



You cheddar believe it! America's love affair with dairy continues as cheese consumption hits all-time high in 2022 Call it grate! Call it leg-

end-dairy. Say it's whey up! That's because Americans are writing a new chapter in their love affair with dairy products, according to fresh data from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) which reports per capita consumption of all dairy products reached 653 pounds per person in 2022, 63 pounds above the historical average dating back to 1975 when USDA began tracking per capita dairy consumption. Cheese consumption set an all-time high in 2022 to reach nearly 42 pounds per person, a half-pound per person increase over the previous year. For comparison, the average American consumed 32.2 pounds of cheese in 2000 and 21.9 pounds in 1980. Ice cream consumption in 2022 also edged out the previous year, while other dairy products including yogurt and butter remained consistent with recent year

"Americans are turning to dairy like never before as part of their health regimen, to celebrate with family and friends, or to liven up their meal and snacking routines. The data from USDA demonstrate how consumers continue to choose dairy products even as they exercise cost-conscious shopping, illustrating how

dairy remains affordable and accessible to all people. Dairy is more than a food or beverage-it has become an essential part of our lives, in more than 95% of U.S. households on any given day. The growth in dairy consumption is a testament to America's dairy foods makers who offer wholesome, delicious, affordable products for people all ages, all year around.

In the past decade alone, domestic per capita consumption of cheese is up 17.1% and per capita butter consumption is up 9.0%. Overall, USDA data show American dairy per capita consumption across products consistently increasing each year, with 2022 up 0.4% over the past five years, 7.5% over the past 15 years, and 16.1% over the past 30 years.

"If it's made with dairy and it can fit on a plate, in a bowl, or in your favorite mug, chances are Americans are loving it more than ever before. Todav's dairy is different because dairy is always evolving to give Americans what they

Cowboy's Christmas Ball

where the Clear Fork's waters flow, Where the cattle are "a-browzin'," an' the Spanish ponies grow; Where the cayotes come a-howlin' 'round the ranches after dark, And the mocking-birds are singin' to the lovely "medder lark"; Where the antelope is grazin' and the lonely plovers call— It was there that I attended "The Cowboys' Christmas Ball."

The town was Anson City, old Jones's county seat, Where they raised Polled Angus cattle, and waving whiskered wheat; Where the air is soft and "bammy," an' dry an' full of health, And the prairies is explodin'

with agricultural wealth; 'T'was there, I say, at Anson with the lovely "widder Wall," I went to that reception, "The Cowboys' Christmas Ball." The boys had left the ranches and come to town in piles; The ladies — "kinder scattered" -

had gathered in for miles. The music was a fiddle an' a lively tambourine, And a "viola came imported," by the stage from Abilene.

The "wimmin folks" looked lonesome the boys looked kinder treed, Till their leader started yellin': "Hey, fellers, let's stampede," And the music started sighin', an' awailin' through the hall As a kind of introduction to "The Cowboys' Christmas Ball." The leader was a feller that came from Swenson's ranch. They called him "Windy Bill," from "little Deadman's Branch." When he commenced to holler. "Neow, fellers stake your pen! "Lock horns with all them heifers, an' russle 'em like men. "Purr 'round yer gentle kittens, neow rope 'em! Balance all!' Oh, it wuz gettin' active -

at "The Cowboys' Christmas Ball!" We buckled to our partners, an' told 'em to hold on, Then shook our hoofs like lightning. until the early dawn.

Don't tell me 'bout cotillions, or polkas. No sir 'ee! That whirl at Anson City just takes the cake with me. Oh, Bill, I sha'n't forget yer, and I often will recall, That lively gaited sworray -"The Cowboys' Christmas Ball."

Grass & Grain, December 5, 2023 to this very day: The Cowboy's Christmas Ball.

The Chittenden property was located near Anson in Jones County, Texas. Chittenden stayed at the Star Hotel in Anson during

December of 1885. The Star Hotel's owner wanted to drum up business so he decided to put on a grand ball during the weekend before Christmas. Folks from neighboring towns and ranches were invited, along with hotel guests. Word spread quickly through the countryside.

The event was a big success. Chittenden and lots of neighbors attended. It was so much fun that they did it again the following year and every year till 1890, when the Star Hotel burnt down.

Larry Chittenden enjoyed the Christmas ball and the ranching lifestyle of Texas. He moved to Texas and settled in Anson. In 1890, he was so inspired by the dance that he wrote a poem entitled The Cowboy's Christmas Ball. It was published in the local paper, picked up by other publications, and became widely known.

