lot and are expected to eat from an unfamiliar feedbunk, said the experts at Kansas State University's Beef Cattle Institute on a recent Cattle Chat podcast.

that there is feed in the bunk and if you just dump the concentrate in there they may not find it, so I recommend producers also put some long-stem hay in with the feed so the cattle see it," said K-State beef cattle nutritionist Phillip Lancaster.

Не also advises starting cattle out on high-quality hay.

"It will take calves two to three days to get adjusted to eating from the bunk," Lancaster said.

Another decision that

is whether to deliver hay from a round bale feeder or grind the hav and mix it with the other feedstuffs, he said.

Lancaster and the other experts agree that there are pros and cons to that decision.

"Hay that has been mechanically chopped and offered as feed is a smaller particle size so it is more easily digested and will break down faster in the rumen than long-stem hay," Lancaster said. "Because of this, cattle will consume more

than they would if they were eating hay from a round bale.

Cattle eating from a round bale will digest the hay slower and more of that will be absorbed in the digestive tract, he added.

"A downside of feeding hay from the round bale is that cattle will waste hay as they pick through the bale to eat and it ends up falling to the ground and getting stepped on," said K-State

veterinarian Bob Larson. He added that the

benefit of grinding the hay and adding it to the feed is that it is easier to control the portion size, especially in a limited feeding situation.

"Grinding the hay and mixing it with the concentrates allows me to control what they are eating," Larson said.

K-State veterinarian Brian Lubbers said there are drawbacks to grinding the hay.

While that is true,

"The downside to this feeding strategy is the cost of the equipment and the labor it takes to

grind the hay and feed it," Lubbers said.

But for producers who already have the equipment and labor available, the experts agree adding chopped hay to the ration is a good strat-

"If I've got the ability to mix all my ingredients together, it is going to improve the feed efficiency of the calves," Lancaster

Study: Grid pricing has boosted cattle profits, improved consumer beef

Kansas State University agricultural economists have completed a broad analysis of the impact of grid pricing in the cattle industry, concluding among other findings - that producers and consumers have benefitted from negotiated pricing agreements.

K-State livestock economist Ted Schroeder said grid pricing of fed cattle refers to valuing a lot of cattle based on carcass merit, including premiums or discounts for such traits as quality grade, yield grade, preferred weight, special branded programs and more.

He added that most cattle sold under a grid pricing system use a marketing

agreement with packers, including a base price and a schedule of premiums or discounts applied to cattle that are delivered to the packer.

"Marketing agreements and grid pricing have evolved because producers strive to link consumer preferences for high quality beef with farm gate, fed cattle values," Schroeder said. "The data we've reviewed clearly demonstrates that sending clear value signals to producers through premiums for high quality carcasses and discounts for less desired quality has transformed the beef industry."

Schroeder and K-State agricultural economics graduate student Katy Doumit have identified recent trends in grid pricing,

and the implications for the cattle industry. Their paper, Fed Cattle and Beef Premiums and Discounts, is available online through AgManager.info, a website maintained by K-State's Department of Agricultural Economics.

"Over the last 20 years, as the use of marketing agreements has increased dramatically, producers have responded resoundingly by increasing the percentage of steers and heifers that grade 'Choice' and higher, from 55% in the early 2000's, to consistently over 80% today," Doumit said.

"Producers have benefitted by having higher prices for fed cattle, and consumers have benefitted by having higher quality beef that they prefer in re-

Schroeder notes that producers who are considering entering into a marketing agreement should first study the array of alternative grids available and match those with their own cattle procurement, production and marketing strategies.

"The two go hand-inhand," he said. "Premiums

and discounts that we've summarized in our report have considerable variation across grids. Knowing the type of carcass quality traits that a producer can attain relative to cost is critical."

Schroeder encourages producers to "shop around to find the grid to match the type of carcasses the producer can effectively

"That will make a big difference between a grid system increasing or reducing profit," he said. "Launching a grid system is less about chasing targets than it is about knowing the type of cattle one has available and the feeding management system that can match the grid with the cattle."





The Flint Hills Discovery Center and Humanities Kansas partner for prairie-focused presentations

Humanities Kansas recently awarded \$5,473.00 to the Flint Hills Discovery Center to support "The Peopled Prairie: Exploring the Human Relationship with the Flint Hills," a series of lectures and "humanities hikes" that explore the ways people are connected to the Flint Hills. Sally Dreher, curator of education for the FHDC, serves as project director. The three programs, designed to provoke self-reflection about our place on a landscape and its place in us, are free and open to the public thanks to the grant.