Chittenden became known as the "poet-ranchman of Texas." He included The Cowboy's Christmas Ball in his 1893 book, Ranch Verses. Texas scholar and folklorist John Lomax included the poem

Page 17 in his widely-acclaimed 1910 book Cowboy Songs and Other Ballads.

In the 1930s, two teachers and historians in Anson had an idea: What if they could re-enact the original cowboy Christmas ball? In 1935, they staged a re-enactment in the high school gym. Again, it was so successful that it has been held every year since. In 1940, the Pioneer Hall was built in Anson specifically as a site for the ball. A volunteer association was formed to provide ongoing support for

Now the Texas Cowboy Christmas Ball is held as a three-night event at Anson in mid-December every year. The original rules still apply: Ladies must wear dresses and gentlemen are required to doff their hats.

the event.

In 1985, the wonderful cowboy singer Michael Martin Murphey learned of the event and wanted to write a song based on Chittenden's poem. The association agreed, provided that he would sing the song at Anson. Every year since, on the opening night of the three-day ball, Murph performs his song in Anson, Texas. Following is the poem as adapted, showing the original phonetic spellings.

sions, the more they're convinced there might be a production benefit from doing so.

Kansas State University

recently completed work to identify best practices for measurement of enteric methane (or methane that is exhaled) for grazing cattle, as much of the previous work has been in confinement settings or in other species. They learned more about the collection process and how much data they need to explain the differences

among animals. The Angus Foundation helped fund this research to build knowledge on this topic specifically within the beef industry.

'This is a trait that is a bit of a win-win in terms of what consumers might like us to do and things that can positively affect our profitability," says Megan Rolf, K-State geneticist and lead researcher on the project.

Methane emissions are frequently in the news, often with animal agriculture taking the blame for rising worldwide levels. In the United States, methane is only 11.5% of the total greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. But it is among the most potent of all greenhouse gases and, with a shorter lifespan in the atmosphere, the easiest to make measurable change in the near term.

The beef business has already made marked improvements just by making animals more efficient, Rolf notes. According to National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) analvsis, the methane intensity, or methane per unit of beef produced, decreased by 15% from 1990 to 2021. Beef production increased 23%, while herd numbers declined — the ultimate definition of doing more with less, Rolf notes.

At the same time, however, total methane production is up 5%.

"The more productive the animals typically means more methane emissions," she explains.

Are the goals of reduced methane and increased producer profits at odds with each other?

Rolf says not necessarily.

Less methane, more production "In my opinion, nobody is better steward of the lands than beef producers, because that's what we rely on. So I would argue, we probably want to be able to provide the same human

nutritional value of the food that we produce with lower methane emissions and more environmental sustainability," Rolf says. 'The second reason we really care about this is every time that animal belches out some methane this is money you paid for feed that is now wafting away in the breeze."

That loss of gross energy can be anywhere from 2% with animals eating high-concentrate in the feedyards to up to 12% on more forage-based diets.

Dry-matter intake (DMI) is closely correlated with methane production. While bigger, more productive animals may eat more on the average. leading to more methane output, there are outliers, Rolf explains.

"The relationship is not one-to-one, which means we can identify animals that gain a lot more than we would expect based on their methane emissions," she says, with a nod to the outliers that could help change that correlation. "So, these animals exist – the challenge is identifying them and developing tools to be able to select for them.'

There is no methane emission work currently incorporated into any beef cattle genetic evaluations, but Rolf predicts there will be someday. Measuring methane in

wide open spaces

The K-State project used a GreenFeed system to quantify methane, carbon dioxide and oxygen. Animals chose to use the enclosed feeder, where pelleted feed came out at regular intervals to encourage the cows to stay there longer and to return

"The idea is to get them to stick their head in there long enough so that we can measure what they're exhaling," Rolf says.

When they exited, a fan pulled air back into the system so there was an ambient air measurement to

compare to.

Of the 23 animals in the study, 17 used the system regularly for a 13% refusal rate. They allowed five visits a day, with a minimum of two hours between visits.

"One of the questions that we had while embarking on this mission was how much data we actually needed to collect on each individual animal and on the total number of spot samples that we would need," she says.

Their work showed 40 visits as the threshold for collecting enough quality information to run the calculations.

"It was right out in the middle of a pasture, and they had lots of other places that they could go, so it took us a bit longer to collect that data," Rolf says. "That does lead me to the conclusion that in our target protocols, we should probably have a focus on the number of spot sam-ples rather than simply recommending a specific test duration?

More questions, more work

The discoveries in this round of research spur additional questions: Can they measure methane in growing animals and the rankings stay the same as mature animals? Can they use "incomplete" records, with fewer than the ideal visits and correlate to oth-

"First we need to able to get enough data to fit a univariate model, and then, ideally, we want to fit multivariate so we can figure out what the genetic correlations are, identify important genetic antagonisms and all those relationships between different traits," Rolf says.