On Thursday, October 5, from 5:30-7 p.m., the FHDC will welcome photographer Jim Richardson who will present his talk "Strange Connections: from the Great Plains to Scotland" at the Discovery Center. Richardson, who lives in Lindsborg, is an acclaimed National Geographic photographer whose work recounts life on the Great Plains of Kansas. His presentation will be a reflection on rural values and connection to landscape, by way of comparing rural Kansas with the Highlands and islands of Scotland. Richardson will argue that the power of human connections forged in shared adversity are universal, whether on the windblown Kansas prairie or the remote islands in the Outer Hebrides.

On Saturday, October 14, from 2:30-4:30 p.m., the FHDC will host a Humanities Hike with Kansas humanities scholars at the Konza Prairie Biological Station. During this unique event, six humanities scholars from a wide variety of disciplines will present their personal and professional take on the Flint Hills landscape for participants as they hike through a native tallgrass prairie outside Manhattan. Each ten-minute-long presentation from individuals as diverse as archaeologists, poets, historians, and indigenous knowledge keepers, will invite participants to reflect on their place on the prairie while in a native prairie setting.

On Friday, November 3, from 7-8:30 p.m., the FHDC will welcome photographer Michael Forsberg who will present his talk "Finding Home in Flyover Country - A Photographer's Journey" at the Discovery Center. His presentation is a highly visual account of his personal journey crisscrossing the heart of America, photographing the peoples and places that became the Great Plains: America's Lingering Wild exhibit, on display at the FHDC from September 23, 2023, through January 7, 2024. Forsberg will share the story of the dedicated people working to keep the wild prairie alive. His presentation will reflect deeply on this human-landscape relationship in the tallgrass prairie of the Flint Hills of Kansas and across the prairie of North America.

Elizabeth Dodd (University Distinguished Professor, Department of English, Kansas State University) will serve as the primary humanities scholar on this project. Serving as a consultant for the overall project, Dodd will introduce the keynote speakers at their respective programs, guide the selection of Humanities Hike scholars to ensure wide representation, and participate in the Humanities Hike as a presenter.

"The humanities connect people to place over time and across generations," shared Julie Mulvihill, Humanities Kansas executive director. "These talks will create a space for important conversations that will help us see more clearly our past and plan for our future."

After the hunt – cleaning and handling dove

Four species of dove are legal to hunt in Kansas. These species are the mourning dove. Eurasian collared dove, ringed turtledove, and white-winged dove. Mourning doves are one of the most popular game birds in North America being hunted in 39 of the continental states. with an annual harvest more than all other bird species combined. Kansas is among the top five states for dove harvest. Fall migration generally begins in the middle of August but can vary depending on weather conditions. Doves can be found in a variety of landscapes, but they are mostly found in grasslands, crop fields, and land with abundant shrubs. Seeds from native plants and crop seeds make up a dove's diet. In Kansas most doves have migrated south by October, however some will stay in Kansas throughout the fall and winter.

Mourning and whitewinged dove season in Kansas opens September 1st this year and goes through November 29th. If you are lucky enough to get a few dove while hunting it is important to know how to properly care for and handle them to ensure the safety of the meat as it is harvested. While dove hunting is fun and is a nutritious meat, if it is not handled correctly when it is harvested it could become contaminated with bacteria which can lead to people who consume the meat getting sick. To reduce this risk it is important to remember the following tips during hunting, storage, and preparing the food, as well as making sure to follow all the game regulations

for hunting, transporting, and storage of wild game. Below are a few recommendations on cleaning and handling dove from Karen Blakeslee with the K-State Rapid Response Center.

Be prepared

Bring a sharp hunting knife, a whetstone or steel, light rope or nylon cord, plastic bags. clean cloths or paper towels, and a cooler filled with ice.

Field care and transport

- Wear latex gloves while cleaning wild game.
- Do NOT harvest and eat sick or abnormal birds.
- Field-dress the birds immediately
- Birds may be plucked or skinned in the field
- Remove intestines and crop right away, as the grain in the crop may ferment if not removed.
- Wipe out the cavity with a clean cloth or paper towel; do not use grass or snow, which may contaminate the bird.
- Do not cross-contaminate. Wash hands, knife, and cutting board with hot soapy water and wash thoroughly.
- Store birds in a plastic bag on ice to keep them clean and cold. Keep birds under 40°F. If cooler is not available, put the birds in the back seat in the shade.
- Do not transport birds in the trunk of a vehicle; this does not allow heat to escape from the birds.