Today, feed additives and other management tweaks are the only way to directly get at methane reduction, but genetic solutions would provide a lasting and cumulative effect over time. Plus, it appears to be moderately heritable, giving hope that there could be reliable selection measures in the future.

"Ideally we want to be able to improve without sacrificing the levels of production we have," Rolf

NCBA secures Senate introduction of legislation to protect producers from black vultures The National Cattle- ly appreciative of Sen. both emotionally and fi- hour

men's Beef Association (NCBA) hailed the introduction of the Senate version of the Black Vulture Relief Act introduced by Sen. Markwayne Mullin (R-OK), a companion bill to legislation introduced in the House of Representatives earlier this year that protects cattle producers from the devastating impacts of black vulture depredation.

"Black vultures are particularly nasty predators, and their attacks can be financially devastating to small, family-owned cattle operations," said NCBA policy division chair Gene Copenhaver, a Virginia cattle producer. "The current system prevents cattle producers from effectively protecting their herd. Not only that, but black vultures are also an abundant species — millions-strong — that do not need federal protection. That's why we urgently need legislation like the Black Vulture Relief Act. NCBA is extreme-

"Black vultures play a role in the ecosystem, and cattle producers have no desire to eradicate the species, but to continue managing them under such a restrictive system is ludicrous. The species is abundant across the continent. and no longer a conservation concern," said cattle producer Charlie Besher, chairman of NCBA's Property Rights and Environmental Management Committee. "These birds are extremely vicious predators, and their attacks on cattle are devastating.

The Black Vulture Relief Act is bipartisan legislation that would allow cattle producers to take vultures without a permit, when there is an immediate need to protect their livestock from injury or death. After 50 years of federal protections, black vultures now number 190 million strong and are an abundant species across the country. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife currently issues black vulture depredation permits to states, which issue sub-permits to producers allowing take of only three birds per year. With black vultures often attacking in flocks as large as 50, the current permits are insufficient for allowing producers to protect their livestock. Black vulture attacks are particularly vicious with the birds usually targeting calves hours or even minutes after birth.

"Simply put, current rules and laws are outdated regarding the black vulture. Oklahoma cattle ranchers need to be able to protect their livestock from predators and not be limited by these outdated regulations," said Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association executive vice president Michael Kelsey. 'Thanks to Senator Mullin. a cattle producer himself who knows the challenges of cattle ranching, for introducing a piece of legislation that would achieve a reasonable update to federal law and allow cattle ranchers the ability to protect their livestock in harmony with the environment and wildlife resourc-

K-State to host calving schools at four locations in Kansas

In anticipation of calving season, Kansas State University's Department of Animal Sciences and Industry and K-State Research and Extension are planning a series of calving schools in January.

The program will outline overall calving management that includes stages of the normal calving process as well as tips to handle difficult calving situations.

Extension beef veterinarian A.J. Tarpoff said the goals of the event are to increase knowledge and a proper calving kit, then practical skills, and to increase the number of live calves born if they need assistance.

The schools will also share tips on when and how to intervene to assist the cow or heifer. Presenters will demonstrate proper use of calving equipment on a life-size cow and calf model.

"Our goal is for producers to leave better prepared for calving season," Tarpoff said. "We will demonstrate building discuss timelines on when to examine cows for calving problems, and when to call your vet for help if things are not going well, and how to care for the newborn calf. It's an excellent program regardless of one's experience level."

The meetings will have other timely educational topics determined by each location.

What does it cost you to feed a cow each day once they come off summer pasture? If you are grazing your own crop residues, you might say the feed is free. While crop residue on your own fields isn't free (there is opportunity cost - you could rent it to someone else), there isn't much downside to grazing it. Grazing stalks won't remove to get water to that field.

cow will eat about 30 pounds of hay per day. At \$150 per ton, it would cost \$2.25 per head per day to feed a cow, not accounting for any labor and machinery to get the hay to the bunk or feeder. Winter feed costs can really cut into cow herd profits if we have to provide harvested forages for the entire feeding period.

While you can't starve a profit out of a cow, you can feed her cheaply for a couple of months utilizing crop residues, cover crops, or winter annuals. A little cowboy math would suggest you can easily save at least \$1.00 per cow per day by grazing crop residues. Most years cows can graze crop residues from November 1 to January 1, and sometimes longer. That comes to \$60 per cow savings in feed cost, at a minimum, by

After January 1, most spring-calving cows will need protein supplementation, and maybe hay and grain. Until then, they will be good on stalks if the stalks don't get cov-