Safe Processing

For immediate use, birds should be stored in the refrigerator at 40°F or less and used within three days. For long-term storage, the whole cleaned carcass may be frozen at 0°F or lower. Freezing the

meat while it is fresh and in top condition will enhance the quality of the meat.

Freeze game meat using moisture/vapor-proof wrap such as heavily waxed freezer wrap, laminated freezer wrap, or freezer-weight polyethylene bags. Wrap tightly, pressing out as much air as possible. Label the packages with the date and content. Be sure to use the packages within a year.

Safe Preparation

After freezing, thaw the birds in the reIf microwaving, be sure to cook immediately after thawing.

frigerator or microwave.

- Fully cook game birds to an internal temperature of at least 165°F.
- Game birds may be prepared like chicken.

Dove season in Kansas ends November 29th. Remember, stay safe and have fun while hunting!

pads determine if the hog is too hot and circulate new water to keep the pad cool. The technology was designed by researchers in Purdue University's Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering and Department of Animal Sciences.

Heat harms hogs Record heat across North America impacts not just people but also animals, including farmers' livestock. Francisco Cabezon, research president at Pipestone Research, which specializes in swine health research recommendations, overheating can cause problems for hogs.

"Under heat stress conditions, lactating sows reduce their feed intake and milk output to attempt to reduce their metabolic heat production. In consequence, their piglet growth and subsequent reproductive performance is negatively affected," said Cabezon, who earned his Ph.D. at Purdue Universi-

ty. "In boars, some negative impacts of heat stress are decreased sperm motility and concentration and an increase in sperm abnormalities.

Chris Grant, IHT president, said farmers benefit when their swine aren't affected by heat stress.

"Animal welfare and well-being improve when heat stress is reduced," Grant said. "Farmers will have a larger, healthier animal that can grow better and has a better chance of survivability at the next stage."

Tests prove benefits

Allan Schinckel, a professor in Purdue's Department of Animal Sciences, and Robert M. Stwalley III, associate clinical professor in Purdue's Department of Agricultural and Biological Engineering, designed the cooling pads.

"The Purdue-developed IHT active swine cooling pads will represent a paradigm shift in hog production, increasing both operational efficiency and animal welfare," Stwalley said. "We are refining the pads and their materials, currently testing stainless steel pipes versus copper pipes to continue optimizing their performance."

Schinckel said the ini-

cooling pads make sows more comfortable.

"We saw a decrease in their overall respiration rates, slightly lower internal temperatures and lower daily maximum temperatures. The sows also produced more heat, which corresponded to an increase in their feed intake and milk production; this improves animal welfare and well-being," Schinckel said. "Piglets who were on the cooling pads had a 26% increase in weaning weight and 7.2% increase in feed intake."

The initial research at Purdue also showed the cooling pads maintained boars' semen quality by reducing heat stress abnormalities. The pads kept the boars cool even at high environmental temperatures and high humidity. They also kept the boars' respiration rate low.

Peer-reviewed papers about the initial research have been published in journals including Applied Engineering in Agriculture, Applied Animal Science, Computers and Electronics in Agriculture, Journal of Animal Science, Livestock Science, The Professional Animal Scientist and the Journal of the ASABE (American Society of Ag-

Schinckel will present a poster about the effects of cooling pads on sows prior to farrowing and mid and late lactation at the Allen D. Leman Swine Conference, which takes place Sept. 16-19 at Saint Paul RiverCentre in Minnesota.

Initial research on the cooling pads' effects on boars, sows and gilts conducted at Purdue was funded by grants from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Institute of Food and Agriculture and the Agricultural Science and Extension for Economic Development, or AgSEED, program from Purdue's College of Agriculture. IHT Group supported beta tests at Pipestone Research in Minnesota, led by Cabezon, and at Purdue and two commercial facilities in the U.S. IHT Group funded a graduate student at Purdue during the beta test period. Data from those tests is being complied for summarization for analy-

Manufacturing and sales

IHT evaluated pads for their commercial assessment under a Commercial Evaluation Agreement with the Purdue Innovates Office of Technology Commercialization. Based on the results of the evaluation, IHT and OTC negotiated an exclusive license for manufacturing and selling the pads.

"We will sell the pads across North America in spring 2024 as farmers prepare for the heat stress of the summer," Grant said. "That launch date will also allow us to compile and analyze final data from the boar stud tests, which will be available in



Schwieterman Market Outlook

A marketing commentary by Bret Crotts

Tuesday the 12th is the September supply and demand report. Expectations are for lower corn and soybean production, along with lower new crop ending stocks. Despite the relatively friendly expectations, the traders do not seem to fear bullish numbers. The reality is that it will take more than a bushel or two cut in the corn yield to make a significant difference in the ending stocks estimate, because there is a good chance that the bulk of any production cut will be offset by a cut

in demand. Surprises do happen, especially where government numbers are involved, so if we see corn yield cut by five or more bushels to the acre to something around 170, then we have a chance at a strong recovery and an early seasonal low, otherwise, traders will be looking at adequate stocks and not much reason for strength.

The soybeans are a little bit different since demand for soybeans has been at a much better pace than corn, and small yield

adjustments can have a huge impact on ending stocks. The average trade guess calls for new crop ending stocks to come in at 213 million bushels, but the low end of the range of estimates is at 170 million. If we do come in at the low end of the range, chances are that we see new contract highs rather quickly. If we don't see a very big yield cut, the bulls will be disappointed, but chances are the market reaction will not be extremely bearish because stocks

and USDA has a tendency to underestimate soybean demand.

There won't be anything interesting for the wheat. There is a chance that we won't see any adjustments to the U.S. numbers, and since stocks are plentiful, there is hardly any chance that the fresh wheat numbers move the market. If we see movement in the wheat it will likely be because the corn market is making a big move in one direction or the other. There is just no getting around the fact that we need much better wheat demand in order to see some action in the market

On the charts, there isn't much to report. The corn and wheat futures are at, or near, the recent lows, and the soybeans are testing support at the 50day moving average. Corn

Grass & Grain, September 12, 2023 and wheat are "oversold," which doesn't mean much, so the bull camp really needs something supportive out of the USDA, or maybe to just get the report out of the way in

order to spur a recovery. Cattle futures had a good week. There were numerous new contract highs in both live cattle and feeder cattle futures. Part of that was due to improved cash cattle trade, which came in at the \$179-\$180 level in southwest Kansas. The October live cattle futures are trading at \$183.50, so we are going to need to see further gains in the cash market to keep the futures moving.

As for the feeders, the September futures are at \$255.50 and the Index is at about \$249, so we are going to have to see the cash market kick into gear in the next couple of weeks and catch up with the futures. It usually isn't a good idea to bet against the futures, so my assumption at the moment is that the cash is going to catch up, as opposed to the futures heading lower.

Be cautious when hedging, because cash flow requirements can be quite intense. I urge you to look at option strategies in the cattle market.

Grass & Grain Weather Report

recovered nicely following harvest. While we've seemingly gained at least a little ground over years past, our challenge now is maintaining that gain. There are a lot of variables we'll face over the next 60 days, but keeping in mind some basic management principals can help us start 2024 off on the right foot.

First of all, perennial forages will more often than not benefit from a period of rest and regrowth prior to fall dormancy. The combination of adequate moisture and moderate temperatures have provided for some excellent regrowth thus far with many stands not only increasing forage biomass, but likely building root systems

as well. That combination of root and shoot growth is an oft-overlooked, but very important part of the plant's growth and development. It helps the plant go in to the dormant season in good shape while increasing winter hardiness and providing the opportunity for rapid greenup and growth next spring.

If you're still grazing, keep in mind that four to six inches of green growth is the minimum suggested height prior to entering dormancy. Plants with less regrowth often don't have the photosynthetic capacity to simultaneously produce top and root growth. meaning root systems may be weakened going in to dormancy. A weakened root system now may result in slower green up and potential yield reductions - in the future.

If regrowth is so plentiful that you're considering a second cutting, it might work - but it's risky. As mentioned above, failure to leave adequate plant height going into dormancy can result in slower green-up next spring and a loss of winterhardiness. Any harvest now should be done with an eve on the future. In the near future, will the stand have enough time to recover with adequate regrowth before dormancy? In the distant future, can you stand forage production losses that may occur if adequate regrowth levels are not attained? If you can't answer in the affirmative to both of those questions, it may be best to leave stands as they are.

Take some time as the weather cools this fall to take a second look at grass stands. Hopefully, this will be the fall we can get some of these stands back on track and headed in a productive direction.
